Abram On The Revolution

merica grows more and more strident, and university officials and alumni are ced under greater and greater strain, erely to know what they really think shout all that is going on, there is one university president, who has already been through one campus storm, and who manages to talk about it in a post-

He is President Morris Abram of randels University. In addition to having to deal with a 10-day occupation of his own university's communications center last winter, President Abram has been visiting other campuses. His pronouncement is that this country

is in the midst of a genuine revolution, after which it will never egain be quite the same. We will never again, says he, "have the same sorry set of national standards

nor will we ever again look on war with the same attitude." The students, he says, are in the very eye of this revolutionary storm.

"They have absorbed well the ideals we have taught them," says President Abram. "What they are demanding now is that we put these ideals into practice." President Abrem puts our students into ree classifications, as follows:

"There are the black students, who mear a bag of grievances most of un can sympathize with and who at least know what they want: an environment in which they can feel comfortable

"Then there are the destroyers, who my there will be no peace or reason r campuses until there is peace and eason throughout the world. They tell me they are not interested in the substance of their demands but are probing into our moral blubber to see if there is any backbone.

"And finally there are the majority of students, who are deeply idealistic and are easily swayed by appeals to these ideals. I believe they may be the first group of youths in our history that has been willing to be true citizens of a world without boundaries or class." Thus the positive view of one univer-

But, although it may be positive, it is not totally permissive.

President Abram is dedicated to the preservation of a liberal society. He wants to have the good parts of the student revolution absorbed by the processes and rules of reason. He wants his free and liberal society to remain able to reject those portions of the stuent revolution which would wreck the procedures and the modes through which a liberal society renews itself."

President Abram himself has named and described that student minoritythe destroyers—who would rather battle and kill his liberal tolerance of revolution than engage the ultra conservatives who openly and completely condemn the same revolution. But it is in the faith and courage with which this and other university presidents, faculties, and alumni can hold to their ideals of change hrough process that the future of the American university depends, just as the fate of the nation itself also depends on the possibility that our present revolution can be real, and result in great change, and still be kept within the processes of a free society.

### The Sirhan Sentence

Not for two years, anywhere in these io states, has any state taken the life of a human being in an execution cham-ber. In the State of California, the soalled death row has a list of some 80 ants, who could make a fine wholeale execution if the state should make any firm decision to head back toward the use of capital punishment. In the State of Tennessee, the confessed mur-derer of Dr. Martin Luther King is under ntence of life inprisonment.

Such factors make necessary the hope that Sirhan B. Sirhan, the murderer of Senator Robert F. Kennedy, will never be made the victim of the sentence noted out to him by his California jury.

That Luggage Anxiety

The statistic on air travel luggage is that about 1.5 per cent of it gets misandled. That meens that in 1968 some 2,000,000 passengers, or about one of every 75 passengers, had the experience of having their baggage lost. That is, as the airlines acknowledge,

too high a rate. And it is, as some air travelers a ways seem especially fated to discover, while others zip themselves hither and yon with never a hitch of any kind, the biggest headache connected with air

Even when baggage am't lost, at can sometimes take as long as a flight itself.

We seem to have a civilization that is like that — one that can streak through the skies at unbelievable speeds in unbelievable percentages of safety, and yet one that is unbelievably slow in devising some system which can make the jetage passenger feel secure about his own

dollars and hire some of our brilliant scientific minds and put them to the task of catering to the incidental human comforts and the precious mental securities without which any kind of journey cannot rise above the level of ordeal, no matter how high and fast the flight itself may be.

U.S. Not A Christian Nation

The fundamental problem, as I see it, is that whereas some 70 per cent of the American people are counted on the rolls of our many religious bodies, we are not at all the "Christian" nation we like to think we are but essentially a secular one. That is to say, our value system as people derives not from the Christian cospel but from secular society. The paradox, however, is that most church people do not know this, and if someone tells them, they don't believe it. Our churches are so comfortably domesticated in the American culture that they can operate with little sense of tension or contradiction between what they are do-

ing as Christians and what they stand One of the most obvious aspects of American religious life is that the churches are notably lacking in discipline, the kind of commitment that defines genuine disciples of Jesus Christ in the Biblical sense. According to reported statistics we now have around 125,000,000 members -for bragging puroses. We carmot begin to locate all of hem. The leakage, in some cases, runs ao high as 30 per cent. Of those whom we can locate, we cannot count on more than half to be in public worship on any given Sunday morning. Of these "Sunday morning Christians" fewer than 50 per cent will be active in the program of the local church, and of those who

are active a painfully small fraction will be living disciplined lives of Christian obedience in home and office, market and factory, school and play. My judgment as an historian is that authentic Christianity has always been a minority movement; and to use the name "Christian" or the undisciplined masses who

are little more than practitioer of culture religion is to confuse the meaning If you doubt what I am saying look at the reluctance of rank-and-file church members to seek a redemptive role amid the welter of moral crises that are literally tearing apart the fabric of humanity in our day. An American aid worker was ambushed and killed by procommunist Pathet Lao troops Thursday in southern Laos.

A U.S. Embassy spokesman said today an international voluntary service worker, Chandler Scott Edwards, was killed when the Pathet Lao scored a direct hit on his jeep with a recoilless rifle from an ambush. A Laotian district officer's wife and a young girl were also killed. Four other Laotians in the jeep were wounded.


Witnesses said Edwards was thrown from the jeep by the blast. Then Pathet Lao troops emerged from cover and pumped bullets into his body.






