Perhaps your gym class has been invaded by round-eyed little girls or boys who (upon finding calisthenics or badmirton not extremely interestical) made a hasty retreat; or the silence of the library was broken by a troop of 3 to 5 year olds exploring a strange new domain. This is all part of "lab" period, where free play and exploration are encouraged.

Free play is a type of gentle guidance which leaves the child basically uninhitited and unrestrained. Now he can discover values on his own; what is right to do, and what is wrong. He can discover for himself what being a little boy mears. And he can establish relationships with people or remain on his own. But whether in group play or individual play, the children are being observed in the course of their development. Child Development is a semester course. Senior girls are given the opportunity to study the physical and mental development of children. The textbook covers from birth to sax years; and "lab" periods deal with both boys and girls aron 3 to 5 years of age in action. On Mondaya and Fridays, while the children have cookies and milk and talk of the "best things of Christmas," squirm in chairs, "clean house," or join in a game of "London Bridges," students note down new words, actions of children, or a noted personality change on observation sheets.
