De Gaulle's Broadcast Appeal Set

PARIS (AP) — President Charles de Gaulle is to broadcast to the nation tonight in hopes of reversing the tide of public opinion threatening him with defeat in Sunday's constitutional referendum.

He arranged his affairs so that he will be at his home in Colombey-les-2-Eglises in eastern France during the broadcast and during the balloting. This meant he would not have to return to Paris in the event of defeat.

"Advantage to the No's," said the headline on the report of an opinion poll. "Soundings Show No's in the Lead," said another. It was the first time since De Gaulle became president in 1958 that pre-selection polls indicated he would lose. The unfavorable indicators included two taken by traditional Gaullist optimists: the government and the conservative newspaper Le Figaro.

Lebanese Premier Resigns over Split

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) — Premier Rashid Karamei met today with President Charles Helou and told newsmen afterward Helou had accepted his resignation. He pledged when asked if the president would ask him to form a new Cabinet but he urged that a coalition government be formed.

Karamei resigned Thursday night after four months in office, saying the country was split over whether Lebanon should become a base for Arab guerrilla action against Israel. Karamei was asked after his visit to Helou if the president would try him again. He replied: "The question of the guerrilla is now more important than personalities. It concerns the future and the fate of the entire country. There must be cooperation between all persons."

With the country tense after two days of rioting in which 100 persons have been killed and nearly 100 wounded, Karamei told a special session of Parliament that some persons advised him to give unequal support to the Palestinian guerrillas. He said others warned such support would provoke Israeli reprisals.

The rioters were mostly Palestinian refugees demanding that the government give full support to the Arab guerrilla organizations which have been raising Israel. Karamei said he had tried to help the guerrillas without endangering Lebanon's security. Despite pressure from the 160,000 refugees in the country, the government generally has tried to avoid involvement in the Arab-Israeli fighting.

Spilled Chemicals Imperil Area

RICHMOND, Ind. (AP) — Mostly piled in three heaps, a liquid leaking from an upside-down tank car exploded periodically. A burning tank car of soybean oil sent up a column of smoke visible for miles along main east-west artery U.S. 40, which was blocked.

Seeks To Upset Ruling Permitting Union Fines

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Sam J. Ervin, R-N.C., proposed legislation today to upset Supreme Court decisions permitting unions to fine members.

Ervin tried without success last year to win approval of a similar measure.

In a recent decision, he said the Supreme Court ruled it is not an unfair labor practice for a union to impose a fine for exceeding union-set production quotas.

Ervin said this is "the same as an un-imposed quota on the amount of money a man can earn."

Head Start Study Gets Low Marks from Finch

WASHINGTON (AP) — A controversial \$44,000 study of the anti-poverty program's Head Start project has received bad marks from Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare Robert H. Finch.

Finch told the House Education and Labor Committee Thursday the study was based on sloppy data and should be considered by the Westinghouse Learning Corp. before the government accepts it.

Finch said the Nixon administration decided to emphasize full-year Head Start programs for the young rather than summer programs as recommended by the study. "This had been confirmed by other sources," Finch said.

Czechs Clear AP Reporter Of Espionage

VIENNA (AP) — William N. Oatis, onetime Associated Press correspondent in Prague, and two Czechoslovak translators employed by him in Prague in 1961, were cleared of espionage charges and fully rehabilitated today in a special session of the Prague Municipal Court.

The Czechoslovak news agency CTK said the senate annulled the verdict of July 4, 1961, both as to the guilt and sentences. "As the accusations of espionage leveled against William Oatis, Tomas Svoboda and Petr Mrazek were found not to have been based on facts."

Oatis, who is now working for the Associated Press in New York, was sentenced to 10 years, Svoboda to 20 years and Mrazek to 14 years of imprisonment.

Oatis' activities in following the normal work as a reporter were cited to convict him. He was released from prison in 1963. The Czechoslovak government said it was moved to free him by a letter Oatis' wife Lurabelle had written to the Czechoslovak president in November 1962.

CTK said testimony of Svoboda and other documents including a report from the regional prosecutor's office to the prosecutor general of Dec. 3, 1966 proved that the so-called espionage group was artificially created under orders from L. Kopriva, then minister of national security.

It added the minister gave orders to obtain admission of guilt of all the accused within 14 days, in order to have a reason for closing down The Associated Press office in Prague. Though the security authorities had no legal basis for court proceedings.

Fairfield U Ends Threat of Strike In Compromise

FAIRFIELD, Conn. (AP) — The threat of a student strike at Fairfield University was ended early today when students agreed to accept a compromise agreement worked out with school officials.

The compromise liberalizes regulations on liquor in dormitories and hours when students may have female guests in their rooms, but does not go as far as many students had hoped.

Students will be allowed to consume liquor in dormitories from Thursday midnight to Sunday midnight and on evenings before school holidays. If the liquor is purchased in compliance with state law, students may have liquor in their rooms 24 hours a day.

Most of the 1,700 students are under the state's legal drinking age—21.

The students will be allowed female guests in dormitories on Friday and Saturday from 2 p.m. to 10 p.m. to midnight, and on Sundays from 12 p.m. to 10 p.m.

The compromise was reached at a meeting during the afternoon and evening Thursday between school officials and student representatives.

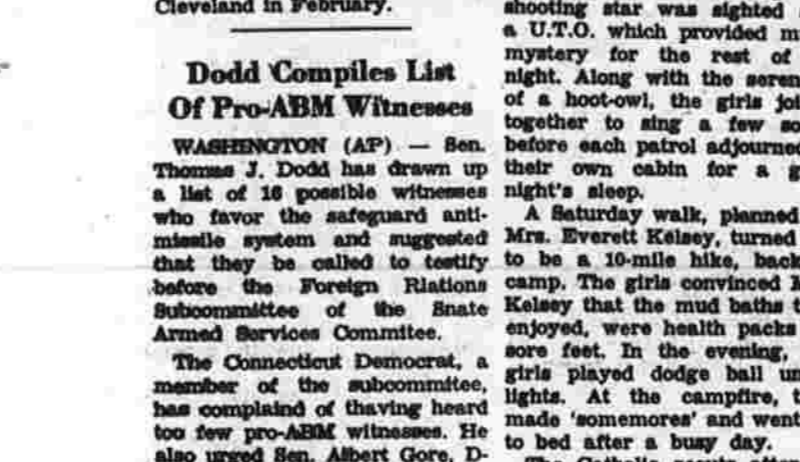

Vernon Town Board Votes Mayor Salary Hike

A motion made by George Riley to return the education budget for a \$500,000 cut was withdrawn after discussion at a special meeting of the Board of Representatives last night.

The meeting scheduled for tonight will not be held as the mayor was unable to get a quorum of the board. The next meeting is scheduled for Monday night.

Although the Board of Education budget was not on last night's agenda, it was discussed briefly at the close of the meeting. Representative Peter Humphrey said he would like to see a breakdown of the 83 per cent of the education budget that the board said is "fixed costs."

Starting the discussion on a request for a \$1,000 increase in the mayor's salary, bringing it to \$40,000, Thomas McCusker questioned what warranted the \$1,000 increase in addition to the request for an increase in the expenses. He suggested that the mayor take a cut in salary and put the workload where it belongs, on the director of administration. He noted that the charter was not made up to increase the workload of the mayor.

Humphrey said he wanted to discuss the mayor's salary with out considering any particular person. He said the original salary of the mayor was \$35,000 and this was supposed to cover expenses and "headaches," but he indicated it is a worth while salary proposition.

Representative Sam Pearl termed the increase request a "pretty pat" business in the face of "this budget."

The expenses increased by about \$600. The total request of \$2,200 includes \$200 for the town's share of the CRERC budget, \$400 for the Connecticut Conference of Mayors, \$1,200 for the annual report and \$1,000 for the mayor's attendance at conferences and seminars, national and state.

A request for a full-time purchasing agent was deleted by the mayor before the budget went to the board. Mayor Grant explained he cut the position because he felt he had to hold the line on hiring new people.

Pathet Lao Troops Kill U.S. Worker

VIENTIANE, Laos (AP) — An American aid worker was ambushed and killed by pro-Communist Pathet Lao troops Thursday in southern Laos.

A U.S. Embassy spokesman said today an international voluntary service worker, Chandler Scott Edwards, was killed when the Pathet Lao scored a direct hit on his jeep with a recoilless rifle from an ambush.

A Laotian district officer's wife and a young girl were also killed. Four other Laotians in the jeep were wounded.

Witnesses said Edwards was thrown from the jeep by the blast. Then Pathet Lao troops emerged from cover and pumped bullets into his body.

The spokesman said Edwards was driving to Champassak from Boum Keo village after delivering building supplies furnished by U.S. aid for Boum Keo school.

Edwards, 23, of Telford, Tenn., had served 21 months in Laos. He was the third American aid worker killed by the Pathet Lao in the past two years.

Edwards' death was the latest in a series of mounting Pathet Lao attacks on roads. The increase in terrorism this dry season was attributed to a Pathet

SAIGON (AP) — Three police officers, one a U.S. military policeman, were wounded tonight by a bomb that exploded in a tree near their passing jeep in the northern part of Saigon.

The three, a combined police patrol composed of the American, a Korean soldier and a South Vietnamese policeman, were wounded as they sped to investigate the explosion of another bomb 10 minutes earlier near an electrical transformer station.

Associated Press photographer Nick Ut reported from the scene that none was seriously wounded. The bomb that detonated near them was mounted on a tree about 20 yards from the scene of the first explosion. There was no damage to the transformer station.
