





One Final Regret

Two sentences in the New York Times ditorial on the resignation of Justice Fortes pose, but do not provide answer to, the enguished question in the minds of all the members of his own profes-sion who admired the mind and the alunts and the spirit of the Justice.

"It is difficult," says the Times ediortal, "to understand why Mr. Fortas did not perceive a serious impropriety from the very outset in establishing son Foundation."

And, writing of the need for standards on the ration's highest court, the Times editorial says "It is a cause for sadness that Justice Fortas, in many ways so brilliant and perceptive, did not understand this simple truth until it was lit up by the glare of public controversy." This is the wonder everyone shares in the Forbus case. How did such a brilliant and sophisticated mind fail to

recognize and warn itself against the rap it was easing itself into? Perhaps the simplest explanation is also the best. It is that human nature is seldom gifted for seeing itself as others might; it is not inconceivable that even Justice Fortas might have denounced, in theory, or in some anony-

mous supposition, the same conduct he himself happened to follow. see a career blighted, and an institution momentarily suilted, it is also a kind of national necessity, or at least a terrible need, to have the act and rite of purification attempted. This we have, in its essentials, in the fact that Justice Fortas has yielded to the building public drive against him and tendered his resignation. This leaves the Court free to go its way, and Fortas himself free

to go whatever future way he chooses. The one final regret in an affair of so many regrets is this: that Mr. Fortas how feel overpowering upon him, some final compulsion to real confession, to some rueful analysis, from inside himself, in which he himself might have tried to answer the question of just how he managed to escape seeing the im-

propriety of his own conduct. Any such examination of his own conduct by his own brilliant mind would certainly have had to be permitted to make a linkage between whatever weakness there was within himself and the great cynical permissiveness which seems especially typical of our present

There are other members of the Supreme Court from which Mr. Fortas has now resigned who have not kept themselves totally clean of involvement in outside interests and issues with which the nation's highest judges should have no connection whatsoever.

There are many, many members of Congress, including, no doubt, some of those who were hottest on the Fortus trail, who live in conflict of interest situations which have much more actual result on their own actual decisionmaking and voting on supposedly public matters then the Fortas-Wolfson connection might ever have had on any actual item of business before the Supreme

Mr. Fortus has not been alone in the kind of living for which he, personally, is now to pay a price.

He did have a chance, once the situation closed in on him because of the identity of his connection and the highness of his own place, to make himself unique by bringing himself to public confession that what he had done was rong-actually wrong. Instead, he has chosen to treat his case as one of misunderstood or of misinterpreted innocence in which no real fault was involved, unless it might be the fault of those petty enough to raise the issue

Why should Mr. Fortas, of all people, be the first to find the rite of public contrition? Why should he not, like everybody else in similar situations, treat his

There is, perimps, no real reawhy he should be expected to behave differently from the Dodde, the lears, the Adamses or the Wolfsons reason—that possessing the brilliance and love of the law he does, he bad an unparalleled opportunity to help write or restore a high moral law, and did not take the brief.

Mistress Of Appliances

The New York Times carried a survey of the difficulties modern housewives confront in keeping their many labor-saving appliances in proper repair.

Aside from the general lament over the difficulty in getting services men to answer telephones, appear on the scenes, obtain the proper parts, and not leave behind some new problem worse than the one they were called to handle, the most striking thing about the which the appliance which was breaking down kept breaking down in the same way no matter how many repair men treated it.

After having the repair service fix a washer-dryer combination three times, one couple firmly gave up and just put a basin under the machine to catch the water it leaks every time they use it. Another couple paid \$89 to have their refrigerator cured of a bad habit of going into a defrost cycle all the time, then discovered it wasn't cured, and finally discovered that the real cure was morely the tightening of a plug, which should have cost nothing.

One housewife calculated that she has

now spent, on one particular appliance, for service and repairs, four or five times as much as she paid for it

Another Manhattan housewife spent several months trying to get a 10-month old dishwasher repaired, finally, in deeperation, demanding, and getting her money back, whereupon she bought a new dishwasher of a different brand and immediately had trouble with it.

Many housewives, after finding that their appliance has such a tendency to keep resisting the efforts of the repairmen, begin to develop a superstitious conviction that the particular appliance they have is a lemon, which is never going to work right, no matter how many experts work on it for how many One way or another, we believe

there is on the way out of the nation's computers a new statistic, one which shows that the modern housewife spends almost as much time worrying about and being home for repairs to her appliances as those same appliances are supposed to be saving for her. Before too long, the routine of the old-time New England housewife is going to seem retaxed and pleasant and full of leisure time, which seemed a deserved and philosophical reward rather than a jargled escape.



Some of those saints removed from the universal calendar have origins shrouded in uncertainty and legend, We moderns forget that only 400 years ago two of every three people could neither

read nor write, and most people lived out their lives without ever traveling more than a dozen miles from their birthplace. Many superstitions about saints grew up, especially in the first centuries of our Church. We should not be surprised at this: even in 1969 the rank superstition of astrology is common. It is a healthy thing that the Church is working to get back to the authentic origins of all saints. The Church has not forbidden the use of these 46 names or veneration of these particular saints. In the stories connected with St. Christopher, St. George, St. Catherine of Alexandria, etc., there is
