





Apollo 11 will carry the drama to its

final step. This time the module will set itself down on the moon's surface, and discharge its pilots, and they, and we, will have to negotiate their return into their own module, their lift-off from the moon's surface, their reunion with the command ship, and, again, the command ship's final kick out of the moon orbit and into the big slide back down Some of us earth observers will be

To some of us, not even the most routine repetition of actionless minute after minute into perhaps hours of something that might be called space nothingness and boredom can muster any real calm or reassurance. We still find it difficult to believe that man, even with computers, can do any such complicated out of this world thing with any such degree of safety. We still do not quite believe a single second of it. And there, we think, lies one of our great causes for gratitude to the astronauts - not that they are giving us the moon, at last, for the first time in history - but that they give us back some of the naive, innocent, healthy wonder the first man must have felt when he first saw the moon up there.

Sunday Drinking The swirgers are in control in the House, as evidenced by the roll call vote of 82-76, approving a bill that would allow liquor to be served an hour later Sunday mornings. The bars are now closed by law at 1 a.m. Sunday and the bill would pro'ong the drinking hours another 60 minutes, until 2 a.m.

One argument advanced was that Connecticut restaurents and taverns lose where the bars stay open later. Also that by keeping the Connecticut booze joints open later, Connecticut residents intent on drinking would not have to travel on the highways and risk their necks driving home. This is the height of sophistry. A man who leaves the bar at 2 a.m., if he is intoxicated, can just as easily find himself in trouble within

the borders of his own community. What is the magical number of 2 a.m.? As long as they're extending the hours, why not make it 3 a.m. or 5 a.m.? For some people, there's no reasonable cut-

It is obvious that some of the support for extending the hours is based on a consideration for the tavern owners who are "losing business" to the late states. If the supporters of extended hours are so worried about losing business, why are they so reluctant to lower the drinking age in Connecticut from 21 to 18? When the 18-year-olds travel to Port Chester, where drinks are served to 18-year-olds, aren't Connecticut bars
