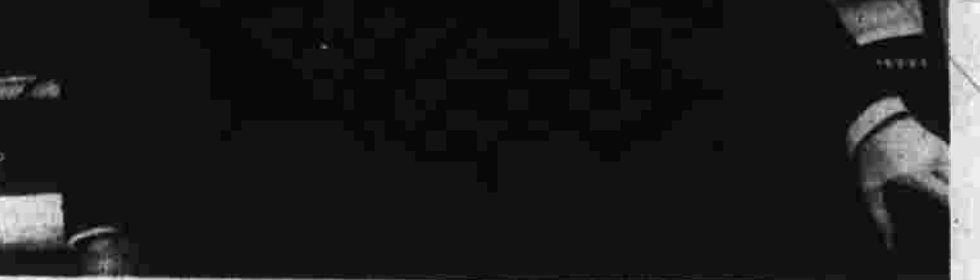

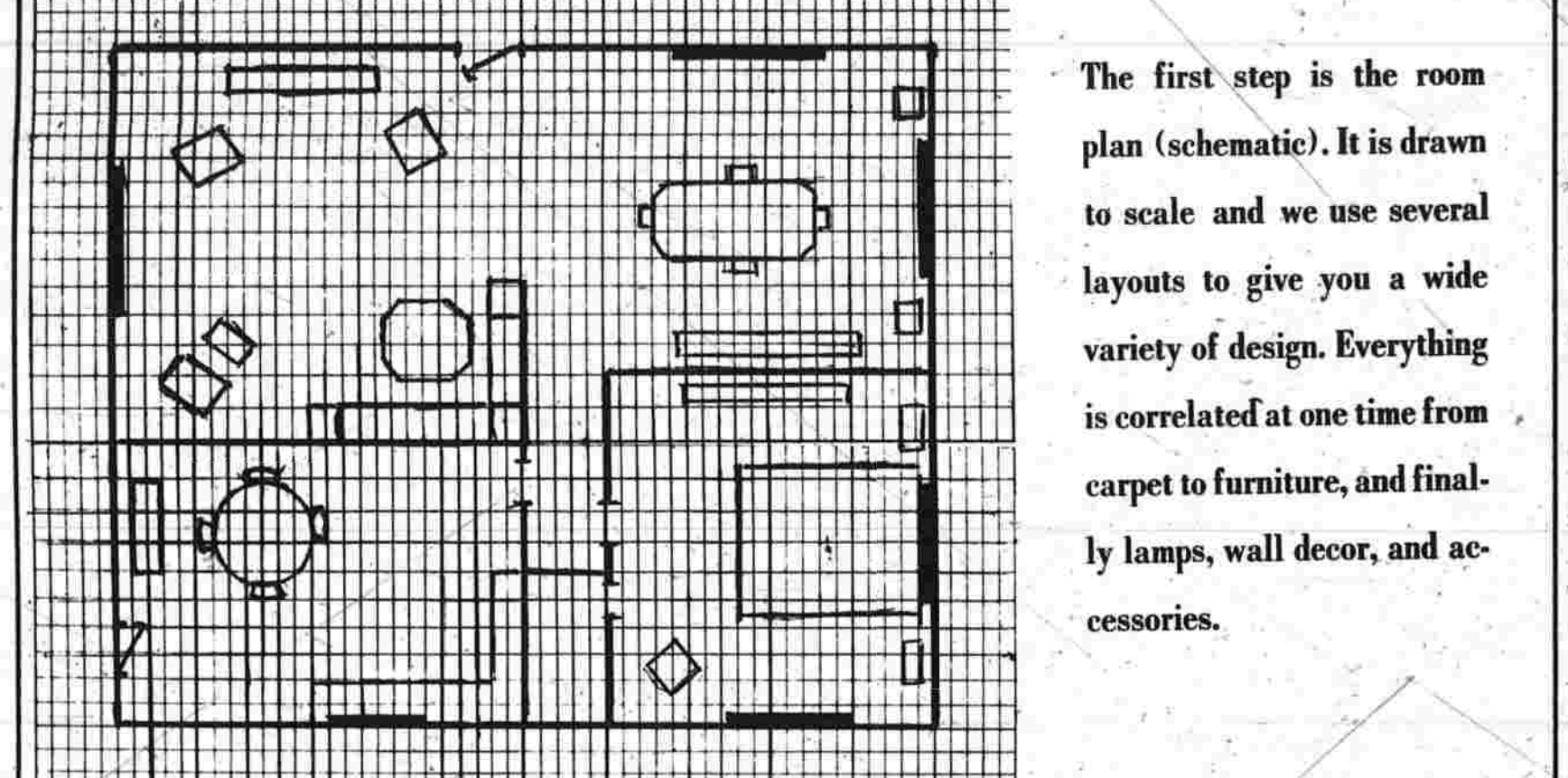

Sheinwold on Bridge

FINESSES ARE FINE HERE MAY BE YOUR WORK

By ALFRED SHEINWOLD

The finesse is a wonderful weapon but has its limitations. A finesse will succeed only if a particular high card is in a favorable position. If it is in an unfavorable position, you need something better than a mere finesse.

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable. Opening lead—ace of hearts. When today's hand was played and continued with a low heart to South's nine. Declarer then took the king and ace of clubs, hoping that the queen would fall.

When no miracle happened in clubs, South led a low spade from dummy, trying a finesse with the ten. He would develop a spade trick if East had the queen of jack.

West won with the jack of spades and got out neatly with a diamond. South won with the king of diamonds, entered dummy with the jack of hearts and led another spade to try a finesse with the nine. West thereupon defeated the contract with three spade tricks and the ace of trumps.

Against the Odds

South's plan would have succeeded if East had held any of the three missing spade honors, but the odds were against any such luck since West had bid the suit. South should have relied on a much surer weapon: On the throw-in play, after winning the second trick with the nine of hearts South should cash the top diamonds and the top clubs. Only then would it be correct to lead a spade from dummy to try a finesse with the ten.

West would win with the jack of spades but would be unable to make a safe return. If West were to return a diamond, dummy would ruff while South discards a spade. If West could return a club, declarer could easily develop a club trick in dummy. If West returned a spade, South's king would win a trick.

Daily Question

As dealer, you hold: Spades, A-K-Q-J-10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-A. Hearts, A-8; Diamonds, 2-8-7; Clubs, 87.

What do you say?

Answer: Bid one spade. You would have enough for this opening bid even if you had four low diamonds instead of four headed by the jack.

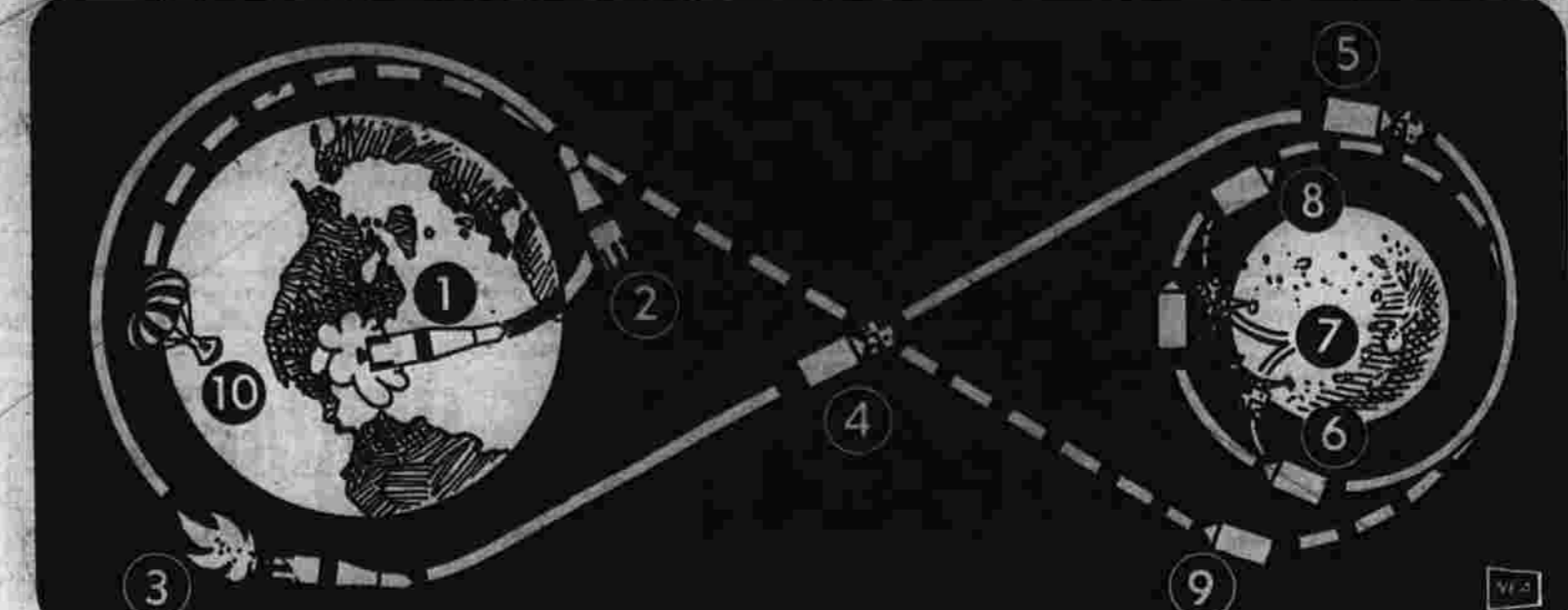

ABA Suggests Appeal Rights For Criminal Prosecutors

The Los Angeles Times advisory committee of the American Bar Assn. recommended that prosecutors in criminal cases be allowed to appeal rulings by trial judges that impede or prevent effective prosecution, especially pre-trial motions to suppress evidence or confessions.

Various state and federal courts differ widely in their rules on appeals by the prosecution. Some courts permit the state to appeal decisions to suppress evidence.

The ABA committee would permit prosecutors to appeal all trial court judgments dismissing an indictment on substantive grounds, such as a ruling that the law involved is unconstitutional, and from other pre-trial orders that terminate prosecution.

Appeal could also be taken on pre-trial orders that "seriously impede" prosecution even if they do not technically prevent it, such as those suppressing evidence on grounds of illegal search and seizure.

Five issues in Criminal Law are as controversial as proposals to give prosecutors greater freedom to appeal, but the ABA committee's recommendations are similar to those of the President's Commission on Law Enforcement. A number of states have revised their laws in this direction in recent years.

The proposed standard on prosecuting appeal is one of a series covering many facets of criminal appeals procedure drafted by the ABA advisory committee on sentence and review.

The proposals will be studied by lawyers and legal scholars, then revised and submitted to the ABA House of Delegates. If approved, they will become official ABA policy and will be offered to state and federal courts as models for judicial reform.

Two sets of such proposals, prepared as part of the association's project to draft "Minimum Standards for Criminal Justice," have already been approved as policy by most notably, the standards on Free Press-Fair Trial which call for restrictions on the release of information that could prejudice a pending criminal case.

The proposals on appeal of criminal cases begins with the premise that every defendant should have "The right to seek review of any final judgment adverse to him" at the trial level. "It is undesirable to have any class of cases in which such trial court determinations are unreviewable." The standards argue.

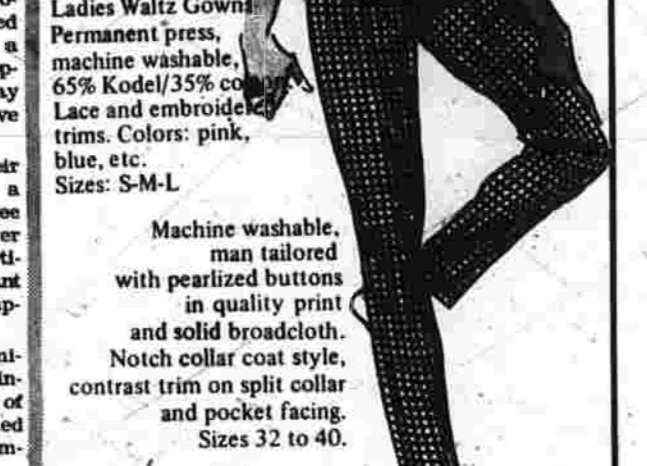

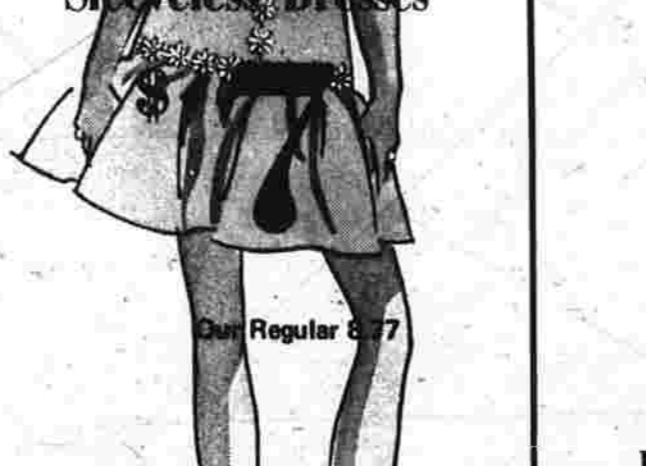

Few muggers are women. And her studies have indicated that women tend to choose as their victims people who trust them — a family member, an employer who delegates too much responsibility.

"What husband expects his wife to slip him some acid while she is preparing his supper?" asks the New York resident. And, she adds, no one will ever know how many dying patients were helped along by a dutiful, devoted nurse.

The fact is, sums up Miss deBham, that women have always committed all the crimes that men commit, except for rape, which by definition is a physical impossibility.

"The principal difference between the sexes is not in the crimes they commit but in the manner in which they committed them and in the nature of their victims."

Now as women become more and more equal with men it is inevitable that these distinctions should all blur.

At the meeting a 15-year service pin will be awarded to Mrs. Edward Stiehl, Mrs. David Robinson and Mrs. Lawrence Fiedler. Many will receive their ten-year pins.
