No Truce In The Field There are some Americans who, when peace talks finally got themselves going at Paris, would have considered it appropriate and ideal American poticy if we had moved to cut down our own military activity in Vietnam.

The theory would have been this: that If we stopped looking for fighting to do, stopped reaching for better military position, perhaps this would contribute to lessening of conflict which might, in time, dwindle down into as much of a truce as any warfare involving guerrillas is likely to be able to attain.

administration in the White House. Outside of our original decision to halt the bombing of North Vietnam, we have not leescalated the war. To the contrary, for a long time we made sure we dropped as much bomb tonnage as before, although on smaller, more restricted areas. And, instead of sitting still wherever we were and seeing whether the war would dwindle, we organized various military moves into areas which we had hitherto neglected because they were more or less conceded to be solid Victorig territory.

In the White House, one suppose, the theory in back of this insistence upon a continued military initiative in Vietnam was that we needed to do it in order to keep our bargaining position at Paris strong. And among our military, the very exciting theory was that we might be on the verge of giving the enemy in all Vietnam such clear final knockout blow that we would, after all, be able to claim the very thing we had supposedly abandoned all hope for - a military type victory

This being what we ourselves have done, there is obviously little real merit, not even propaganda advantage, for that matter, in complaining when the Vietcong and the North Vietnamese undertake to demonstrate that they are not all washed up, when they begin harass ing some of our established bases, when they prove that they can still infiltrate and carry on guerrilla tactics almost anywhere they needs.

ing some kind of pre-negotiation understanding with us if any direct attack should be launched on Saigon. There ias been nothing like that in the news to date - merely our own continuous predictions the enemy might be about o try to launch such an attack. Otherwise, each of us has been try-

ing to strengthen his position at the conference table in Paris, and each of us has been trying to demonstrate that he is still willing and able to seek a purely military decision in the battle-It will be better when we both give

up that idea, and get down to the theory that, the strongest position at Paris will ventually turn out to be that position which is more directly willing to make e first real move toward the kind of non-victory settlement which has to come, sooner or later.
