

Apollo 9 Astronauts Safe in Orbit

Testing Lunar Craft Flight's Main Task

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—Riding the fearsome power of a Saturn 5 super-rocket, the Apollo 9 astronauts hurtled into earth orbit today to start a marathon mission in which they are to qualify a fragile ugly duckling spacecraft to land men on the moon.

Flight Plan

CAPE KENNEDY, Fla. (AP)—Here are the highlights of the 10-day earth orbit flight planned by Apollo 9 astronauts James A. McDivitt, David R. Scott and Russell L. Schweickart.

First Day
Rockets launch command ship lunar module (LEM) and third stage into 118-mile high orbit. Nearly three hours later, command ship separates, turns around and docks nose-to-nose with LEM. Third stage separates and ground stations fire its engine twice in tests that send stage into solar orbit.

Second Day
Astronauts check out operation of combined space ship, including three flights of main engine which shifts path of orbit to elliptical between 132 and 311 miles high.

Third Day
In first space ship transfer by American astronauts, McDivitt and Schweickart crawl through three-foot connecting tunnel into LEM and activate its systems. They activate a program from the LEM and fire the LEM descent engine while still docked. This engine is designed to lower

McDivitt's heart was beating at 130 beats a minute, and Air Force Col. David R. Scott's heart was beating at 120 a minute. But Schweickart's heart was taking away at only 72 beats a minute, only about ten beats faster than normal. He called down to earth, "This is a rookie saying everything is looking beautiful."

"We're real proud of you," Krass beamed at the three space fliers.

Almost immediately, the astronauts began checking out the complex computerized systems in their \$55 million spacecraft.

Also checked out were the maneuvering between the spacecraft and the lunar module which is making its first flight in space. It is the oddest that will actually land two men on the lunar surface on future flights.

If the three daring spacemen succeed in qualifying the spider-like lunar module (LEM), they could clear the way for two astronauts to land on the moon in June or July. If the LEM does not work, America's lunar timetable could be set back indefinitely.

A scheduled Friday launch had to be postponed after all three astronauts developed sore throats and stuffy noses.

During 10 days in earth orbit they are to thoroughly evaluate the LEM, which has been called a "missing link" because it is the only major piece of Apollo hardware yet to be tested.

The ungainly appearance of the spindly-legged vehicle has earned it the radio code name "spider."

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration rates Apollo 9 the most complex man-in-space flight yet, even more difficult to carry out than the Apollo 8 moon orbit journey.

On the fourth day, Schweickart is to take the United States' first space walk in more than two years, a two-hour stroll in which he is to practice an emergency transfer from the LEM to the main Apollo 9 ship and back to the LEM.

On the fifth day, McDivitt and Schweickart are to fly the "Spider" 109 miles away from Scott in the main ship, code name "Gumdrop," and then attempt a tricky rendezvous in which they will simulate two astronauts

Thousands Ring Embassy at Peking Red Chinese Protest Soviet Border Clash

TOEYO (AP)—Red Guards and workers demonstrated around the Soviet Embassy in Peking today after Chinese and Soviet troops clashed on a disputed river island on the Manchurian border.

Both Moscow and Peking announced "many killed and wounded" in the battle Sunday. Japan's Kyodo news agency said crowds of demonstrators ringed the Soviet Embassy in the Chinese capital, carrying placards reading, "We strongly protest the Soviet provocation" and, "Huang Keoggin," a reference to Soviet Premier Alexei Kossygin.

The Soviet Union and Red China accused each other of crossing the border Sunday, and China said it was the 15th Soviet violation in two years.

The Peking-based correspondent of the Yugoslav news agency Tanjug reported to Belgrade that tens of thousands of demonstrators blocked the Soviet Embassy.

He said they chanted, "Down

ment issued a note of protest which claimed that 200 Red Chinese soldiers took part in the border shooting. It said some Soviet guards were killed and others were wounded.

The Soviet note, distributed by the Tass news agency, said the Kremlin demanded "strictest punishment" for those responsible and added that immediate steps must be taken to prevent further incidents.

Although similar clashes have been reported between Chinese and Russian border troops in the past, it was believed to be the first time Peking and Moscow exchanged protest notes over such an incident.

Peking's New China News Agency said the battle occurred on an island in the Ussuri River, which forms part of the border between Red China and the Soviet Far East.

The Chinese called the island Changpao and claimed it as "indisputable Chinese territory." The Soviets called it Damansky and said it constitutes their Nishinzhilainovka border post.

The island is 200 miles north of Vladivostok.

The Chinese Foreign Ministry said "large numbers of fully armed" Soviet troops crossed into Chinese territory in four armored cars and trucks despite repeated warnings from Chinese border guards and "outrageously" opened cannon and gun fire, killing and wounding many Chinese frontier guards.

It said the Chinese were "compelled to fight back in self-defense" and gave the Soviet soldiers "punishment which they deserved."

The New China News Agency said a Chinese protest note was delivered to the Soviet Embassy in Peking, demanding that the Soviet Union "punish the culprits of this incident," halt its "encroachment on Chinese territory" and hold itself "responsible for any grave consequences that may result." The note said Chinese reserves the right to demand compensation.

Project Concern Benefits Cited

HARTFORD (AP)—The children based from inner-city to suburban schools under Project Concern have increased their basic learning skills four times faster than those who stay in the city, says one of the prime architects of the project, Dr. Alexander Plantz.

He made the remarks Sunday in a program broadcast by WOR-TV (Channel 9) in New York. Plantz is chief of the Bureau of Continuing Education of the Connecticut State Department of Education. Project Concern includes 2,500 youngsters living in Hartford, New Haven and Waterbury.

"We're finding that we get fantastic IQ shift," Plantz said. The increases are rapid in basic learning skills like language and reading, he added. Project Concern originated in Hartford three years ago.



Perfect Liftoff

Concorde's First Flight 'A Triumph'

TOULOUSE, France (AP)—After a successful maiden flight, the British-French Concorde, the western world's first supersonic jetliner, began a three-year program of tests today.

Adverse weather delayed the first flight since Thursday, and the huge four-engine jet was forced to fly below 3,000 feet Sunday instead of around 23,000 feet. Increasing ground winds cut the scheduled 40-minute flight to 21. And the plane did not get over 200 miles an hour, though it is designed to fly at 1,400 m.p.h.

Nevertheless, chief test pilot Andre Turcat, 47, said the Concorde "behaved perfectly" in her 90-degree sweep around this area of southwest France. British government officials and aircraft executives called the flight a "soaring triumph."

Turcat said he plans to fly again in a few days, but the most critical tests of all—sonic boom—were still more than a year away.

A British version will fly from Bristol in six weeks.

Reds Ignore Call For Talks on Berlin

BERLIN (AP)—East Germany's Communist regime ignored today a new bid for talks to solve the current Berlin crisis and, though dropping harassment of civilian traffic, held up a U.S. Army convoy for about an hour.

Attaches of the Western Big Three nations coursed in and out unimpeded, though the Soviet Union had raised the most serious challenge to West Berlin's flight corridors since the Russian blockade 20 years ago was broken by an allied airlift.

A U.S. spokesman said the GI convoy was delayed on its way from West Berlin to West Germany on the main autobahn across 110 miles of Communist territory. It was the third such reported incident since Saturday. The East Germans attrib-

ute such delays to Warsaw Pact military maneuvers in that area.

Yesterday's March 1 a.m. blizzard quickly turned into a lion to roared for the Manchester area.

Herman Passantelli, highway superintendent, said salting of roads began at 6 a.m. With about an inch on the ground at 10, he said the 13 hired plows were called in, and plowing started on the town's 25 routes shortly after 11.

At noon he reported plowing proceeding normally. "The powder snow comes off the roads easily," he said, "but with temperatures in the low 30s, it leaves it wet and 'greasy' underneath."

All public secondary schools closed at 1 p.m. All elementary school pupils going home for lunch were told not to return, and all others were dismissed.

Southern New England Telephone Co. said switchboard traffic was up 25 per cent, direct assistance (information) very heavy, but no unusual plant problems.

A spokesman for the sanitation department said garbage pickup trucks were still out at noon. Tomorrow's pickup will depend on when the storm ends, he said. Six inches or a foot may cause a cancellation.

Both fire departments reported things quiet. Although the police department confirmed the slippery road conditions.

Nixon Home from Europe; Sees Tour Building Trust

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon has returned from his five-nation sprint across Western Europe, confident that he has established a man-to-man relationship with allied leaders based on a new feeling of trust.

Nixon told the crowd of congressional leaders, administration officials and diplomats who greeted him in the snowy, freezing weather at nearby Andrews Air Force Base that his impression of the eight-day, 15,500-mile trip could be "summed up by the word trust."

"I sensed there was a new trust on the part of Europeans for the United States growing out of the fact that there are open channels with the United States," Nixon told the shivering crowd.

He went on: "I think there is developing a new trust in the future" based on allied confidence that "together we are going to be able to develop a better understanding with those who have opposed us on the other side of the world."

Top advisers who accompanied the President were tired but jubilant after the nine-hour flight home from Rome. They said the mission had set a new tone of confidence in allied capitals.

Nixon himself rested in the cabin of Air Force One during the final leg of a hectic sequence of travels, talks and ceremonies which began a week ago Sunday.

Like every day of the journey, Sunday was a long and tightly scheduled round of business. It was, because of the six-hour time difference between Rome

Court to Consider Strict School Guides

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court agreed today to consider imposing strict mathematical guidelines for breaking down segregated school faculties across the country.

The Justice Department and the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund had told the Court that school districts taking "adequate steps" to desegregate should be forced to shift teachers around so that all

Court to Consider Strict School Guides

The case comes from Montgomery county, Alabama, where a group of Negro families, with government assistance, won a ruling from federal judge Frank M. Johnson Jr. in February 1963 that established a "racial ratio" for teachers.

Johnson ordered the school board to assign to each school "substantially the same" ratio of Negro and white teachers as exists in the county.

The case then went to the U.S. Circuit Court in New Orleans where a 2-1 decision last August knocked out the proportional requirement and substituted for it a standard of "good faith and effective effort."

The circuit court said mathematical guidelines would not permit consideration of "the availability of teaching personnel, sound school administrative procedure and other important factors." The government and the Negroes, backed by the Fund, appealed to the Supreme Court.

The Justice Department's appeal said the Montgomery case concerns virtually all school desegregation cases, in the north as well as the south. It called the teacher ratio an "appropriate yardstick" for measuring whether a segregated school system has desegregated its faculty.

The Fund said elimination of the numerical ratio left the faculty desegregation objective so vague as to impair the ability of federal courts to assure substantial progress toward integration.

9th Day of VC Offensive Enemy Attacks Marine Base Near DMZ, Shells Saigon

SAIGON (AP)—Enemy troops attacked another U.S. Marine base below the demilitarized zone today and shelled Saigon and more than 30 other towns and allied bases in the ninth day of the Viet Cong's spring offensive.

Scores of North Vietnamese troops, blasting away with machine guns and rifles, attacked about 300 Marines at an artillery base four miles southeast of the DMZ. The Marines turned their artillery on the attackers, and the fighting was still going on seven hours after the first attack.

U.S. headquarters said at least 17 North Vietnamese and "some" Marines had been killed.

It was the fourth time since the enemy offensive began that heavy fighting had broken out just below the DMZ. The area had been relatively quiet since the Nov. 1 bombing halt.

Three 160-pound Soviet rockets hit Saigon, killing 12 Vietnamese civilians, wounding 29 others and wrecking more than 30 houses just before dawn. A South Vietnamese spokesman called the attack "savagely barbarous and bloodthirsty."

One of the six-foot missiles smashed into the ground three yards from a crowded children's hospital ward. The blast sprayed chunks of metal about, rashed through shutters and smashed mirrors and walls, but only one of the 72 children was injured. A 19-year-old girl got a slight cut on her head.

Another rocket tore through the roof of a house in a crowded residential area on the southern edge of the city, killing a family of nine and touching off fires that spread to more than 30 of the small, two-story tin-roofed houses. Three other civilians were killed and 25 wounded.

A third rocket hit the bank of the Saigon River at the foot of a main boulevard. Three civilians and a South Vietnamese soldier were wounded.

It was the third rocket attack on the capital city of three million residents since the offensive began Feb. 23. Two volleys of rockets 14 hours apart on the

Dayan's Rafi faction, which accounts for 22 per cent of the Labor party, has said it will not support Mrs. Meir.

Mrs. Meir, the 70-year-old former foreign minister, has said she is not anxious to accept because of her health, and it was not immediately known whether she would.

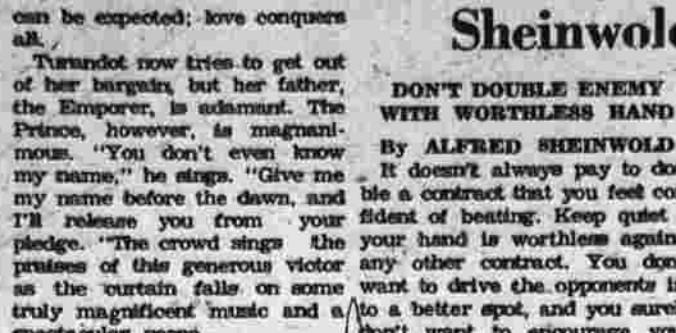
