### Tolland County Drug Bill Submitted By St. Onge

A bill calling for the establishment of a Drug Abuse Education Act was submitted to Congress today by Second Congressional Rep. William St. Onge.

The drug education act would provide federal funds to encourage and develop drug education programs both in the schools and seminars and in the training of teachers and development of curriculum.

The act was drafted with the advice of key federal agencies, including the Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs and the National Institute of Mental Health. Private groups including the National Education Association were also consulted.

"Drug Abuse" seminars could be established in communities under the terms of the bill using federal aid. Communities could also use the funds to develop and evaluate new drug education curricula and establish demonstration projects for drug abuse education.

A key section, according to St. Onge, would make funds available to permit additional law enforcement personnel, and community officials to participate in short-term or summer institutes at colleges with courses on drug education.

The bill calls for expenditures of \$10 million for the program over the next two years.

St. Onge expressed optimism over the bill chances for passage, noting hearings on the bill have already been tentatively scheduled. He is co-sponsoring the bill with Congressman Lloyd Meade of Washington and "L.E.D." methuam, barbiturates, amphetamines and even heroin are circulating among more and more youngsters," St. Onge stated. "They do not learn of the effects of these dangerous drugs until it is too late."

"Our educational systems must focus attention on this extremely serious health and social problem," he emphasized.

"Federal and state law enforcement officers are continuing their hard-hitting efforts to crack down on the drug traffic," he continued. "But our schools and communities must help parents and students learn more about dangerous drugs."

"With knowledge and restraint perhaps we can avoid the many future tragedies which can create a nightmare for many young lives," he said.

### Vernon Board Votes Teachers' Workshops

Proposals for summer curriculum workshops and in-service training programs in four subject areas, at a cost of \$14,700, were approved by the Board of Education this week.

The programs are all on the elementary level, from kindergarten through Grade 8. Lynn Anderson, who is mathematics coordinator, explained that the purpose of the in-service training programs is to bring teachers up to date on new methods and new ideas as well as working with new textbooks.

He said that before a new curriculum is worked out in a summer workshop, he would like to first utilize the in-service training for all of his teachers. He would like them to receive credit for this program to provide incentive.

Albert Smith, board member, favored releasing time instead of after school time, noting if the program was held outside of school hours and credits given it would ultimately cost the town money when a teacher's salary for another step on the salary scale.

Two ways were suggested for running the in-service program. If by released time, it would involve eight afternoon sessions during the year. This would provide each teacher with two meetings with each of the four curriculum coordinators.

These coordinators are Miss Lucille Kuhnly, science; Anderson, Math; Elaine Girard, language arts; and James Norwood, social studies.

An alternative would be to hold 18 sessions of two-hour duration, accomplished on the teacher's own time for credits. Girard cautioned the board that no subject area today is stagnant and can afford to lapse. He said he would like a review every three years.

The estimated costs of each subject area for the workshops, including personnel, consultant services and supplies would be: Science, \$4,800; social studies, \$3,800; language arts, \$2,600 and math in-service \$1,115.

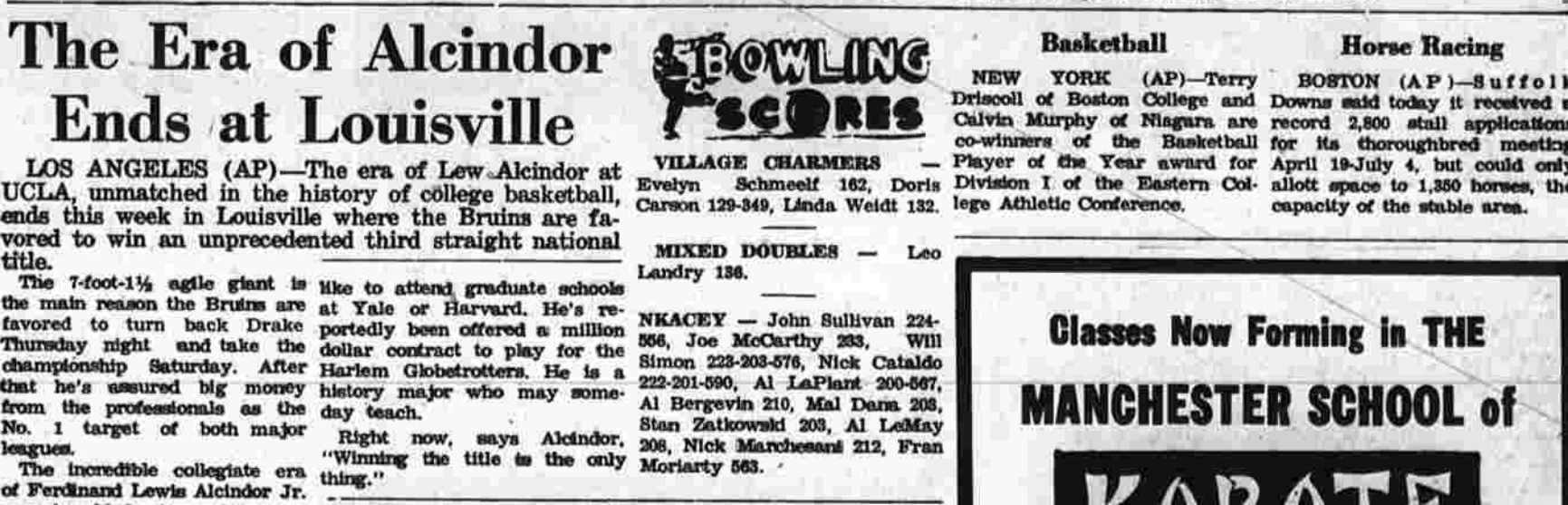
