Again, The Mild Approach?

Nixon got back from Europe e would be facing two major decisions hich might prove, in a way, the symcolic end of the opening period of his pothing talk, but merely preparation for actual policy and decimon.

One of the insues waiting decision was he disposition of the Sentinel anti-missile ystem to which the Johnson Administracision of the President, when it was made, was a sort of sidle. He cut down he proportions of the Johnson Adminisation proposal, so that the initial exenditure will now be only some six or billions. He discounted, in a healthy way, the possibility that we could nuclear war. But he gave the military the start of a program which, by normal erience, may proceed to grow and expand until it is bigger and better, or igger and worse, than anything the ohnson Administration considered.

The second major decision which seemed to be forcing itself upon President Nixon concerned the question of military retaliation, in Vietnam, for alleged violations, by the Vietcong, of the understandings on which our cessation of the bombing of North Vietnam had been announc-

In the first press conterence in which he discussed this issue, President Nixon said that the enemy had committed techabout attacks on Saigon, but that he himself was more sharply concerned with the increase in American casualties, and that both considerations would be in his mind as he determined what, if any, retalistory action would be taken.

In these remarks, President Nixon came close to binding himself to a theory that there is some practical aggressive military response to a situation in which casualties happen to run high. This seems related to the premise on which President Johnson first took the war to North Vietnam, in punitive retaliation for letcong rocket raids in South Vietnam. And it was, then, at least, the theory which led to all the casualties which have since made this one of the major wars in this nation's history.

At his most recent press conference, President Nixon was again holding to the idea that he might have the responsibility to wage a wider and fiercer war in order to respond to increased American casualties. But he declined to be specific about what his military action might be, contenting himself with the tough-sounding statement that "It will be my policy as President to issue a warning only once."

Although this sounded tough, there have been Washington reports that President Nixon was, nonetheless, taking diplomatic pains to see that Hanol heard s warning more than once, this time through the possible offices of Soviet Russia. And there have been other Washington reports that, although the President was talking tough, he and all his aides were steering speculation as far as they could from such a drastic possibility as any resumption of the bombing of North Vietnam. What the President said, in this last

press conference, was that "enything that in the future is done will be done," without additional warning and apparently without accompanying statements. That suggests that, when we look at the current headlines from Vietnam, and see that United States Marines and armored vehicles entered the demilitarized zone between North and South Vietnam for a sharp three hour skirmish with the enemy, then retiring to their own original base outside the zone, we may se seeing part, or perhaps even all, of resident Nixon's military retaliation to hose current enemy operations which seem contrary to the spirit of talking peace at Paris.


