Beyond a terse announcement from Criminal Court Judge Preston Battle that the hearing had been granted and that newsmen accredited to cover the trial should arrive early, there was no official indication of what would happen.

The Huntsville, Ala., Times reported in Friday's editions that Ray, charged with murdering King, would plead guilty in exchange for a 59-year sentence instead of a possible death penalty.

The Times quoted what it called a source close to the case

as saying the guilty plea is "the only way. Ray can escape the death sentence."

"It's none of your business," replied Ray's lawyer, Percy Foreman of Houston, Tex., to a question on Friday's developments. State officials would say nothing. The hearing is set for 9:30

a.m., and newsmen accredited to cover Ray's trial scheduled April 7, were asked to come to press room facilities an hour and a half beforehand. Judge Battle had issued strict orders against pretrial publicity by any of the principals in the case—and has already held sev-eral persons in contempt of the order, among them two Mem-phis newsmen and Ray's biogra-pher, William Bradford Huise. When he tried, at his press conference the other night, to thread his way between meek and placid acceptance of anything the enemy did, and resh commitment to the extreme form of retaliation open to him, he was only oderately successful in retaining his own freedom of option. With the help of the news reports and the subsequent adlines, he was put on record as breatening the enemy with something.

The President may now, at this moment, be determining precisely what military escalation of the war we are going to undertake, if the verdict is that the enemy has already given sufficient The danger is that, by going back to

the game which drew Johnson and the nation ever deeper into an unwinnable situation in Vietnam, President Nixon may, against all his own better and more intelligent wishes, be yielding up all his own peace-making options.

It is, in any case, no easy decision, as might be illustrated by the fact that he, in spite of all his sure footwork on other hot issues of the time, did manage to get himself a little tangled up on this

Even if it had some real chance of working, it would still be a superfluous, dangerous thing for us to set our national will and treasury to.

Still, there are arguments being pressed in favor which have a certain inevitable appeal to any President in his position of great responsibility. The most insidious of these tempting arguments is that which is telling him that we need not really mean to go ahead with Sentinel, but that we must go through the motions of going ahead with it in order to present a tough bargaining position

The end result of this kind of decision would be almost the same as that of a direct decision to go ahead with Sentinel for its own sake. The dangerous appeal of this kind of decision is that it offers the President the chance to do something while pretending he really doesn't want to do it.

We hope he has the courage, and manages to find the phrasing, for putting the Sentinel up on the national shelf rather permanently, without any present

Snow Shovels, Old And New

he householder is still the snow shovel. And snow shovels, we are prepared t report, are not what they used to be Our own snow shovel, bought three or four years ago, is on the point of going to pieces. True; we have given it a hard workout this year - or perhaps it, on the other hand, has given us a hard workout — but certainly a snow shovel, which hangs untouched in the cellar for nine months out of every twelve, ough last longer than this one has, especial

Our snow shovel has a stainless stee blade with a heavier steel lip riveted to the leading edge. But, through use, two of the rivets have come out, the protective edge has been worn thin, and the blade itself is bent so that it no longer meets the sidewalk at the angle

Our acqueintance with snow shovely goes back more than half a century to a time when many a householder clear ed his walk with a wooden shovel, no the handlest implement, to be sure, but one which worked. As a boy we used a long-handled iron coal shovel for snow. It doubled admirably for both purposes. When the lip of the shovel curied from constant contact with the anthracite, the curl could be straightened out with ammer or cut off with a cold chisel Our present snow shovel admits of no

The angle at which the shovel meets the sidewalk is important if the opera-tor is to do an efficient job with a minimum of effort. Our present shovel, in this respect, is suffering from what we shall call malocclusion. The word re-minds us of a companion of our boyhood, long one of the town's leading dentists, who used to shovel the family sidewalk with a curious wire shovel The shovel was designed for use in indling ashes; it was both a shovel and a sifter. Those were the days when thrifty folk took the time and the pains to sift the ashes that fell through the grate in order to winnow out the coals

which had only partially burned. These coals were then fed once more into the maw of the furnace. This particular shovel was intended to let the finer ash fall through, while segregating the salvageable coal. As a snow shovel, the implement had the advantage of lightness, but it was effective only in a sticky, heavy mow. A light powder snow would fall between the wires just the way light ash would. All this talk about shovels prompts us to confess that given the proper implement, we rather enjoy shoveling - provided, that is, that the anow is not too heavy, that the temperature is not too low, that the wind is not too strong, or that we do not have to complete job too quickly.
