

Enterprising Oriental Turns Garbage to Building Blocks

By AKIHIBO SATO

TOKYO (AP) — Garbage may be garbage to other people, but to Kunitoshi Tezuka it's profitable junk.

His firm, Tezuka Kossan, has developed a machine that compresses garbage into rock-hard blocks that can be used for building foundations and road construction.

Designed to cope with the smowballing volume of garbage in cities and industrial centers, the machine crunches worn-out bicycles, washing machines and refrigerators as well as potato peels and paper into solid blocks that take up one-tifth the origi-

GOPs Vow Moratorium On Spending

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP) -Vowing to withdraw their own bills from consideration by the General Assembly, Republican legislators called Tuesday for a morntorium on state spending over present levels.

House Minority Leader Stewart B. McKinney said the idea of withdrawing GOP-Sponsored bills was suggested by Rep. Lil-lian Erb, R-Groton, whose proposed bills had called for \$18 million in spending. The move drew comment from Democratic State Chairman John M. Bailey, who said the tepublicans "are withdrawins bills which they couldn't get out

Usually Republican-sponsores bills do not win much favor in the General Assembly, which is controlled by Democrats. "Spending must be cut if the fantastic Democratic taxing program is to be cut," said Senat pority Leader Wallace Barne in a joint statement with Mc Kinney. House Republicans were unanimously behind the move. Mo-

Kinney said, but Barnes conce ed Senate Republicans were no Even Mrs. Erb would not withdraw all support from her till calling for \$6.7 million for planning and construction of a school in Groton. She said she still wants \$500,000 for planning. McKinney said GOP legisla tors may take the position that they favor the idea behind their bills, but that they feel the state cannot now afford additional expenditures while it is facing a budget deficit of more Manchester






