





In short, Baker has collected, and has recorded without bias or emotion, all aspects of the famous writer's day to day life.



Fish Eating Increases

We don't know what the comparative consumption by members of various religions would be in the statistics, but somebody has begun eating more fish in the two and a half years that have passed since the Roman Catholic Church rescinded its rule that U.S. Catholics eat no meat on Friday.

This requirement is not easy to attain nor is it easy to offer specific remedies for the maladies because so many go back to ancient hang-ups. But Gardner has urged that "we must ask people to participate in the larger purposes of heir community, and we must design the community so that such participation s possible." If faith in existing instituions is low "there can be nothing more healing for men than to participat directly in the reshaping of the institu tions that no longer enjoy their confid-

While Gardner reiterated some of the student complaint about society, he cited the dangers of the "tantrum" style of confrontation. "The provoking of fear i dangerous form of brinkmanship," he
