The trouble has been that the courtsoften with the forgiving understanding of the executive and administrative branches of government too-have been very gentle in using the powers at their disposal. The real situation is that nobody ever seems to have the slightest intention of obeying the Taylor Law, and that nobody ever really intends to

Increasing its penalties alone, then, is respect given the Taylor law by either public employes or the courts. And a realistic view has to be that a Taylor Law which is not going to be enforced so that it is respected is worse than no anti-strike law at all.

We wish no such law were necessary We wish public employes in crucial fields had enough of a sense of obligation to their profession and to the public to make the writing of any such legislation

Apparently, we no longer have that kind of professional public employe. Apparently, we need a Taylor Law. Then. f we need it, we also need its enforcement, in a manner which does not allow anybody to treat its penalties, wherever they are set; as if they were some kind of pleasant joke, and never


