Nixon Win Seen Close on ABM \$

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Nixon is confident that he will win approval from the Democratic Congress of a Sentinel missile system protecting the nation's deterrent punch rather than its cities. Majority Leader Mike Mansfield, who has been critical of the program, said Nixon now has the Senate votes to proceed with the \$6-billion to \$7-billion system the President wants to defend the U.S. offensive missile and bomber might. But, the Montana Democrat said, the picture could change before what shapes up as Nixon's first major confrontation with Congress—a vote likely to come in about two months on appropriations for the first phase. This will involve construction on two sites and procurement of 10 more. Administration sources also said a sampling of Senate positions showed enough votes. But they indicated the Senate would be the target of an all-out campaign of presidential persuasion. Missile Systems Top Item Disarmament Talks Reopen Next Week

GENEVA (AP) — The 17-nation disarmament conference reopens here Tuesday after a seven-month recess. It will be the first prolonged confrontation between top officials of President Nixon's administration and the Kremlin. The biggest priority in the proposed bilateral talks between the United States and the Soviet Union on limiting antimissile systems. The Soviet-led invasion of Czechoslovakia last August delayed the start of these negotiations, but an informed Western source said the international climate has sufficiently improved for such talks to get under way within a few months. President Nixon's decision to "substantially modernize" America's antiballistic missile shield and new Communist Chinese sabre-rattling along the Manchurian border could help get things moving. Both Westinghouse and Moscow believe the Chinese will be capable of launching long-range nuclear missiles within the next two years. The conference is almost certain to center on the American and Soviet missile systems. U.S. Army Gen. Ramsey Clark and Tennessee Gov. Buford Ellington occurred. Soviets Say Chinese Hit 2nd Border Post

MOSCOW (AP) — The Soviet Union charged today that Red Chinese troops attacked a Soviet Far East border post Friday and today, in the second series of bloody clashes in two weeks. A statement to the Chinese government, read over Moscow Radio said there were an unspecified number of dead and wounded. The official Soviet news agency Tass published the text of a Soviet protest to the Chinese government, read over Moscow Radio and saying that "Chinese troops were protecting the island" and "through measures adopted, the provocateurs were expelled from the island." Education Funds Cut Asked 'Lack of Leadership' Cited For Waterbury Racial Ills

WATERBURY, Conn. (AP) — This city of 100,000 was portrayed Friday as a potentially explosive community in which "a continual lack of leadership" has allowed the domination of four distinct racial hatreds. The portrayal comes in a report released Friday by the State Commission on Human Rights, which recommends that state education funds to Waterbury be cut off, and that an investigation be undertaken by the U.S. Attorney. The report is a product of a series of hearings the commission applauded the editorial writers of the Waterbury newspaper, the Republicans and the American, as exhibiting "perhaps the only real leadership" in sensitive areas. In response to the commission's report, school board president Salvatore Tavano indicated Friday night that withholding state funds would not help the situation. "Depriving Waterbury of money badly needed for the educational system," he said, "is not going to help correct any problems that allegedly exist. It (See Page Fourteen)

Nixon Spearheading Drive To Cool Campus Violence

By DON GREIDORFER The Washington Post WASHINGTON — With the President in personal charge, the Nixon administration has undertaken a new program to discourage violent and unlawful tactics in campus protests. Some scattered aspects of this drive have come to light in the past two weeks. According to White House officials, additional moves are likely. At the moment, the White House is weighing the question of a presidential statement or speech on the topic. Last May, Mr. Nixon characterized the disorders at Columbia University as "both a national tragedy and a national disgrace" and during the presidential campaign last fall, he urged that universities expell any student whose protests in "right stand" against campus disorders and condemning a "small, irresponsible minority" of students involved. As he had before, Mr. Nixon suggested that anyone rejecting "the rule of reason" for the "rule of force" would be expelled. The next step, mentioned in the letter to Father Hesburgh, was assignment of Vice President Agnew to counsel the nation's governors about possible federal and state steps to cope with disorders on campus. Agnew discussed the matter with the governors Feb. 27 and later said he was soliciting their views about the delicate problem of government intervention on the campus. White House sources said Agnew's work with the governors on this topic is continuing. 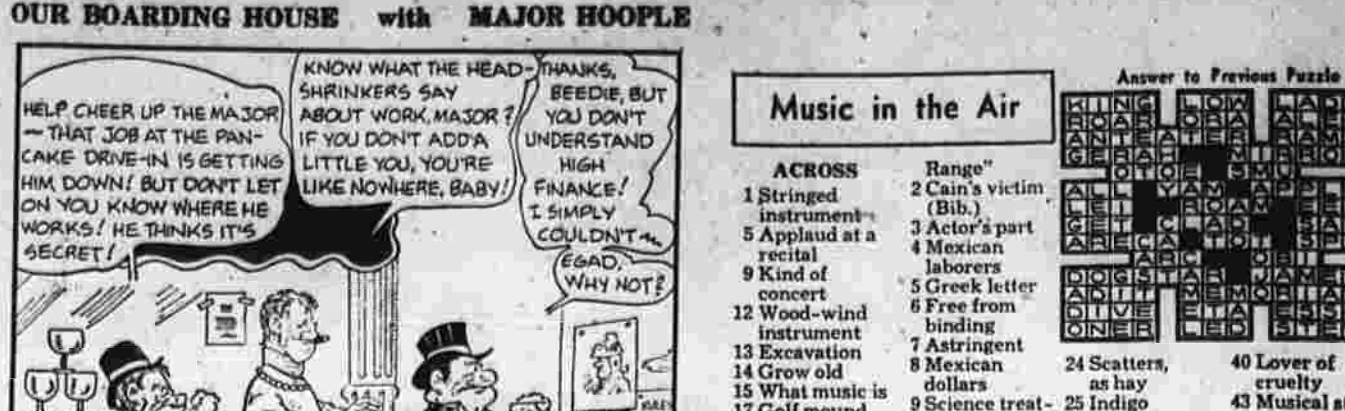

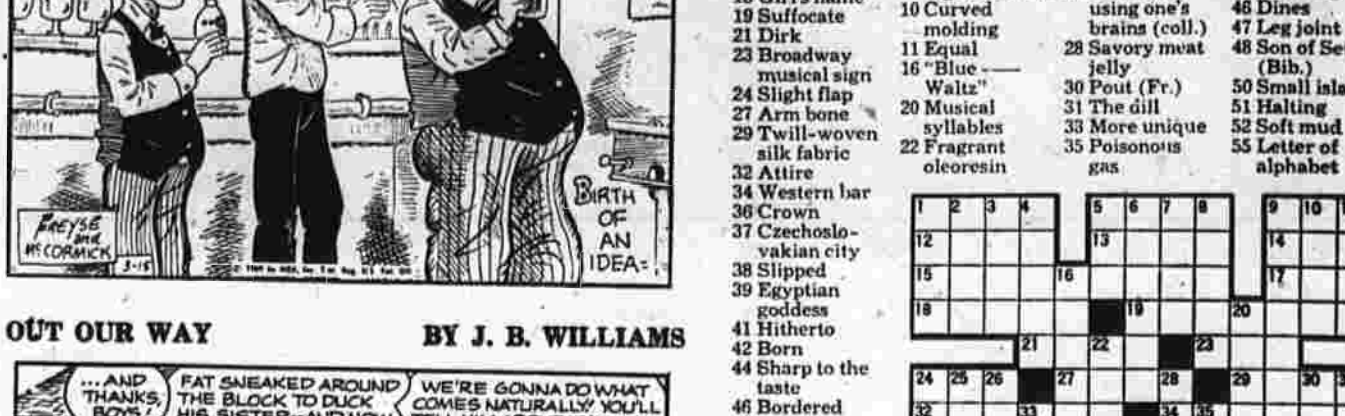

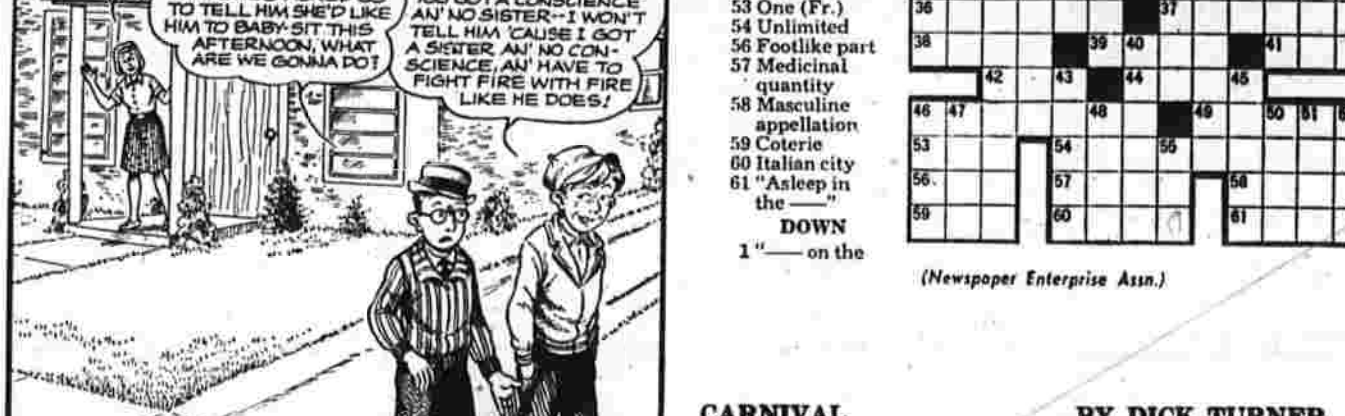

Woman of 'Dark Shadows'

NEW YORK (AP) — "I believe women are capable of anything," declares Leia Swift, director of the daily television suspense-show 'Dark shadows,' who has proved her own capability by becoming one of the few female directors in the medium.

It wasn't easy, admits the diminutive brown-eyed blonde, even though she got in on the ground floor in 1946 when television was just beginning.

That was in 1961 and even then she was urged to become a casting director instead.

"You know," she remarks with a touch of pride in her voice, "I never have directed a cooking show."

She as an Edgar from the Mystery Writers of America and was awarded an Emmy for a series of women's specials.

"I'm a terrifically high energy person," says the 5-foot-2 dynamo as she sits quietly for a moment in the living room of her Manhattan apartment which she is decorating herself.

The daughter of Russian immigrants, Miss Swift grew up in Manhattan and while still in Hunter College was selling scripts to radio stations.

Later she free-lanced, working on NBC programs.

"They'd never seen a woman director before. Finally they got accustomed to me but I worked straight through my pregnancy and that set them back—a woman, all right, but a pregnant woman—my God! Anyhow they treated me like in the 1890s."

She has been with "Dark Shadows," telecast from 4 to 4:30 p.m. EST Monday through Friday on ABC, since its start in June 1966.

She attributes the success of the program to its unique supernatural slant.

She feels women aren't encouraged to try to become TV directors but sees no reason why they shouldn't tackle it.

"The best way to start," she advises, "is from the bottom. Try to get any job with a show, even as a secretary, and you can work your way up from there. And," she adds thoughtfully, "get yourself a good housekeeper."

Next Season: More Talk, More Sex

NEW YORK (AP) — The television network schedules for next fall are going to offer more talk, more sex and less violence.

The three networks each put together packages with heavy emphasis on comedy, variety and drama.

Shows high in gunplay and fist-fights will be in short supply next season. Not a single new Western will be introduced in the fall and only four will remain.

On tap are four new variety shows, 10 comedies and eight shows loosely categorized as drama.

The talk is to fill up the time formerly occupied by actors knocking each other about. And the sex is to perk up the interest when the talk begins to pall.

Actually, television is not

going to go all the way down the path taken by the movies. The sex is going to be talked about, hinted at and joked about.

At the top of this list undoubtedly will be ABC's 'The Survivors,' which its creator Harold Robbins says will make bold use of sex. This 'novel for television' will chronicle the jet set Robbins has written about in such best sellers as 'The Carpetbaggers' and 'The Adventurers.'

Following it on Monday nights on ABC will be 'Love American Style,' with only one continuing character—a large brass bed. It will tell two to four separate love stories each week.

Underscoring the fact that television is indeed cyclical are three medical dramas. One of them, ABC's 'Marcus Welby, M.D.,' was created by David Victor, who produced 'Dr. Kildare' in the heyday of medical shows. It will be about a family doctor.

The other entries, CBS's 'Medical Center' and NBC's 'New Medicine,' will be hospital oriented.

An interesting footnote to the NBC show is that it will alternate Sunday nights with a court room drama called 'The Whole World Is Watching' and a police show called 'Deadlock.'

The tentative title for the alternating series is 'The New People,' but that may be changed to avoid a conflict with ABC's 'The New People.'

'The New People,' created by Rod Serling, is about a group of young people who set up a new society on an island after their plane crashes—a combination of 'Lord of the Flies' and 'Wild in the Streets.'

The reason for the trend to comedy, variety and drama—and the demise of so many action — adventure shows is obvious. The networks are under pressure from Washington and from critics to eliminate violence.

In recent days Sen. John O. Pastore, D-R.I., chairman of the

Senate Communications subcommittee, warned that if television "doesn't exercise restraint, drastic action will be taken." And Robert H. Finch, secretary of health, education and welfare, said he hoped to begin an investigation of whether violence poses a health hazard to children.

New Summer Shows Planned by ABC

ABC, the network which in past summers has depended almost entirely on re-runs of winter shows, will try another tack this year. If it works, it might start something with the competition.

Beginning in May, ABC will introduce a number of new network series and also reshuffle the time periods of many others. The network estimates that about one-third of its hot weather offerings will consist of new material—new series or old series with fresh shows.

Included in the plan are Dick Cavett's three-a-week series in prime time; A weekly variety hour starring Johnny Cash, and another with John Davidson. ABC's assortment of evening game and audience participation shows will continue with new programs—customary in those categories—and so will "This Is Tom Jones" and "The King Sisters," both late-season starters.

Meanwhile, "Peyton Place," after all those agonizing years, will go into limbo with its final show in early June. Repeats of "The Guns of Will Sonnett" will occupy its old time spot until September, when it, too, goes to TV's Boot Hill.

Cavett's show—from 10 to 11 p.m. EST on Mondays, Tuesday and Friday—will replace "The Big Valley," "That's Life" and "Judd for the Defense." The first two have been canceled. "Judd," which returns next season, moves to an earlier time period on Friday nights.

ABC's second season, in general, has not worked out very well. "Turn On" which opened and closed in one night, established some kind of a TV record. "What's It All About, World?"—officially renamed "The Dean Jones Variety Hour" as of March 27—departs early in May. "Generation Gap" will slip away as quietly as it arrived. The shows, for the most part, produced dismal Nielsen ratings. "This Is Tom Jones" and "Let's Make a Deal," which have survived, haven't really done much better than the drop-outs.

There will be re-runs, of course, and they are mostly dramatic shows and situation comedies that will return next season. With production costs climbing higher each year, repeat shows are almost an economic necessity to amortize show budgets.

It is highly unlikely, however pleasant it would be for audiences, that NBC and CBS will follow ABC's lead. ABC alone will bring in more new programs next season than the other two networks combined. So on two network channels there will be the usual variety show replacements—and an occasional British import like "The Saint" but mostly it will be just another summer of twice-told tales.
