

Not Yet The Clean Ending

Earl Ray have to be evaluated from a rullty to the murder of the Rev. Dr. fartin Luther King, Ray has received

a sentence of 99 years. One question this raises is this: In this the right kind of punishment? Is t punishment enough? The answer would seem to be that it is. This answer comes, first, from what has become the nationwide reluctance in the past few years, to proceed to the actual execution of

And the second answer which would seem to may that what amounts to life mprisonment is punishment enough ould come, we think, from Dr. King almself, and all the theories and phipeophies by which he tried to live and lead. Nor do those who mourn him with most legitimacy express any dissatisfaction with the severity of the pun-

shment given Ray. The second question this disposition of the case raises is this: Does this disposition shut off what might have been a real chance of finding conspirators who merely used Ray as their tool? The answers to this question are not satisfactory. Both the prosecution and the defense attorneys say they are satisfied re was no conspiracy. But Ray himself still hints there may have been. And relatives and associates of Dr. King are talking as if they suspected there was a conspiracy, and as if they suspectthat what has gone of in the Tennessee court is, after all, just one more sample of white justice providing

protection for white criminals. The third question raised by this disposition of the case is this: Should not the public, in any case, be entitled to full knowledge of the facts in the crime? The loudest protest against the quick surprise closing of the case seems to come from newspapermen who cite a long and fascinating list of instances in which it would seem that Ray had to be operating with the assistance and perhaps under the direction of other people. Doesn't a nation have an obligation to itself, to its own troubles, and to its own future citisens to try to eliminate doubt and rumor and hearsay from the final version of an historic national crime?

The answer we would give would be yes, that a nation should try to develop those facts which would close the case against rumor and suspicion. Unfortunately, although there seem to be many circumstantial openings for suspicion that Ray had help or direction from others, there is still no evidence of a kind that could be preached in court. Would Ray have talked, if he had found himself going through a trial toward the death penalty? Or does keeping him alive represent the only real chance there is that he will ever disclose a conspiracy if there was one? Or is he going to talk, even now, for money, to the magazine willing to pay him enough?

So many questions left dangling give a sordid atmosphere to the disposition of a sordid crime. There is one surviving positive factor. Aside from the sentence which protects Ray's life, there is no element in the cast which is irretrievably closed. If there were conspirators they are still in danger. If there is a further more complete truth about this murder, it still has its chance to come out.
