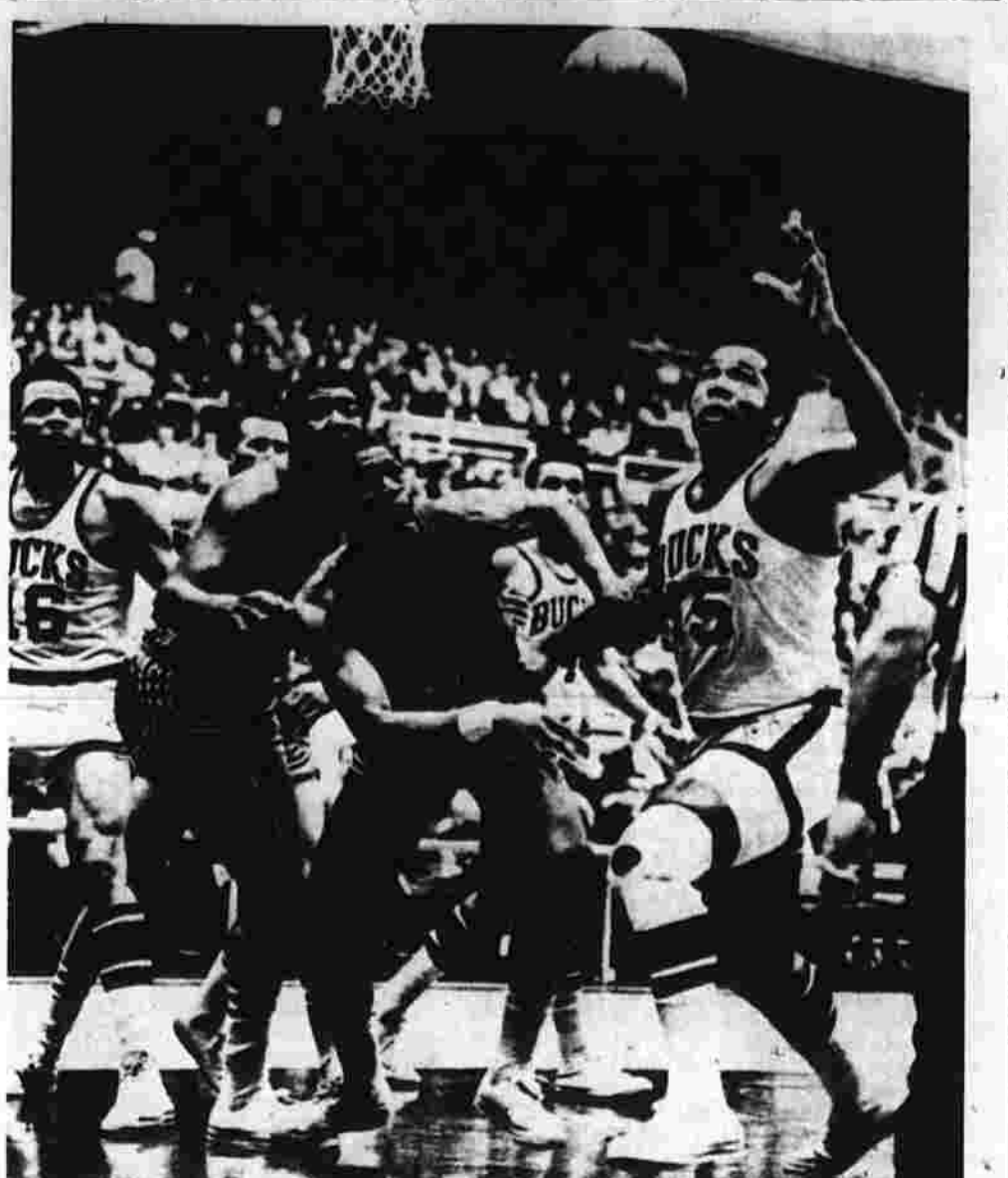

Head Start, Job Corps OEO Losing 2 Programs

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon told Congress today he is stripping the Office of Economic Opportunity of two major programs—Head Start and the Job Corps—

In a special message, however, Nixon promised to keep OEO as an "umbrella" for experimental programs bearing on the anti-poverty campaign.

And he called for a national commitment aimed at "providing all American children an opportunity for healthy and stimulating development during the first five years of life."

During his campaign for the presidency, Nixon described Head Start as "one of the programs that deserves continuing, and could even be accelerated."

On the same day, responsibility for the Job Corps which seeks to train school dropouts and unskilled jobless youths for gainful employment, will be delegated to the Labor Department.

Nixon chose to delegate these programs elsewhere, because he has power to do so by administrative action.

Nixon also said he has directed that preparations be made for the shift from OEO to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare of two smaller, but popular, OEO projects.

These are Comprehensive Health Centers, which provide health services to the residents of poor neighborhoods, and the Foster Grandparents program.

The President proposed new legislation in his message but promised that before June 30 "I will send Congress a comprehensive proposal for the future of the poverty program, including recommendations for reviving and extending the act beyond its scheduled 1970 expiration."

He said he would ask Congress to also extend for one year authority for anti-poverty appropriations that run out on June 30.

The Nixon administration is reported mulling over the prospect of special tax breaks for both big business and the average housewife to enlist them as volunteers in the war on poverty.

Nixon, while critical of some aspects of administration of the poverty funds, said OEO has proven "the value of having in the federal government an agency whose special concern is the poor."

U.S. and South Vietnamese forces reported killing 145 enemy soldiers at a cost of six American and 19 South Vietnamese killed, 13 Americans and 33 South Vietnamese wounded and seven South Vietnamese missing.

Allied troops also uncovered many more tons of rice and munitions near the Cambodian border, another indication the enemy is still trying to stock up for an offensive in the Indochina region, military spokesmen said.

The American Air Cavalrymen were riding helicopter gunships looking for troops from the North Vietnamese 9th Division in the triple-canopied jungle of War Zone D. Suddenly they spotted several men in an opening and cut into them with machine guns.
