



The First Press Conference

In his first press conference President Wixon displayed poise, extensive and complicated knowledge of any field of policy he was asked to discuss, and a well nigh perfect skill in the business of saying just what he intended to say and

The questions he had to field were sharp. Yet it had to be, in view of the fact that he had been in the Presidency only a week, that he had few sharp, definitive answers ready to give. In almost every questioning instance, the policy involved is still under its first discussion and consideration by the personnel of the new administration.

From the news angle, then, the yield of this first press conference had to be light. There was, in fact, only one disclosure which left viewers with an additional question they would like to ask. The President referred to new tactics in the peace negotiations at Paris. That aroused some interest and curiosity.

Spot news aside, the main interest of the new President's first press conference reverted back to the man himself, and to how he revealed himself.

It was obvious that he handled himself well, not merely in his skillful weighing of alternatives and options, where he felt privileged to sketch these in some particular situation, but in his display of on oot analysis of question angles which involved his own native intelligence. The new President is not only an informed man, as exceptionally informed as perhaps he should be after eight years as a Vice President and two candidacies for the Presidency, but he is skilled and able in the business of thinking on his feet and translating his thoughts into effective, coherent language.

All this means he should have no difficulty with the press conference; as some of his predecessors are supposed to have done, and that it should be, for him, an asset rather than something to be fear-

This verdict is reinforced when one notices that, even in this first effort, certain grace notes began to make their ppearance. One can suspect he planned to treat himself to a simulated pun when, at one stage in his conference, he thought it now time "to turn to the left" for questioners. But his friendly references to the liberal columnist, Mary McGrory, and to the New York Times, which anybody who remembered the campaign would expect him never to read again were spontaneous touches indicating that the Nixon press conference is going to have some life and humor and gentle irony in it, along with skilled blunting of questions that are too sharp.

There was a curious note in the press conference performance — in the gentle humor cited as well as in the appearance of the phrase "we will make a determination" - which, like some flitting moments in the Inaugural Address, seemed possibly an echo of the language and manner of another President, the one who won the time this one lost. With John F. Kennedy, it was, as we remember it, "we will make a judgment." But the subtle play with the personalities and ideologies of the media, which ripened so well with Kennedy, seems almost the beginning of a duplication. After the good and earnest Johnson is it like it was after the good and earnest Eisenhower - back to some sophistication?

The Unforeseen Complication

One of the classic tales of the unforeseen complication was the story of how New Haven Railroad President Pat Mc-Sinnis, a decade or so ago, made a great fanfare about purchasing sleek new light weight speed trains for the New Haven, and then found, when he tried to put them into service, that they wouldn't clear the platforms in his railroad stations.

The most thorough kind of advance easurement and specification would have had a sound chance of avoiding that costly complication, which meant that the glamorous new trains were

think, if nobody happened to foresee the special complication which would de-velop when the Perm Central's new high speed metroliners were tried out on the ashington to New York run.

This was something which happened, on two occasions in the first few days of the experimental runs, when the new high speed train whipped its way past some slower commuter train. The vacuum-suction created by its high speed just pulled two windows out of out of another. It didn't, fortunately, happen to pull any people out of the

It developed that both commuter trains involved in these freak accidents were old enough to be equipped with wooden window sashes, perhaps already weakened and rotted with age and weather So Penn Central, as one safeguard, has ordered that only trains with aluminum sashes be allowed to operate on tracks adjoining those used by the new metro-

That may solve this particular unforeseen complication in the introduction of the new high speed trains. Meanwhile, like new planes, new antibiotics, new diets, and new laws, the new trains will have to be tested and experimented with carefully before there can be any reliable verdict that they are safe for open throttle use.

Leaves Into Food

Just as nobody knows what to do abou leaves, now they are no longer supposed to be for burning, along comes a project at Louisiana State University, which envisions a process which can convert leaves into a high-protein food.

This food will, it is estimated, cost only seven cents a pound to produce. We hope that estimate includes the cost of collecting the leaves from our lawns. Most householders will, we think, welcome the new process more for its potential consumption of their leaves than for the possible new protein it offers them to consume.

The more we consider the food angle, in fact, the less attractive it seems for

The new leaf-food, whatever it is to be called, is going to taste like egg yolk. And egg yolk, to many of us, has always tasted like discipline and duty. It might be that, after an up to date survey of all the methods of disposing of leaves, we would prefer not to eat

To Lower Our Voices

Mr. Nixon's first words to the nation as its President were hardly words to set a poet's heart aflutter. Nor could they satisfy those who yearned for details of the new Chief Executive's program. Yet the inaugural address did what inaugural addresses are supposed to do: It set a tone for the Administration, and the tone was the right one.
"In these difficult years," said Mr. Nixon, "America has suffered from a

that promises more than it can deliver; from angry rhetoric that fans discontent into hatreds; from bombastic rhetoric that postures instead of persuades." The new President suggests, "To lower our olces would be a simple thing." Not so simple, perhaps, but a good thing. Recent years have seen an explosion of words, many of them the expected product of political speech writers, others the shouted obscenities of the "Alienated" - few of them really getting to the heart of what is wrong with country and what can be done to set it right. Mr. Nixon himself has made

a contribution or two, most notably in his campaign vow to name "a new Atorney General" — as if the restoration respect for civil order were that But there is a reason for this reliance on bombast, and the President touched

on it when he recalled Franklin Roose velt's summation of the nation's troubles in the early 1930s: "They concern, thank God, only material things." Noted Mr. Nixon: "Our crisis today is in reverse." When the nation's troubles are spiritual rather than material, there is great temptation to shout, to exhort, to use words where money and legislation would obviously be inadequate. There is a danger, though, in putting too much blame on "inflated rhetoric"



A greater portion of the population has access to education, good health care, and good housing than at any other time. The alternative - promising nothing, deliver nothing - might in a while extinguish those troublesome "rising expectations." It is an unacceptable alter native, as Mr. Nixon obviously sees: "In pursuing our goals of full employment, better housing, excellence in education: in improving our cities and improving our rural areas; in protecting our environment, enhancing the quality of life - in all these and more, we will and must press urgently forward." How does Mr. Nixon say the nation should press forward? He doesn't get specific, but he plainly sees a limited role for the Government he will be lead-

in the end, accomplish more. — THE NATIONAL OBSERVER.

The new President will simply have to ignore the shouts, and work instead to prove what his inaugural ad dress sought to convey in words - that
