Retarded Boy Plays Just That

NEW YORK (NEA)—David McCallum, who had been searched out in the vast recesses of an upper New York film studio by 13-year-old Billy Schulman, asked Billy to sit in on his interview.

David, formerly the delight of teen-agers as a result of his role as Illya on "The Man From U.N.C.L.E.," led the way into his dressing room, furnished in early Alcatraz, and talked with and about Billy, a retarded child.

Billy is playing just that in "Teacher, Teacher," an original drama by Allan Sloane to be seen on the Hallmark Hall of Fame over NBC on Wednesday. David plays the teacher.

"I read a story in the paper about you," David said to Billy. "It said you were susceptible to colds, but you're the only one in the cast who didn't get a cold."

"I was promised I could see tonight's rushes," Billy said. "Billy is very responsive,"

David said. "The mentally retarded are responsive, they are cheerful and they do cope with life with the right teaching."

"When I was first offered this role, it never occurred to me the child playing the part would not be retarded. I was horrified when I heard it might be an actor. Billy's so marvelous. In fact, there was a rumor around that he was not a retarded child but rather a child actor pretending to be retarded. That was only because you are so good in your scenes, Billy."

Later, when Billy had left, David, who, with his wife and three sons from a former marriage now plans to settle in the East, remarked how people are usually so afraid of mentioning anything about retardation in the family.

"After we were filming for about three days, members of the crew began coming to me individually and telling me they had retarded children. It turned out three in the crew did."

Children's Shows Changing

NEW YORK (AP) — The power of the public to affect television is aptly illustrated by the changes taking place in children's programming.

Parents made known their extreme displeasure with the cartoon diet of monsters and superheroes being fed their children on Saturday mornings—and the networks reacted.

"Action-adventure cartoons were highly criticized and we took them off the air," said Bud Grant, director of daytime programming at NBC.

Ed Vane, vice president for daytime programming at ABC, said, "We knew there was adverse reaction to all the networks presenting cartoons with monsters and superheroes."

As a result of the steady barrage of complaints the Saturday morning monster cartoons are all but off the air. Those remaining on the networks probably will disappear at the end of the season. In many cases, however, they are simply being replaced by comedy cartoons.

NBC initiated the first changes last summer when it installed the hour-long "Banana Splits" at midmorning Saturdays. The program, a kind of happening for kids, was an instant hit.

Grant said some neighborhood children join his seven-year-old every week to watch the show in color.

"The other day I got a phone call from a cute little girl who usually comes over and she said, 'Mr. Grant, where are the Banana Splits?' I told her we had a special on, and she said, 'Okay, I'll watch it, but if I don't like it I'll come over and punch you in the nose.'"

At midseason NBC scrapped two of its most criticized cartoon series, "Birdman" and "Super President" and replaced them with "Untamed World" and "Storybook Squares." The former is a live animal show and the latter a children's version of the adult quiz "Hollywood Squares."

It cost the network \$750,000 to

scrap the cartoon shows. Last fall CBS dropped two action cartoons and substituted animated comedies. The comedies, notably "Archie," proved popular and CBS is sticking with an all-cartoon format for the rest of the season.

ABC retains "Spider-Man" and the "Fantastic Four," with the rest of the morning taken up with cartoon comedies, "The American Bandstand" and "Happening."

All three networks have new programs under development for next season, including some noncartoon shows.

The most significant development, however, was CBS's announcement last week that it will present four to five original dramas on Saturday mornings next year on the "CBS Children's Playhouse." The network is commissioning writers at \$10,000 a script for this new program.

Red Skelton At Boston Pops

Red Skelton will appear with opera singer Robert Merrill and the Boston Pops Orchestra conducted by Arthur Fiedler, in a special music-and-comedy edition of "The Red Skelton Hour" to be taped on location in Boston, April 8 through 9, for presentation as Skelton's last broadcast of the season on CBS.

On the broadcast, Merrill helps bumpkin Clem Kadiddlehopper (Skelton) to have one of Clem's compositions played at Boston's Symphony Hall by the famed orchestra, with which Merrill is appearing as guest singer.

En route to Symphony Hall, Clem takes a "fractured-history" tour of the city—Old North Church, Paul Revere's house and the USS Constitution.

'Babar' Show Gets Encore

"Babar the Elephant," highly-rated and acclaimed animated musical, program, will return for an encore on NBC April 21.

'What It Was' Was Rough

NEW YORK (NEA) — The show is called "What It Was, Was Love," and it will be presented on the Kraft Music Hall on NBC on Wednesday.

But what it was, for Eydie Gorme, was a rough time. What it was for Steve Lawrence was an idea come to life.

"What It Was, Was Love" is something brand new for TV. It's an original record album, an "albumusical," just being released by RCA Victor. It was written by Gordon Jenkins for Steve and Eydie at Steve's request. Steve thought it would be visually exciting and Dwight Hemion and Gary Smith, who produce the weekly Kraft shows, agreed.

But for Eydie, Steve's loving and now very thin wife ("I'm never going to gain weight again," she says), the show was rough.

"There's one scene where there is a chase on horseback through Central Park," Eydie said. "My horse tried to kill me. He hated me. There is Steve riding through the park like he's auditioning for Bo-

nanza. He is a definite John Wayne type. And there's my horse trying to kill me. They took me off the horse and now there I am running through the park with Steve chasing me on horseback."

Another scene was shot on the frozen Central Park lake. "We walked across it," Steve said, "and I felt just like Frank Sinatra. I never walked on water before."

Eydie, however, tripped and took a bad spill. "There I am in terrible pain," she recalled, "and Steve is bent over me and do I get time for a rest? No. I'm asked to do the scene again. There were cops assigned to our shooting area and after we finished the day's work, one of them said, 'We wouldn't change our jobs for your's for a million dollars.'"

Steve and Eydie happen to be one of the most popular, talented and successful young married show business teams. But if you had never heard of them, and got involved in a casual conversation, you would figure Steve as a nine-to-five businessman who runs home to his wife and two sons after a day at the office. Eydie seems perfect as a concerned mother, having friends over for bridge, and working for charity (which she does).

They're young (if being in the early 30s is still considered young today), aware and nicely square.

"I think Steve and Paul Newman are the only two men in the industry still wearing the same style suits and ties," Eydie said.

Steve added, "If I hear one more guy, 30 years my senior, trying to be hip and saying, 'I'm going to tell it like it is,' I'll throw up. How can anyone tell you 'where it's at' if they don't know where it's been?"

Now warmed up to the subject, Eydie said, "I have a feeling it's all coming back our way. Our show, 'Golden Rainbow' (which just closed after a run of over a year on Broadway), was packed with people
