

Nixon-Goldwater Worker Deputy Attorney General

WASHINGTON (AP) — An Arkansas lawyer who figured prominently in the presidential campaign of 1964 winner Richard M. Nixon, and 1964 loser Barry M. Goldwater will be No. 1 man in the Justice Department.

Atty. Gen. designate John N. Mitchell announced Tuesday that Richard G. Kleindienst, 45, of Phoenix, is to be deputy attorney general.

Mitchell also chose six other Republican lawyers to head various divisions of the department. The appointments must be confirmed by the Senate, which Tuesday gave formal approval to the President's choice of Charles W. Yost to be ambassador to the United Nations.

Kleindienst worked in 1964 to set up Republican convention votes for Goldwater, and last year performed the same chore for Nixon. He served as director of field operations during the general election campaign of both Nixon and Goldwater.

Another close friend of Goldwater, William H. Rohrbach of Phoenix, is to head the office of legal counsel.

The other five appointments are:

Jerry Leonard, Milwaukee, civil rights division.

Richard W. McLaren, Chicago, antitrust division.

Will R. Wilson, Austin, a former Texas state attorney general, criminal division.

William J. Ruckelshaus, Indianapolis, civil division.

Johanne Meek, Walters, Greenville, S.C., tax division.

But the new relationship of business and government may be conflict also.

President Kennedy learned this in 1962, when his attempt at damping inflation threats were, it seems, misunderstood by Roger M. Blough, the head U.S. Steel.

After having prodded labor into what he thought was a non-inflationary wage agreement, Kennedy felt certain that U.S. Steel would not feel a price increase necessary. He figured it correctly, though flat pricing was his demand.

Kennedy quickly recognized that he could not account for his pocket without the support of the business community, he set about making amends.

Investment tax credits and recommendations for a tax cut followed and by November of 1963 Kennedy had regained much of the lost confidence of businessmen.

Johnson also had his troubles, partly for the same reason. He too believed that business should cooperate in a larger plan of things. He tried to bring businessmen closer to government. He solicited their cooperation.

The manner in which he did so, however, created some distrust. Perhaps businessmen are Bible readers, for their fear of the familiar Johnson strategy. "Come, let us reason together," suggested they knew the rest of the passage.

It follows, from the Book of Isaiah:

"Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord; though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool."

If you are willing and obedient, you shall eat the good of the land; but if you refuse and rebel, you shall be devoured by the sword; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.

Regardless of the individuals involved, the fact is that business and government are being forced into alliance today, for neither can do alone what each knows must be done in rebuilding society.

Each is expanding its role into the vast area of social welfare, into territory not previously explored by either.

Bank Holdups In State Net \$597,150 in '68

NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP) — Holdups at 81 banks and savings and loan institutions in Connecticut last year netted a record \$597,150—more than double the \$248,000 taken in 1967.

According to the FBI, which compiled the figures, 18 of the 28 persons arrested, five are already in prison for up to 16 years, four ranging up to 16 years.

The biggest day for bank robbery was Nov. 7 when a bank in Hamden and one in Manchester were robbed a few hours apart. A total of \$177,000 was taken in the robbery. The charge of FBI operations in Connecticut said.

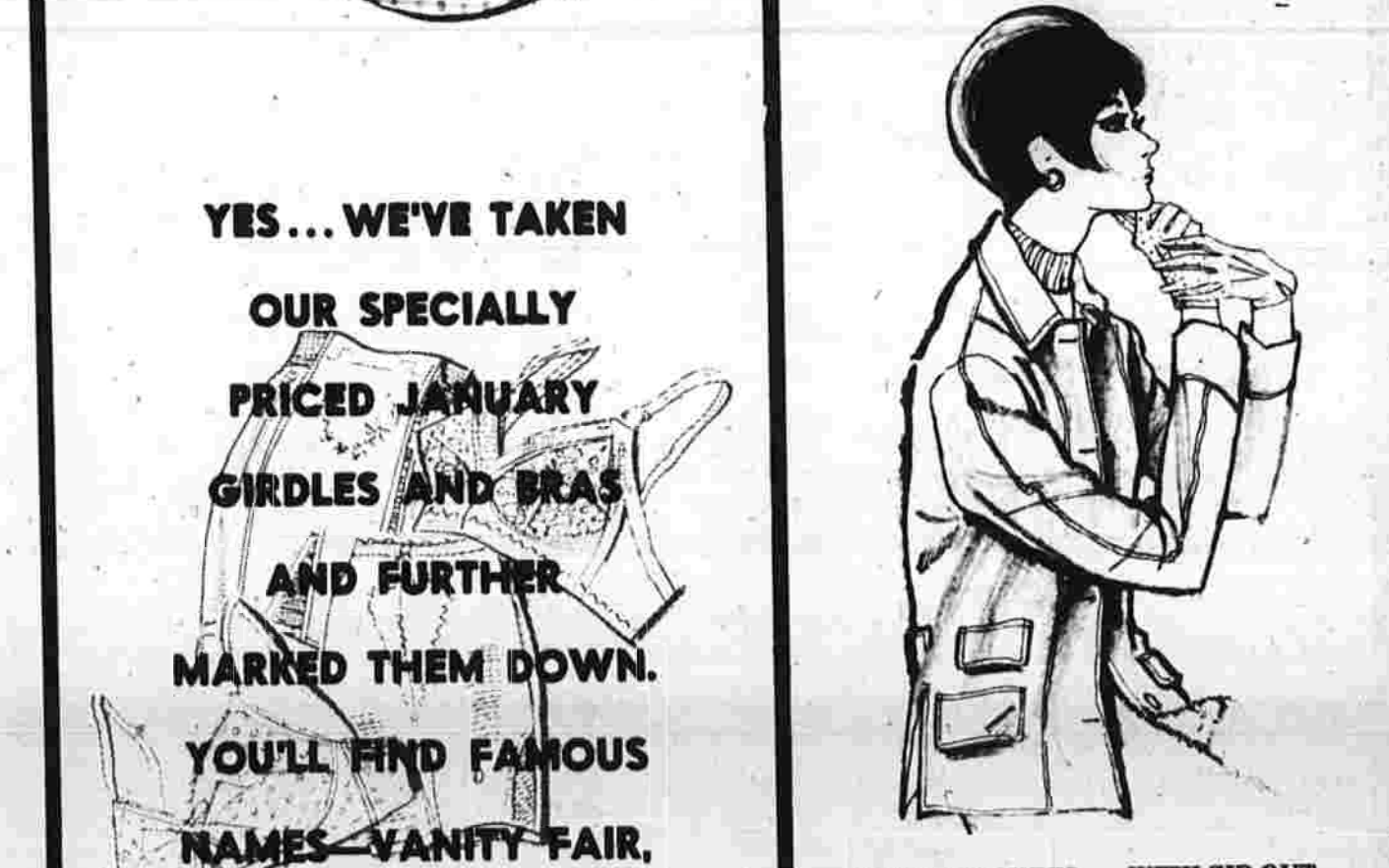

Playing Interplanetary Billiards Scientists Hope to Cut Time In Unmanned Space Travel

SALT LAKE CITY (AP)—Scientists hope to reduce unmanned space travel time by playing interplanetary billiards.

Dr. Gary Flandro, assistant professor of mechanical engineering at the University of Utah, is using a \$25,000 federal grant to simulate through computers a space flight of four billion miles.

Scientists at the Jet Propulsion Laboratory in California also are working on the technique.

Flandro says modern rockets cannot power such a flight by themselves. Something else is needed to reach such distant planets as Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune or Pluto.

Using Saturn 5, the biggest U.S. rocket, Flandro says it would take more than six years to reach Saturn, 19 to get to Uranus, more than 30 to reach Neptune and 45 to reach Pluto.

A generation would pass away before the spacecraft reached Neptune, he said.

“And more than likely, the vehicle would become obsolete in flight.”

Designing bigger and better rockets would be impractical, he said. “We would need rockets and boosters bigger than the Empire State Building to turn a payload of any size to Saturn alone.”

Flandro says interplanetary billiards is the answer—that it could cut the travel time to distant planets by 50 to 80 per cent.

This is the idea:

The spacecraft would be launched with ordinary rockets toward Jupiter, which has a gravitational pull 1,000 times greater than Earth. Once the rockets were out, engines which use energy from the sun would speed the spacecraft along. The pull of Jupiter would greatly accelerate the speed.

Cosmonauts Welcomed by Muscovites

MOSCOW (AP)—Several hundred enthusiastic flag-waving Russians braved bitter cold today to give the four new Soviet cosmonauts a rousing airport welcome.

After waiting nearly an hour in 11-below cold, the crowd burst into screams and cheers as a turboprop Tupolev 154 landed with the spacemen.

The cosmonauts marched down a red carpet, mounted a platform and introduced to the assembled Soviet leaders that Soyuz 4 and Soyuz 5 had successfully completed their missions.

Premier Alexei N. Kosygin was not in sight, lending credence to rumors that he has been ill. But Communist party general secretary Leonid I. Brezhnev and President Nikolai S. Podgorny gave the cosmonauts warm handshakes and issued each of them three times “bravo.”

Huong Says Communists May Stall Paris Talks

SAIGON (AP)—Premier Tran Van Huong said tonight he fears that “Communist stubbornness” may stall the Paris peace talks.

Eventual success of the conference in bringing peace to South Vietnam will hinge on the internal situation here, he added.

Huong spoke in answer to questions at an impromptu news conference at a diplomatic reception.

He was asked what he thought of the chances of success for the enlarged Paris talks opening Saturday.

“When you sit down at a conference table you always hope the negotiations will end in success,” he replied, “but we have to learn lessons from the past, among them Korea. The Communists, mostly the Communists in the North and their auxiliaries (Viet Cong) have been stubborn in prolonging the negotiations. Our hope (for success) is lessened by this stubbornness.”

Generalities Were Also Specifics

The inevitable question, after President Nixon's Inaugural Address, is what in the world he can do that is specific and real without destroying the peace and soothing, reassuring spell of the address.

The matter of our current relations with Russia provides a case example of how the generalities of the Nixon Inaugural were really also specific.

The day before the Inaugural, inter-pretative news from Moscow told of a contrasting power and policy struggle between Russia's hawks and Russia's doves.

Russian doves, it was said, were currently managing Russian foreign policy, trying to steer it into paths of negotiation with the United States.

Russian doves, it was said, were hoping that Russia's doves might be discredited, and their own prestige and power be given an upward boost.

It seemed to be almost in a plea against any such development that the dove-oriented present leadership issued, on the very eve of the Inaugural, its special notice that it was ready for talks with the United States.

People Wanted To See People

And television failed miserably when it neglected, along with its showing of what the principals did and said on Inaugural Day, a magnificent opportunity to let America see itself.

Some 52 states and territories, we believe, had units of one kind or another in the Inaugural Parade. People in every one of these states or territories must have been waiting, and hungering, Monday, for some real good look at their own units in the parade.

All America was represented, at the Inaugural Balls, by the some 28,000 fancy-dressed people who attended them.

One would have thought that, with that many people to choose from, the television cameras might have managed to show at least a few individuals. What it did was to show the Presidential party in so many different locations, surrounded, each time, by a faceless mass of people.

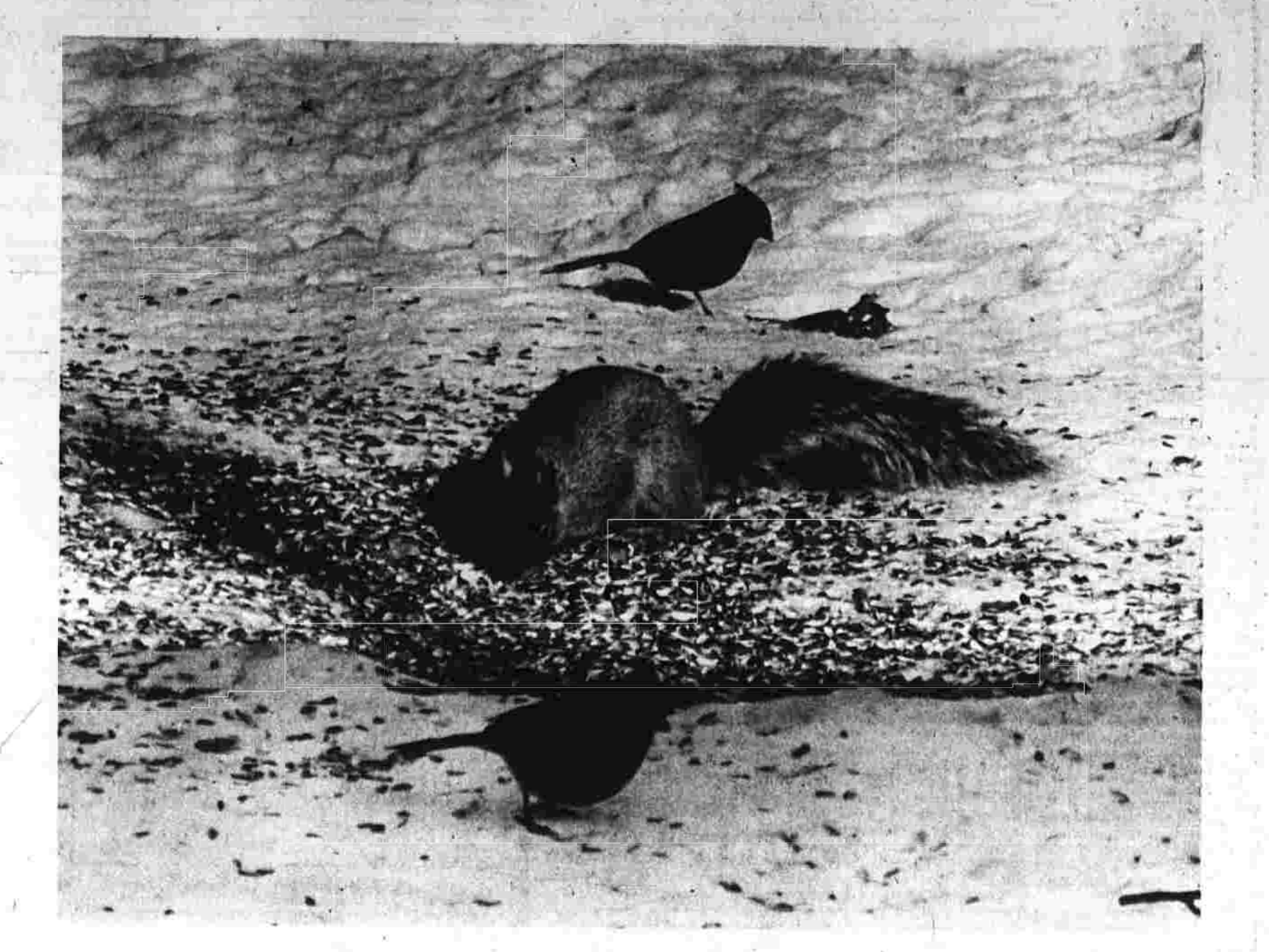
But they might have made at least an interesting beginning if they had devoted half the time they spent showing their own commentators discussing today's news to showing us some of the random close-up camera journey through the crowded dance floors of the evening.

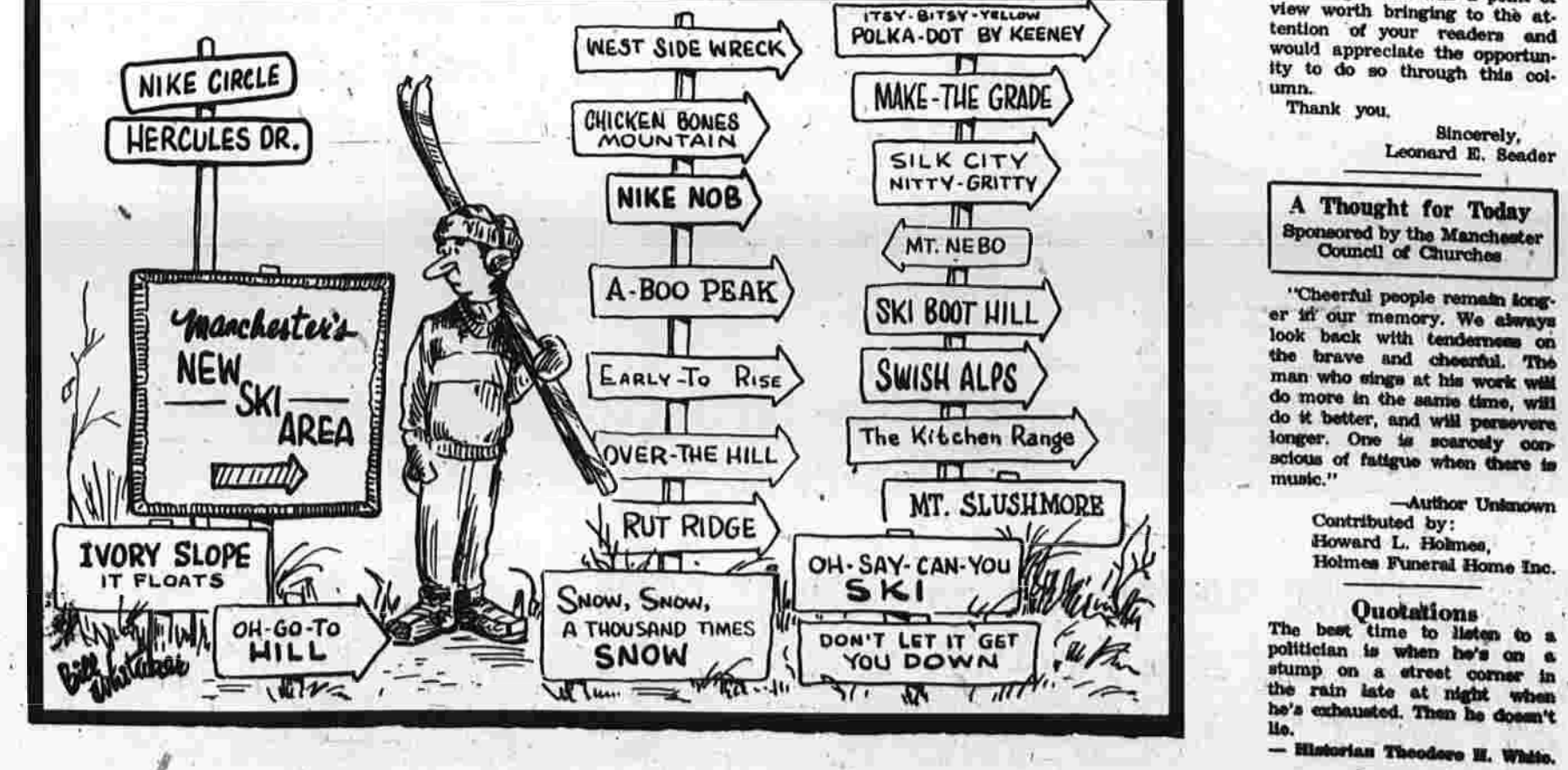

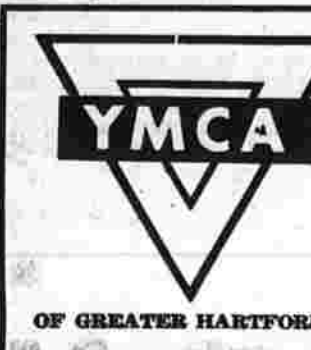

Project Started in 1963 U.N. Employee Is Walking Every Street in Manhattan

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP)—A U.N. informant is becoming an authority on the lesser-known oddities in Manhattan by walking every street on the island.

"I have walked 500 streets so far and have only about 125 to go to cover Manhattan from tip to tip," said Frank Barabas, a tall, husky instructor of 32.

That means covering nearly 1,000 miles on foot since Barabas and his girl friend, Philadelphia-born Anne Kosman, of the U.N. 24th service, began their project on March 1963.

"Don't forget, these are streets and not blocks we are covering," said Barabas. "Home, like Broadway, runs 200 blocks or more in Manhattan alone. And we cover both sides of every street; up one side and down the other."

"I have always been fascinated by Manhattan; I like walking and I believe in doing things in an orderly manner," said Barabas, who lives in Jersey City, N.J.

Barabas does his walking weekdays, evenings and in "any other spare time I have."

He has been struck by the distinctive national atmosphere of the ethnic communities scattered throughout the city.

"I remember one hot night when Anne and I walked through the Puerto Rican section of East Harlem," he said. "Families sat gossiping on the front stoops of their apartment houses, while peddlers hawked live crabs, crayfish and oysters. They had their produce piled with Caribbean fruits. It was like being in a Latin American village."

Barabas and his girl friend have been intrigued by the odd customs and peculiar stories they have stumbled upon; such as the fact that a room out of Victorian England, and a quaint-looking old man in a "red bag" of imported fox fur, were his patrons.

"Then there are the East European coffee houses and old rum shops on Allen Street, and the shops on West 12th street where you can buy all kinds of things."

Barabas has never been molested on their strolls although they walked through Harlem during the 1964 riots.

"The only incident they ever witnessed was a parade celebrating the 104th anniversary of the United States."

"There is always the unexpected," said Barabas, "like the time Anne and I were strolled down by a Coast Guard cutter when we ventured out onto a river and saw a man in a blue uniform being carried to get back onto the mainland."

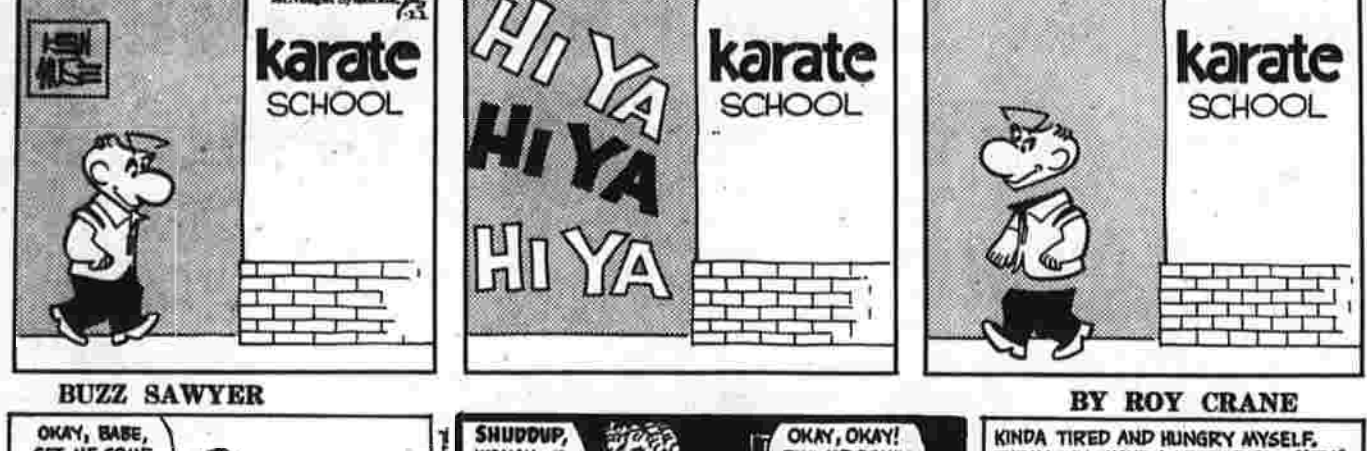

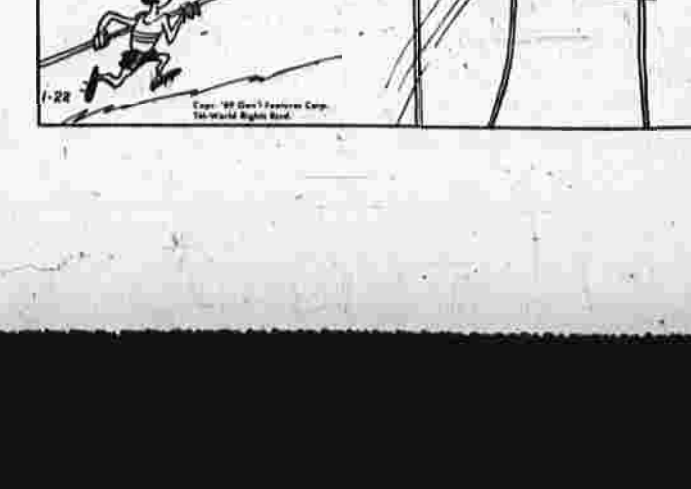
