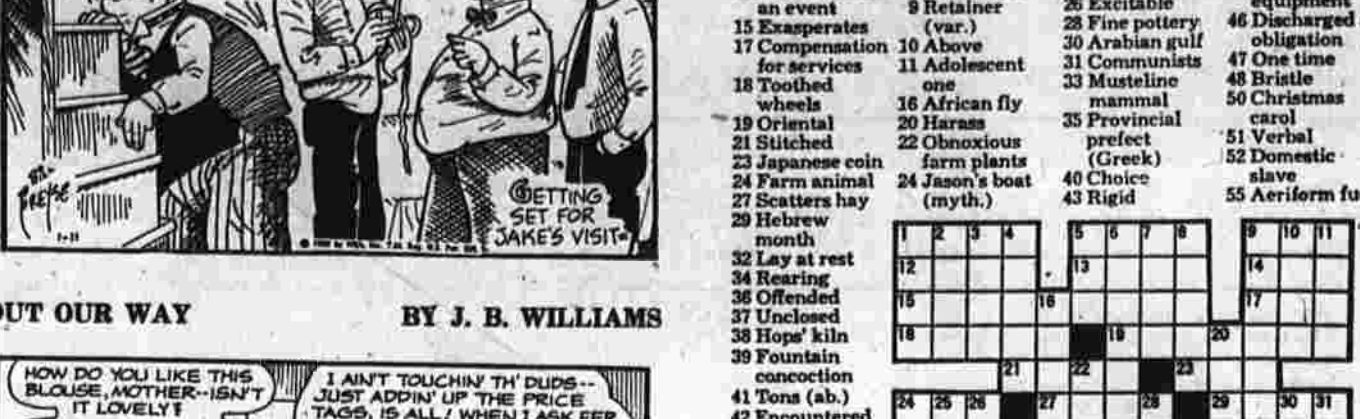
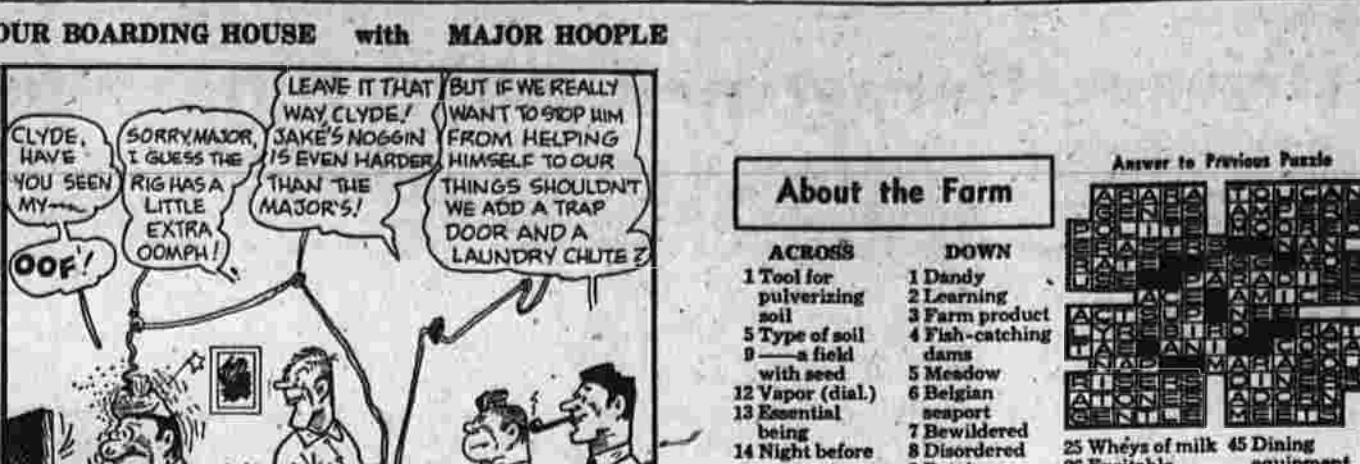

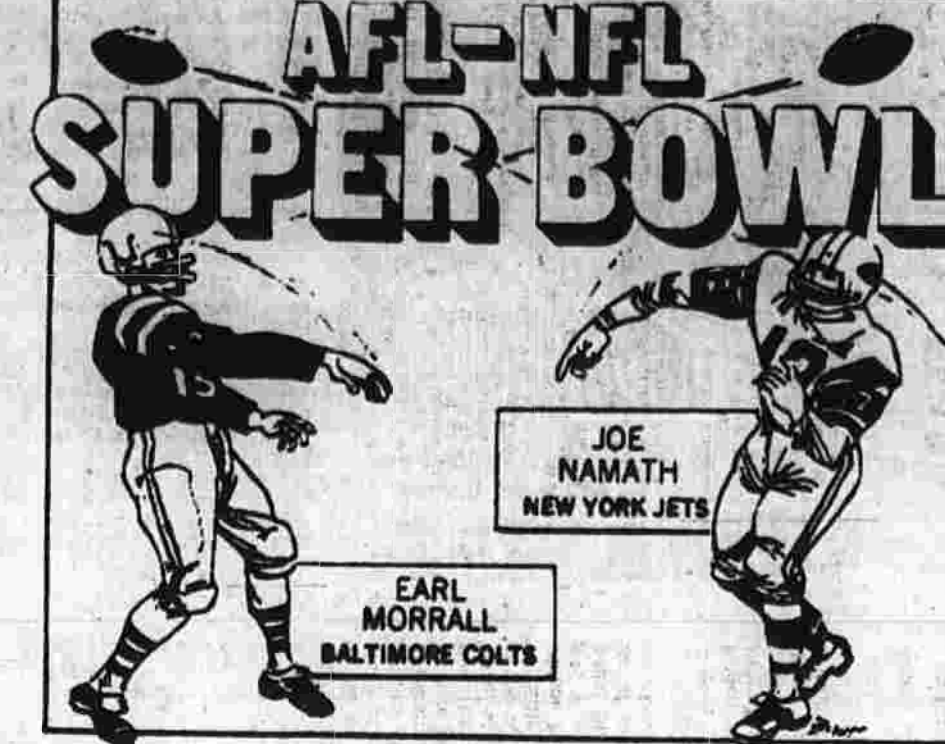

Jerry Lewis Plans Ahead

NEW YORK—(NEA)—Jerry Lewis is the only kid on the block who knows exactly what he will be doing from now until March 21.

Wherever Jerry goes, a black notebook goes. It contains a schedule so complete that Jerry can look at it, check his new film, "Hook, Line and Sinker," and say, "We'll be dubbing it in September and shipping it to distributors on Oct. 24."

Each week, more days are added to Jerry's schedule, just so you don't think his world ends next March.

The book doesn't bind the NBC star, back for his second season with "The Jerry Lewis Show." It simply soothes his often nervous nerves.

He was in an office at NBC decorated with a sign. It read "Jew Power."

"Anything to make it feel homey," Jerry laughed, then flipped his looseleaf. "The only time you find static around me is when there is an open area in the book. I'm not happy when I'm idle. I took my wife on a vacation to Honolulu and I trembled for five days from the

quietness.

"Sure, every eighth day I go through a thing where I think I want to give it all up, but any human who has a compulsive drive like I do enjoys it. The only thing that throws me is dealing with people who are dull or have nothing to contribute. I can talk for five hours with someone who is interesting and never even know I sat down."

Jerry has a reputation for being difficult, but among the 28 people in his personal employ are men who have been associated with him for as much as 26 years.

Jerry stresses that learning every facet of the art of making film is important, from lighting and cutting through directing.

"That's one of the things wrong with TV," he said. "Do you know how few network executives can walk on a set and do anything technical? Look at the executives of most major corporations and you find men who know the meat of the business."

"One man began with me as a dancer. I taught him lighting

and staging. He's now an assistant director, and I have a couple of bright young boys watching him area. What our networks should do is prepare for any possible need. Most people worry about Tuesday's uproar on Tuesday. I try to predict the uproar in advance."

When he discusses children (and Jerry considers himself one of them), this complex man best reveals himself. "Children," he said, "that's what it's all about. We have a new segment on the show this year called Tell It Like It Is. I sit and talk to 15 kids, and the cameras grind 30 minutes and we pull out seven or eight minutes. I write the "menu," what we talk about, and they provide the answers. When I'm writing for the screen, I like to have kids around."

Jerry has six of his own, all sons. He has a granddaughter, Sara Jane, nine-months-old.

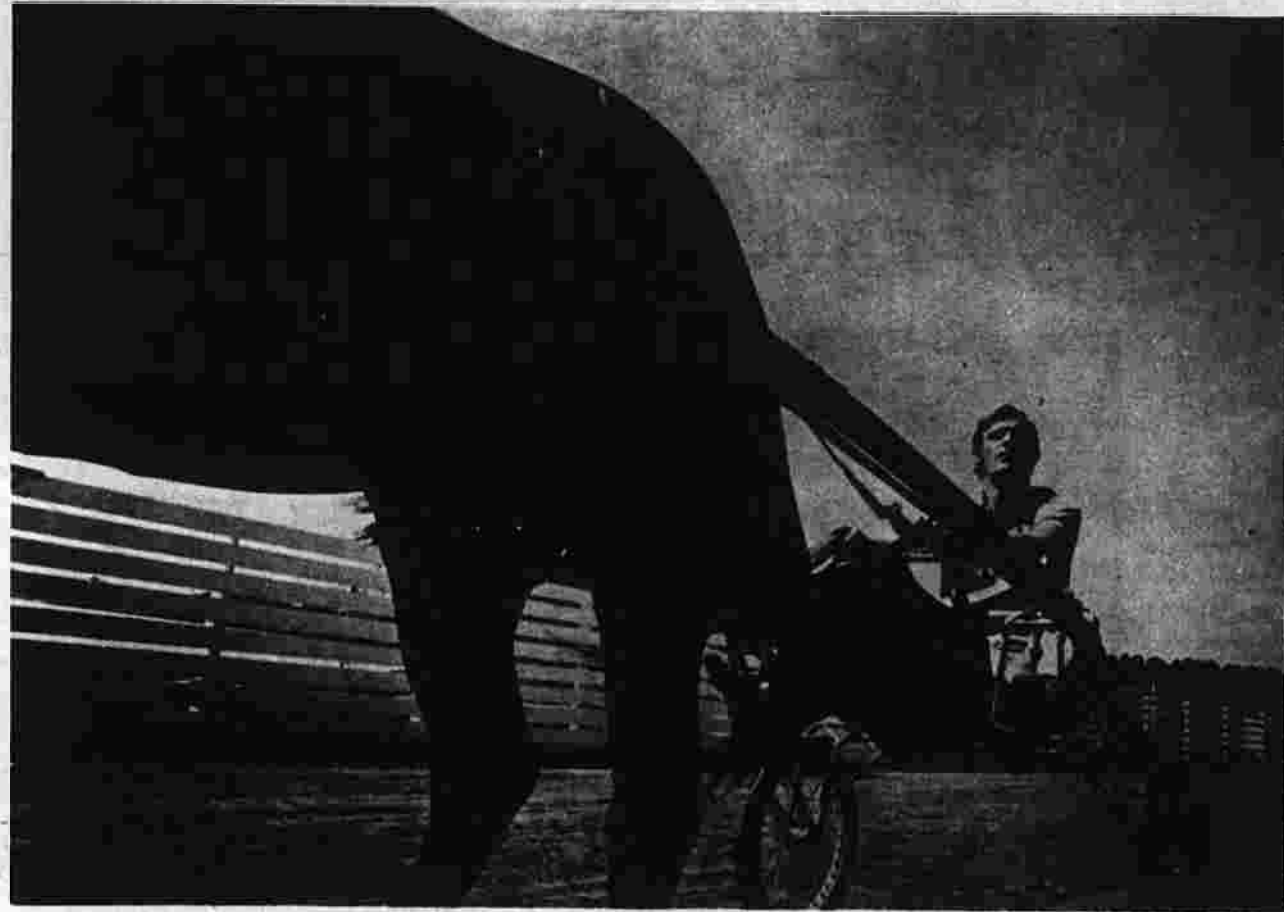

It is written here that all the time will probably be filled with two half-hour situation comedies plus a one-hour variety show headlined by a very young singer with a Southern accent and a guitar.

A number of one-hour Westerns will be interred in TV's Boot Hill come spring while an equal number will be born next September. The heroes will charge, but the scripts and the horses will look awfully familiar.

There will be numerous statements from the better-broadcast organizations decrying TV's excessive amount of violence. Network spokesmen will assert that they are being extra careful about that sort of thing—long fights and wholesale killings—but the regular viewers won't notice any real difference.

NET's Experiment: Part-time Network

NEW YORK (AP) — National Educational Television launched, with a marked lack of fireworks, an experimental venture that might be called a part-time network.

For the next six months, under substantial grants from the Ford Foundation and the Corporation for Public Broadcasting plus reduced rates by the telephone company, NET will broadcast simultaneously to some 130 stations for two hours on five nights a week.

NET, with its Ford Foundation grant, has been sending programs on these stations on a once-a-week basis since last season.

The expanded project started Monday night with a discussion program taped in Hong Kong involving four journalists analyzing the situation in Southeast Asia. Discussion shows are common on television these days and more to the point was the second hour, a film showing starving Biafrans, caught in a power struggle.

The program was raggedly edited and indifferently filmed. It included interviews with leaders of Biafra explaining their war for self-determination, thin long interviews with Nigerian leaders propounding their views.

But the heart of the program was the material showing small children so thin that every bone showed; and resigned and frightened older people.

Representatives of church groups explained with frustration

their inability to provide enough food for refugees and dislocated families — one skimpy meal a day was the limit.

The first drama of the week came along Thursday night with a production of "The Tin Whistle" taped by a Net affiliate in Pittsburgh.

Educational stations are high-minded, worthy and concerned, but it does seem that a little showmanship in programming would help.

Commercial network viewers have a legitimate gripe about the timing of television's only two prime-time news shows. CBS has long turned over a Tuesday night hour to its news division, and this season the 10-11 p.m. period consists of a magazine-format show called "60 Minutes" every other week.

Now NBC has come along with its new monthly magazine-format show called "First Tuesday" and dropped it into a time period in direct conflict. NBC, however, is a two-hour show, pre-empting its feature "movie rerun."

TV's Better With the Flu

NEW YORK (AP) — The current outbreak of virus infections including Hong Kong flu now sweeping the nation has at least one good thing going for it: It permits the sufferer to really appreciate television.

This viewer, with streaming eyes, plugged nostrils and assorted aches that pills don't relieve, spent Wednesday in the company of an unobtrusive TV set.

During the day, those endless game shows with the merry hosts and the squealing contestants were much too noisy to bear, and the suffering in the soap operas had a tendency to make the invalid thrash around.

But exactly right were some of those elderly movies that are ground out during odd hours of the morning and afternoon.

This viewer turned on a perfectly dreadful World War II film in which Ginger Rogers played Rosy the riveter, and after about 15 minutes it had worked better than a sleeping pill.

Later, when Dick Cavett with Abe Burrows were much too noisy and happy, there was a 1937 movie starring Wendy Barrie playing an heiress who ac-

quires a newspaper and a bunch of carefree reporters including Walter Pidgeon. It may have been one of the very worst movies ever made, but one could follow every plot twist with eyes closed and eventually one drifted off to dreamland.

When this bug departs, if ever, it will be interesting to compare the worst of our 1969 television fare with some of those old movies. It has got to be infinitely superior in every way—remember, we once paid money to see those oldies.

For the rheumy-eyed, the happiest TV consists of shows that can be glanced at, not watched closely. NBC, "Music Hall," with Nancy Sinatra surrounded by some smooth musical performers and plenty of sleek music was thus one of the most effective prescriptions of the evening hours.

Miss Sinatra has a pleasant way with a song and she was helped immeasurably by Don Ho and the team of Sandler and Young.

The weekly NBC show has an impossible task cut out for its producers—to turn out something like a variety special every seven days and use a different guest star each time.

A show with low ratings but critical acclaim will be canceled and, immediately, there will be a well-organized protest with letters to the networks and to TV columnists and perhaps even some equally well-organized demonstrations before network headquarters. If the protest attracts much attention, it may even keep the show on the air—anyway, for a little while.

Established variety shows will try desperately to insert outrageous political commentary and the late evening conversation shows will try to steer the talk into daring areas in hopes of stimulating controversy or at least some publicity.
