**Doctors Suggest Breathing Gear** Failed Aquanaut By THOMAS O'TOOLE The Washington Post

WASHINGTON-Having ruled out a beart attack and a brain hemorrhage, Navy doctors Wednesday suggested that Sea-lab aquanaut Berry L. Cannon died in 600 feet of water Monday because his breathing equipment failed him.
"Right now," conceded one of the Navy's foremost experts in underwater medicine, "the first thing that is suspect is his un-

derwater breathing apparatus. Cannon was stricken two mis utes after he and fellow aqua-neut Robert A. Barth swam from a four-man diving capsule that had lowered them into 47 degree waters off San Clemente Island, 60 miles south of Long The dead aquanaut was using a lightweight Mark IX cuba gear, which was being supplied

with a mixture of 95 per cent helium and 2.5 per cent each of oxygen and nitrogen through a lifeline hooked to gas bottles inside the diving bell. This apparatus is about a year old and was developed exworn and tested by Navy diver (including Cannon) in about 2 test dives, including tank
