

Nixon's Vote Reform Proposals n the business of electing our Prestlents are proposals located in a middle ground where, in our opinion, any reform action should stay.

It is easier to believe in such a simple, democratic thing as this, that the candidate who receives the largest popular vote should be elected President. than it is to devise any direct election system which would not be exposed to even greater dangers of national paretysis than anything that could develop under the present Electoral College systern. All one has to do is imagine a close election coming down to a disputed count in the precincts of Chicago, or Mississippl, or even the count in anybody's home

We do not believe the Electoral College system should be abolished for any attempt to institute the direct popular vote election of the President, in which the whole country would be, in effect. one vast voting district, with irregularity, confusion or corruption anywhere capable of invalidating the total result.

stay with the Electoral College system, but make what seem to us reasonable and practical proposals for guarding against its present imperfections and

First, the President would remove the silly hangover of the original idea that elected to exercise his own best judgment in the selection of a President rather than to express the will of the people who had elected him.

Second, the President would move toward the popular vote principle by having the electoral vote of each individual state distributed, among the various Presidential candidates, in proportion to the popular vote registered for them in each individual state. This would make the popular vote the final determinant inside each individual state of how that state's electoral votes should be cast. But by declaring 53 state and District of Columbia results instead of just one nation-wide popular vote result, it would have a better chance of escaping the universal and endless dispute and ligitation which might otherwise accompany a direct popular vote election which had turned out to be uncomfort-

Third, President Nixon suggests, in order to avoid the possibility which loomed so large part way through the returns last November, that a 40 per cent plurality of the electoral vote be made, in any contest between three or more candidates, sufficient for election of a President. This would avoid the present danger that any three-way race might be thrown into the House of Representatives, with results completely opposite to the trend of the election itself, or with unspeakable power handed to some third party demagogue who might try to sell his electoral votes to highest

Beyond that, the President suggests provision for a run-off election between the two top candidates, in case no candidate receives at least 40 per cent of the electoral vote. Mr. Nixon's suggestion for the character of this run-off election rather calmly accepts the same dangers he went to such pains to avoid in his formula for the regular election. He would, in this run-off, have it a straight popular vote election, which could have all the danger of coming down to some corrupt precinct we have previously described. It would be better to have the run-off a repetition of regular election procedure, with the field

No Joy From Bengal

The West used to say, with a smugness not always grounded in fact, that Communists never win a free election. But the West may not have too much reluctance to concede the Communists the latest sample of a free election they

In the state of Bengal, India, Communist forces scored a dramatic upset victory in the February election. But the extent to which this annoys the West should be reduced by a study of the extent to which it fails to please

The situaton was that the Communist victory in Bengal was shared by two Communist and one fellow-traveler parties. Russia couldn't manage much staneous for in the victory because the party which labeled itself pro-Soviet ran third. And Communist China wasn't very happy, either, because the party which ran best in the victory had apparently achieved some of its popularity in India by turning against the same brand of Chinese Communism by which had originally been founded. In summary, then, a spectacular Communist election victory in a vitally important Indian state leaves both Mos-

ow and Peking unhappy. That is perhaps the key explanation o the so-called Communist victory—that, in order to achieve it, the Indian Communists involved had to make it plain that their purposes and principles were more Indian than either Russian or Chinese. And if Communist parties are going to turn increasingly nationalistic and idvidualistic in tone and principle in order

to do better at the polls that alters, to some extent, the premise on which the West used to tell itself that Communism could never win outside Russia. It can win, but the more it does the less it seems like the real, undefiled article envisoned by Marx.
