"I love old homes and always did. Within their walls are treasures hid. I hold it true that what'er be- side. This old home may be sanc- tified."

These are the opening and closing lines of a poem entitled "Our Old Home" beautifully lettered with hand painted decorations by the author who at one time lived in and owned the home I visited for the Christmas feature this month at 218 Hackmatack St.

The Dr. Pierre J. Marteney have now lived here about four-and-a-half years and have established it as their permanent residence. They had lived in a ranch house previously on the same street and for some time had watched "that big old house at the head of Prospect Street." The Marteney's dream of a big old house that would have rooms enough to include a music room, living room, dining room, individual bedrooms, and just "lots of room" was one day realized when they became the proud possessors of the old Newman home.

The day I arrived for the interview, the lamp post was twinkling with a Christmas garland and outside the front door was a large topiary tree of red and green frosted fruit (weatherproof, I was assured). A four-year old miss opened the door to greet me and informed me she was Martha. She was joined by her sister Susan, 11, and then by her father and mother who hosted me graciously the next two hours.

This home could be Christmas all year for the first thing I saw is a bright red fringed rug on the music room floor. A good portion of our interview took place in this music room which is the front room. Here is the pride and joy of

Dr. Marteney, and the source of much information which he and his wife eagerly shared with me. In a corner stands the virginal which Dr. Marteney entirely constructed except for the metallic parts. A virginal is a harpsichord instrument. He showed the plans from which he worked which were sketchy. The keyboard is carved from a solid piece of walnut.

He has numerous books on harpsichords, their makers and so forth which he knows nearly by heart. He painted the cabinet of his instrument a soft green, a color often used in the old harpsichords. A thin line of gold leaf is the only trim on the instrument.

Mrs. Marteney tells of the day she was alarmed to see an armored car stop in front of the house. Two armed guards came to the door carrying a small box between them. This was the gold leaf her husband had ordered and this is the manner in which it is delivered.

The floor-length drapes of the music room are a soft avocado green with chestnut tie backs made by Dr. Marteney. A wall covering of off-white with an avocado green scroll and fleur-de-lis print forms a background for some of the pictures hanging here including a line drawing original by Picasso. A radio-phonograph cabinet has been antiqued and converted into a modern record player.

Adorning the wall inside the doorway is a gold wreath of cones and leaves made by Mrs. Marteney and especially precious to her for it also contains the magnolia pods her mother lent her from Illinois.

The red rug of the music room is complemented by a Victorian covering of a Vic-

A part of the kitchen is the dining area. A walnut top table with tiger ring maple legs was made by Mrs. Marteney's great grandfather. As was a wash stand which is at one side. A candle mold on the wash stand now holds real candles and some Christmas greenery.

Elsewhere in the dining area are pewter candlesticks and an assortment of primitive kitchen utensils hangs from a rack on an exposed brick chimney. The walls are pumpkin colored and nar-

row cranberry red cafe curtains give that cheery look. A former pantry has been converted into a bathroom and laundry area with ample storage space.

Bedrooms upstairs are of the spacious variety found only in older homes. Martha's is in the front room with lots of windows. Green and white in the color scheme with bright color accents in the collection of rag dolls, some made by her mother and sister, perched snugly atop the curtain rods. Martha's bedroom furniture is old cherry including a chair just her size. She likes to collect tea sets.

Susan's bedroom features a real mod mobile of eyes; some are winking, some closed, and some are wide open staring directly at you. The bedroom furniture and desk are birdseye maple. Susan likes to collect

The dining-room is stunning with a Mediterranean blue rug and matching blue floor length drapes. Starting is the bold use of Italian olive green for the dado around the room and low built-in book shelf along one wall. A still life of a blue wine bottle and some fruit against a chequerboard background tie in the colors of the dining room.

The Marteney's have a special fondness for the wrought iron chandelier. It was the first new item they bought for the house and when all else was shambles in the process of remodeling, they would look to their new arched chandelier in an empty dining room for encouragement.

The furniture is of country English design. A red chunky candle with greens around the base is the only decoration on the polished wood table.

An old pedestal cake plate on the sideboard holds golden fruit. Rare glass pie plates which had belonged to Mrs. Marteney's great grandmother are displayed on a wall shelf along with other favorite pressed glass keepsakes.

Of special note is a glass pitcher with a tree pattern called the "Frigate Tree". The Pringles were ancestors of Dr. Marteney and as early settlers in West Virginia, they sought shelter in a large hollowed out tree. Upon inquiry, it was explained to me that the Marteney name is not French, but English from way back. Whence the error? Dr. Marteney's mother had always been very fond of the name and determined to name her son thusly.

The kitchen has, until recently, been Dr. Marteney's workshop where he has done much of the carpentry work necessary in their home restoration and remodeling.

Meals were an ingenious arrangement of well timed preparation using a hot plate and electric frypan downstairs and serving immediately in a room upstairs used as a den-dining room. But now the Marteney's boast a modern kitchen in an older home atmosphere.

porcelain and glass shoes and has a collection of over 150 dolls. She also likes oil painting. Gold walls and gold painted flooring create the background for the European walnut French provincial furnishings in the master bedroom with brown, gold and avocado print drapes and bedspread. Above the headboard hangs an arrangement of a hand lettered copy of the Marteney's wedding certificate, a barometer and an Egyptian head.

There is still an upstairs area "in the rough" which will eventually become another bedroom, a den, and a bathroom.

Dr. Marteney files most carpentry or shop work "easy if you follow the directions." He also enjoys working on old cars. He received his Doctor of Philosophy degree in chemistry from the University of Illinois.

He majored in music before he switched to chemistry. He is presently employed at United Aircraft Research Laboratories in East Hartford as a research scientist. He is also president of the Manchester Civic Orchestra.

Mrs. Marteney received her masters degree in education at the University of Illinois. (They met each other there at members of the same church choir.) She conducts the Blue Shutter Play school in her home three mornings a week. She also teaches beginner sewing two evenings a week at Hill Junior High School. She enjoys old painting, refinishing furniture and re-

planning her home with her husband. The Marteney's enjoy their bird feeding project in their woody back yard, are members of a gourmet club and attend Trinity Covenant Church. They enjoy many Christmas in their white home with the blue shutters.

De Salvo Said Incompetent to Sign for Book

BOSTON (AP) — Albert De Salvo, 36, the self-proclaimed Boston Strangler, was mentally incompetent to sign a contract for a book about his life, a former state psychiatrist testified Friday.

Dr. Annes Robey, now living in Michigan, but formerly chief psychiatrist at Bridgewater State Hospital, testified he observed De Salvo daily for a year between July 1966 and July, 1968.

He said De Salvo was not concerned with his rights, but

craved notoriety. He signed a contract for the book with Gen. old Frank, New York author who wrote "The Boston Strangler."

De Salvo's case came up in U.S. District Court Friday in connection with his suit for \$1 million damages, against 20th Century-Fox, which made a movie from the book. De Salvo also is asking a permanent injunction to halt presentation of the film.

The case continues next Tuesday with De Salvo expected to attend the hearing. He is a life term prisoner at Walpole State Prison for six attacks on four greater Boston women, in cases not connected with the stranglings of 13 women in a three year period.

Wonders of the Universe The Metaprobe to Jupiter

DR. I.M. LEVIT, DIRECTOR The Fels Planetarium of the Franklin Institute has proposed a program for space research with many countries participating and contributing experimental packages. The metaprobe serves as a logical "follow-up" to the group of probes being planned to be sent to the planet Jupiter.

The metaprobe would leave earth as a seven-vehicle complex consisting of six ECGs and one CLM. These would ride in a common bus until at the transfer distance the various members of the complex would separate, fan out and continue toward the planet. The ECGs could be separated from the bus as much as a million miles, though being less than 100,000 miles from each other.

An individual ECG would carry a small number of compatible experiments to explore the planet for radiations, dust and for the measurement of particles. There is even the possibility of a remote sensor being carried along for low-resolution reconnaissance of Jupiter.

In any program of this type the question of weight is critical. Dr. Ehrlicke believes weight can be made nominal with the entire scientific payload approximately 2,000 lb. He visualizes the ECGs as spin-stabilized, with their sensors and propellers directed toward the planet.

Emmy Will Be 21--Maybe

NEW YORK (AP) — Emmy, Oscar's hard-luck, plain Jane little sister, will be 21 next May — if she makes it.

Already there are angry rumblings and threats that some VIPs may boycott TV's coming-of-age party. The National

Academy of Television Arts and Sciences has again revised the rules for candidates for its golden statuette. But instead of placating the critics of its awards procedures, the academy finds itself in the center of a new, bitter controversy.

The Emmy awards, TV's way of honoring its own, at least in theory, seems dogged by dissension and disaster. A few seasons back there was a big rebellion when CBS News led a walk-out in a controversy over judging methods. Eventually this was sort of smoothed over. Then last spring came that embarrassing, disorganized awards show that was literally a tragedy of error and mishaps.

Now the awards committee has made some more changes relating to the qualifications of nominations—notably a rule that bars programs and those associated with programs that have been on the air for two years or more.

While there was a lot of grumbling, the first real action was taken by an ABC vice president who complained that network executives were given no chance to discuss the changes before they were put through.

Criticism of the two-season rules stems from the fact that several programs and performers have been nominated for Emmy awards in seasons past but never won the balloting. Now they are automatically out of the running. A good example is Mario Thomas and her show, "That Girl."

By the very nature of television, there are too many categories and too many performers ever to make an awards contest very meaningful. And, on the other side of the coin, networks and independent producers—who privately kiss off the Emmys as meaningless, all want to win Emmys because they have a certain exploitation and publicity value.

This year the number of categories has been chopped down a bit—but it still is more than 30 and is too big for comfort.

One thing is certain: This spring's Emmy awards show will be better than last season's, or the survival of the awards themselves will be on the line.

On 'Mission: Impossible,' It's Possible

The Washington Post For mind stretching, table tipping, never-never land, dream world fantasy, no series on television can challenge "Mission: Impossible" (CBS).

Throughout this season it has rested happily among the 20 most popular programs. Its position comes partly from the collapse of "The Beautiful Phyllis Diller Show" as competition and partly from the public's determination to suspend, willingly, a sense of disbelief.

The Impossible Mission force roams the world, putting down dictators, disrupting the economies of nations and thwarting ambitious politicians. The acting is good and the suspense is immense, but these are

achieved only with cooperation of the viewers.

Language barriers disappear and whether the force goes behind the Iron Curtain, into Latin America, or into the Orient, all leading characters speak English with only a touch of accent. This, of course, is in the great Hollywood tradition and the American audience has been trained to accept the device.

Credulity is more strained by the existence of marvelous electronic gadgets. None ever fails, although none is ever given a field test.

More remarkable, still, is the gullibility of the villains. All over the world, one finds, the bad guys are open for any kind of confidence game. Each is

willing to put trust in a visitor without checking credentials or using the most routine, elementary security precautions.

Such could happen only at Paramount Studios.

"Mission: Impossible" is made for television. The interior of the weekly plots are carefully structured with a series of false climaxes, each designed to keep a viewer out of the kitchen during commercials. Each time, the hero stands vulnerable and exposed, certain of ruin. After the middle commercials, the danger—invariably—resulted from a misunderstanding; or can be fixed with a bribe, or made to disappear with a simple explanation.

This technique is known in TV as the baited hook. The de-

vice is also called "Hold-it-fellows: It ain't him." Its use is calculated to make the intense viewer feel foolish for having gotten so worked up.

Each episode begins with Peter Graves being told by audio tape of a perilous mission. He is asked to accept the assignment and that the tape either will self-destruct or must be destroyed.

Some day, perhaps the concluding episode if their series ever ends, someone will give the obvious twist to this grabber. Graves will listen solemnly while the impossible mission is described. He will stand up, turn to the camera and exclaim: "Absolutely not. You must be insane. No one could perform that mission."

An announcer will explain that Peter Graves' character, who is called Phelps, finally consulted a dictionary and discovered that "impossible" means, simply, "not possible."

Dr. Seuss Likes Television

NEW YORK (NEA) — He's a tall, good-looking man with a soft, deep speaking voice, a shock of white hair and the humorous manner of a man who has never quite forgotten the joys of childhood. He says he is Theodor Geisel, but many of us know better. He really and truly is Dr. Seuss.

There may be someone, somewhere who has never heard a child and thus has never heard of Dr. Seuss. For that poor soul there is an explanation: Geisel, who writes under the pseudonym, is the author of 26 children's books, the president of the Beginner's Book Division of

Random House and the creator of the Grinch and the Whos. His animated TV special, "How the Grinch Stole Christmas," is due for a repeat showing on CBS-TV on Dec. 22.

"Material is used up too fast," he says, "and most of children's programming is factory-made. I'm not upset by horror as most people are. Children are amused by it. There are too many psychiatrists around. When you take the conflict out of children's programming, you are left with 'Little Women.'"

"The parents I don't understand are those who meter out TV. Television is excellent for children. It has improved their reading habits and their vocabulary. Most children understand scientific movies far better than I do. They approach everything without prejudice or preconceptions. We adults are all filled with confusion."

Geisel has no children of his own but, as he says, "I have met several."

And millions of them have met him through his enchanting books.

Englander, a Cleveland native, was not only producer and director of the Horowitz concert. He also wrote the script. It was five words long: "Ladies and gentlemen: Vladimir Horowitz."

He says he didn't have to do much rewriting.
