NEW YORK (AP) - The House Republican Task Force on Crime has advised President-elect Nixon to douboe the number of Justice Department lawyers assigned to fighting orpanized crime, the New York times reported today. In a Washington dispatch by Fred P. Graham, the newspaper

said Nixon's main congressional advisers on crime also urged him to use electronic eavesdropping "on an extremely selective and carefully controlled basis." The task force submitted its recommendations in a 9,000-vord report about 10 days ago, he Times said.

-Expanding the Justice Depariment'e antiracketeeri Atty. Gen. Ramsey Clark, who was a prime Nixon target during the campaign;
—Promptly enacting new federal gambling laws to replace the gambling tax declared unconstitutional by the Supreme Court last spring.

While in the capital, Nixon also will announce he is retaining 78-year-old J. Edgar Hoover as director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. By feder-al law, Hoover would have been forced to retire in 1964 at age 7 except for an exemption grant-ed him by President Johnson. Nixon will continue to honor the exemption.

It was not certain, however, that Hoover would remain at the helm of the FBI throughout the new President's term. Some sources said he was considering

retirement in the next years.

Monday, December 16 Spain's Big Boom

Once considered a backwater of dictatorship and economic and social stagnation, ostracized by the United Nations and excluded from Marshall Plan aid after World War II, Spain has suddenly emerged as one of the fastest developing pations in the world.

The Spaniards, seemingly left behind in the 18th cetury, are catching up with the 20th century, writes British author Raymond Palmer in IBM's Think magazine. Everywhere one looks, buildings are rearing up, smooth highways are stretching out, excavators are digging

He quotes one resident of Madrid: "We have gone from shoe leather to traffic jams overnight. A few years ago only one family on my street had a car. The other night I came home and couldn't find anywhere to park."

The turning point for Spain came in 1933, when the United States negotiated the use of military bases in return for economic aid, an action that caused much anguish among many liberal Americans. A few years later, a tourist boom began, which continues today, and international credits started flowing in. At the end of 1967, Spain left the ranks of the developing countires of Europe,

shead of Greece, Portugal, Turkey and Yugoslavia. Its per capita income passed the magic \$700 level that separates the developed from the developing coun-Spain's gross national product has

been growing by more than 7 per cent a year, a rate higher than any other Western country. Its exports rose by 22 per cent in 1986, profit of the continuing integration of the Spanish economy within the world economy. Spain has had an application for mem-

bership in the European Common Market pending since 1982 and now wants to become a full-fledged member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, even though its bilateral agreement with the United States gives it equivalent protection. Spain has become the world's leading

ourist country, with the number of foreign visitors growing from 3.2 million in 1958 to 16.3 million last year - an increase of 450 per cent. Earnings from tourism have risen from \$76.9 million in 1957 to about \$1.1 billion last year a 1,500 per cent increase.

Tourism is bringing not only new money into Spain but new ideas, of which the bikim is only the most obvious example. One result of the sudden appearance of a car-owning, affluence-seeking society has been a cautious economic beralization of the regime by General Franco, though he has done little to satisfy the urge for political liberalization fermenting among university stu-

What will happen when Franco leaves the scene after more than three decades as strongman, whether Spain can make an orderly transition from dictatorship in constitutional monarchy or something else or whether the winds of social change now wafting gently through the country will turn into a hurricane, is uncertain.

Probate Court Reforms

The Connecticut Supreme Court knock ed out a couple of hard-won provisions for reform of the probate court system in its just-issued ruling on the 1967 Probate Court Reform law. It took away the power of the administrator to suspend probate judges. And it ruled that the administrator does not have the power to set probate fees.

But the ruling has opened the door

to probate court reform far more basic and extensive than anything provided for in the 1967 law. It placed the probate court system not under the state constitution but in the category of "inferior courts" which are subject to control of the state legislature, which may impose rules of administration practice and procedure." This denies the probate court system

the autonomous independence which it has traditionally claimed. It opens the way for the formulation of changes and reforms by the legislature to which the probate court judges must submit.

The decision itself suggests a logical starting point for these reforms. While upholding the power of the General Assembly to appoint the administrator over the courts which was the principal advance of the 1967 law, the court observed that the act "would have been imoved, and its constitutionality would have been more obvious" if the probate court administrator were to be appointed by high court judges rather than by the chief administrator of the court. This is worth consideration by the 1969 legis

On the point of fee-setting, the court denied the administrator that function, but observed that it "is clearly a legislative, rather than a judicial or adminis trative function" - thus virtually inviting the General Assembly to tackle this

Probate court reform, in other words, is only at its beginning. It will be up to the 1969 session of the General Assembly to make the studies, weigh the proposals, and come up with the program that will provide for an end to obsolete regionalism and the beginning of a uniform, high-standard, impartially administered probate system in Con-
