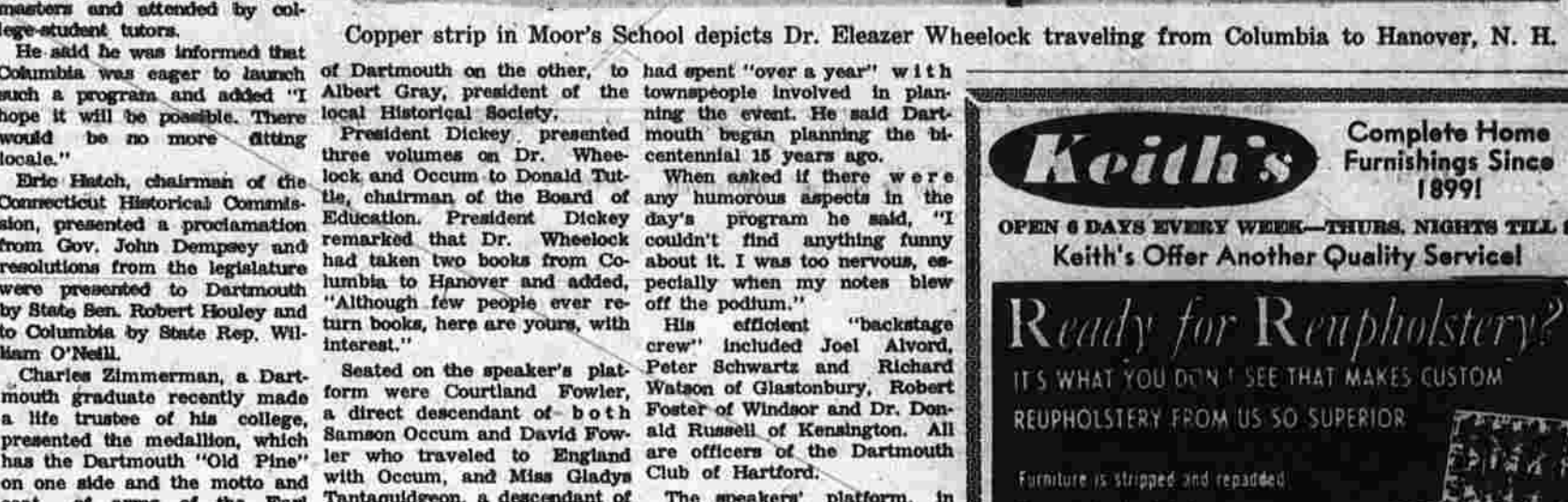
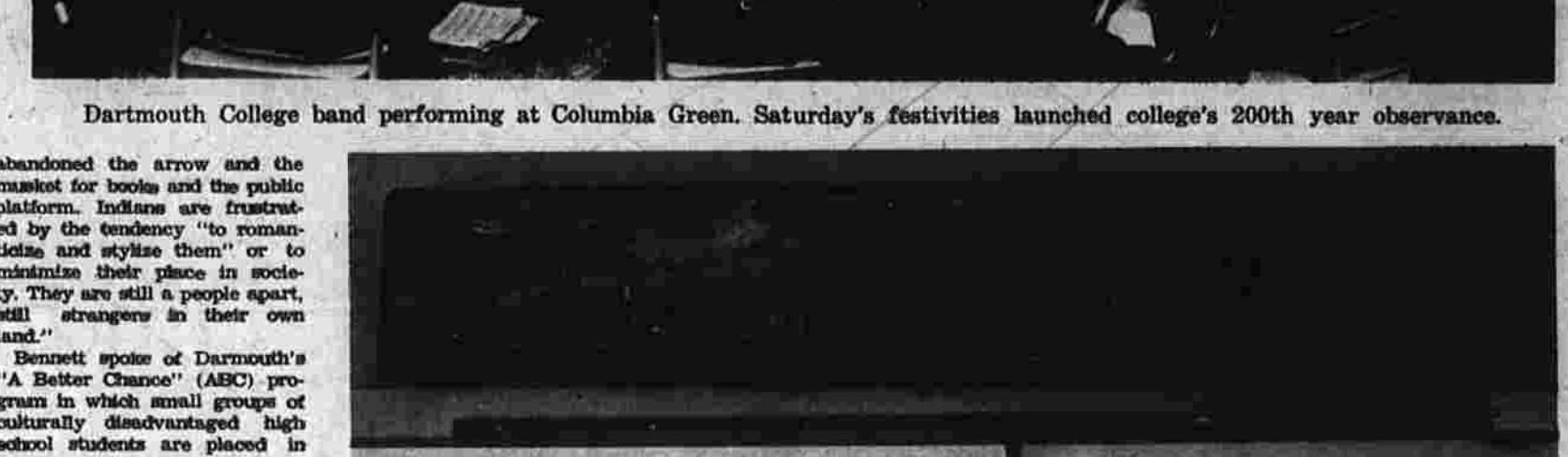

U.S., Allies Seek Early Viet Peace, Thailand Hears

By JOHN HIGGINTON, AP Special Correspondent. WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of State William P. Rogers, writing in Bangkok from his post, said today that the United States and its allies are working diligently for early peace in Vietnam.

"We all hope that the need for military action will be ended," he said in an airport statement. Rogers is here to attend a meeting of the Southeast Asia Treaty Organization (SEATO) Thursday and Wednesday.

He was met by Thailand's Foreign Minister Thanat Khuman and was given the traditional garland of sweet smelling jasmine flowers as a sign of welcome.

"We do not place priorities on our relationships with Europe or Asia," he said. He apparently intended this to reassure the Asian allies that in seeking peace in Vietnam, the United States does not intend to turn its back on Asia.

During his four-day visit to Vietnam, Rogers will meet with the government of President Nguyen Van Thieu and the administration does not plan to abandon the war or bargain away South Vietnam's right of self-determination.

But after a five-hour meeting with Rogers, Thieu said the meeting day that he wanted to meet with President Nixon because he felt much more coordination was needed between his government and the United States.

Some South Vietnamese are worried that Nixon in his intensive efforts to secure peace may be under pressure to abandon the United States to make concessions to the Viet Cong's National Liberation Front. Premier Tran Van Huong told the Associated Press in an interview that "the Americans are too anxious to get peace."

Mansfield State School Looking for Volunteers

Because many residents of Mansfield State Training School are dependent on someone else for many of their needs, volunteer workers are urgently needed and are continually being sought.

Mansfield Training School, supported by the state, has a population of some 1,700 people, living in six from five years to 77 years, both male and female.

The school, practically a small community, consists of 9 dormitories, classrooms, a hospital and many other facilities. Although many of the residents are able to do constructive work, many more are helpless and are dependent on someone else to do everything for them.

John Durkin, director of volunteer personnel, said the institution has about 1,000 regular employees and, during the course of a year, about 400 volunteers, many of them students from the University of Connecticut.

The students participate in the school's Student Compensation Program. An aspect of institutional life which is difficult to develop is that of a friendly and individual relationship with someone else and that is where the student gets his help.

With the younger children the volunteers read, play games, color and, in good weather, take them for walks or picnics. School is 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The training school has been in existence for almost 40 years. It started as a home for epileptics and the retarded.

It also has a chorus made up entirely of blind students. These students are taught by a woman who is also blind. She is aided through the building by a seeing-eye dog.

Each of the 19 dormitories in the school contains about 80 to 100 people, plus those in the hospital. The employees work 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. The number of regular employees falls short of the number needed, therefore the school relies on volunteer help to fill the gap.

For those able to attend school, there are 48 teachers, 16 teaching assistants and 16 aides and the rest, special subjects. The teachers' job is not an easy one, as each child is different and has to be approached differently.

Warning Issued On Mini-Bikes

Police Chief James Reardon today alerted parents to "the hazard and menace of mini-bikes" and warned that his department will impound the scooter-type vehicles and, "if necessary, make arrests."

"Somebody someone will be hurt seriously," Reardon warned, adding that he will hold parents responsible.

Reardon said that mini-bikes, some purchased, others homemade, "are illegal, cannot be operated on highways, and are a danger to themselves, other motorists, and pedestrians."

He said that they may be operated only by legally registered operators who are over 16 years of age, have registration plates, and carry a driver's license. Approved and issued by the State Motor Vehicle Department.

Even in those instances, Reardon said, the license may be difficult to obtain, since the majority of mini-bikes are not equipped with the required lights and horns.

He urged parents to cooperate in discouraging the purchase or the construction of mini-bikes and, in particular, to make certain they are not driven.

Tolland County Politics Legislators Weighing Bill Have Area Bank as Example

State legislators presently considering a bill to permit savings banks to conduct checking accounts on a test basis, according to a close look at the operations of the Savings Bank of Tolland.

The area bank has been having checking accounts under a special act of the legislature since 1967. It is the only savings bank in the state to be granted the special permission.

"The bank's customers are drawn from Stafford and other areas.

Although the Savings Bank of Tolland is the only banking institution in Tolland, neighboring Rockville has several.

Having banks throughout the state are pressuring the legislature to allow them to handle checking accounts. This move is strongly opposed by the state's commercial banking institutions.

Consideration is being given to granting permission to two savings banks throughout the state to handle checking accounts on a test basis. No mention has been made of the Tolland bank's experience.

Congressman William H. Oniz of the 2nd District, has introduced a legislative bill calling for the passage of minimum monthly Social Security benefits to all unemployed individuals at the age of 70.

The purpose of the bill is to "make available Social Security payments to citizens 70 years of age who have not previously qualified for such aid," St. Oniz explained.

South Windsor Mill Rate Increase Of 3.25 Expected

While many towns in the area are facing increases in the mill rate in the neighborhood of 3 1/2 mills, South Windsor councilmen are patting themselves on the back for keeping the tax rate to under four mills.

When the council meets tonight at 8 in the Town Hall they are expected to set the mill rate at 48 mills, up only 3.25 mills from last year.

The modest increase is in part due to economy efforts by the council, as well as anticipated increased revenues of \$10,000 the state will add to education.

The council is counting on the state grant being increased to \$200 per child, as opposed to \$180 per pupil for the first 300 students, plus \$100 per pupil for more than 300 students.

In addition to the state educational grant, the council is counting on \$50,000 unexpended monies from the Pleasant Valley Rd. project being carried forward as a continued appropriation being applied against the tax rate.

Although the council is meeting before the council meeting tonight, no major changes are anticipated, according to Mayor Howard E. Pile.

E. P. Williams of the Connecticut Water Co. will discuss the company's operations in town with the council at the meeting, and the council will be authorizing the town manager to accept sealed bids for the sale of land on Main St. at the site of the old Town Hall.

In addition several appointments to the Historic District Study Committee and an appointment of a member of the Public Buildings Commission is anticipated.

The Sever Commission will meet at 8 at the town hall tomorrow night to continue several items of unfinished business, including discussion of an ordinance authorizing the construction of sewers by and at the expense of developers, and discussion and consideration of an application from Aaron Dubinsky for sewer service from Northwood Drive and Billington to Old Dr., a proposed road.

The commission will continue to review the proposed sewer assessment charges.

Barnes Scores Lack of Action On Tax Bills

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—With only 12 weekday sessions remaining in the 1968 General Assembly, the legislature has still failed to discuss the tax bills.

Senate Minority Leader Wallace Barnes deplored the situation over the weekend, while Senate Majority Leader Edward I. Marcus over the weekend was still proposing spending for proposed taxes.

In a written statement Saturday Barnes said:

"The fact that our state is facing the most severe fiscal crisis in its history is all the more reason why the spending and taxation bills should have been before us at an early date so that these serious matters could be thoroughly studied without the pressure of a legislative deadline."

The Farmington Republican blamed the Democrats for holding up discussion on tax bills until late in the session. The taxation-spending problems will have to be solved within the few sessions remaining because the state constitution requires the General Assembly to adjourn by midnight June 4.

While Barnes was criticizing Saturday, Sen. Marcus, D-New Haven, was suggesting uses for revenue that would come in if the proposed payroll tax is adopted.

Marcus proposed that one-eighth to one-quarter of the one per cent proposed payroll tax be diverted to cities and towns for educational purposes.

The money, said Marcus, could be dispensed according to growth patterns and population density and could mean an additional \$18 million for local education during the next two years.

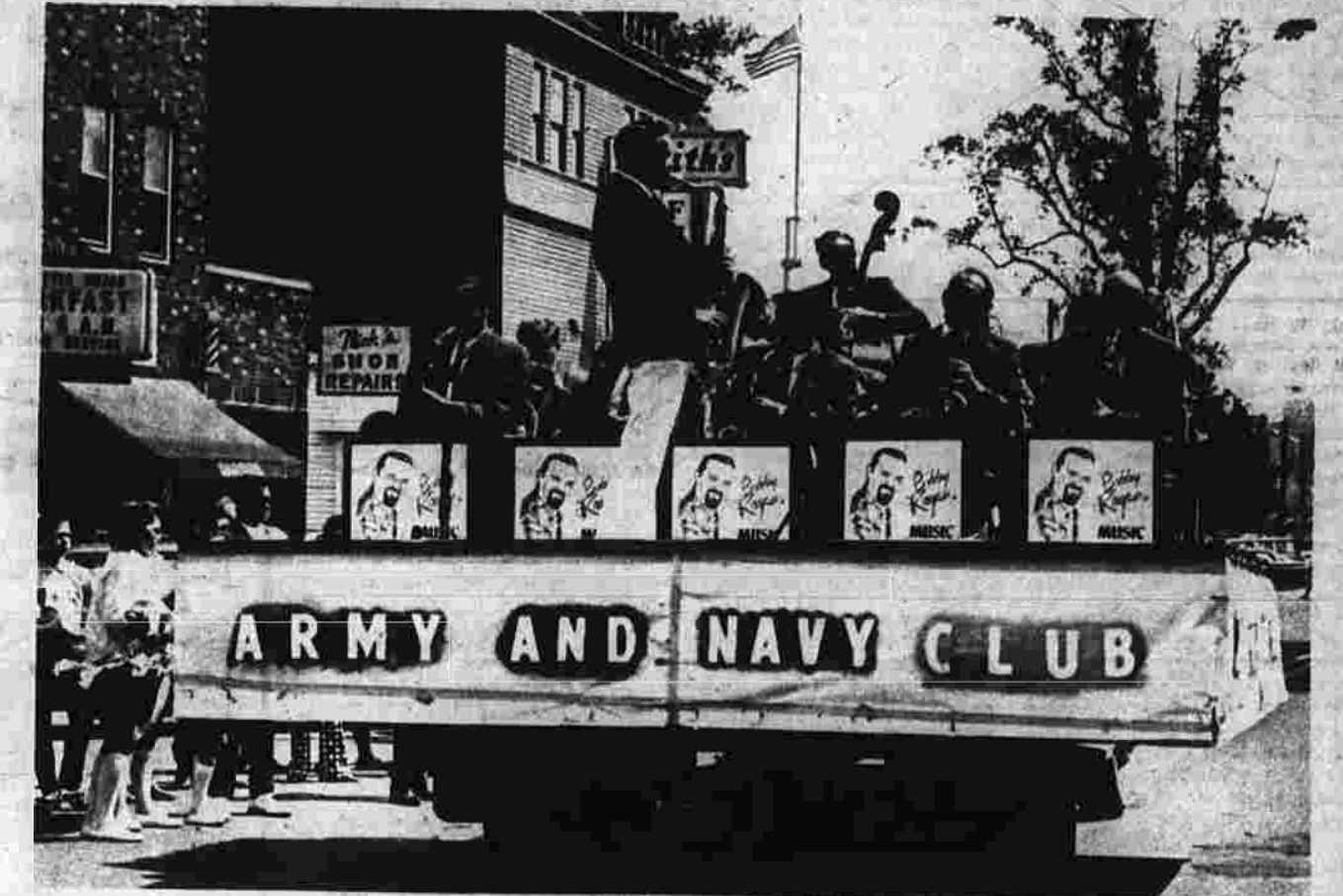

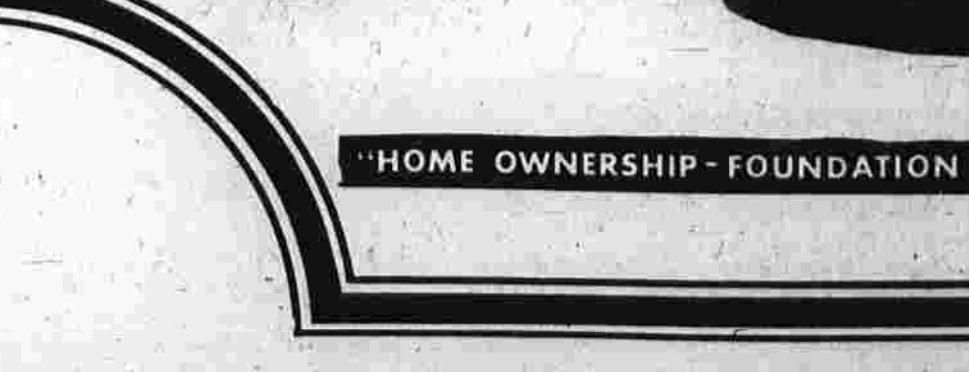
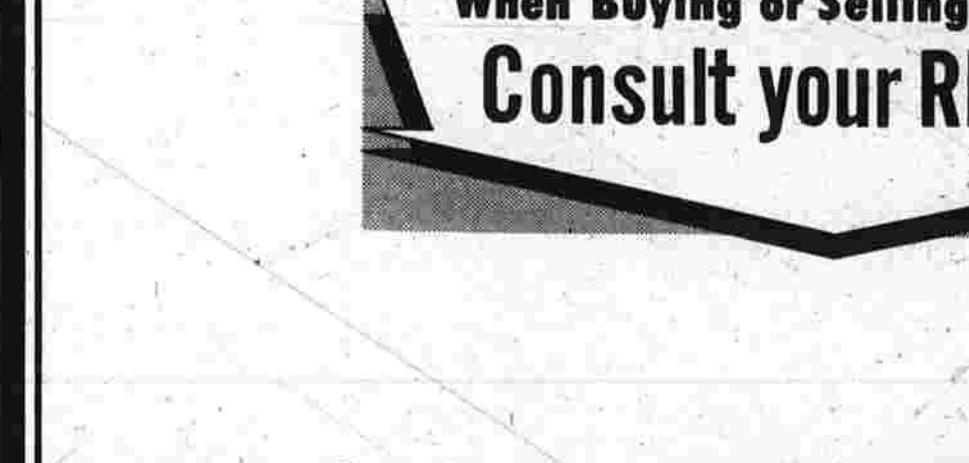

Thieu, Nixon Meet June 8 To Discuss Peace Policy

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Nixon and South Vietnamese Chief of State Nguyen Van Thieu will fly to Midway Island in the Pacific June 8 to discuss a common policy toward a peaceful solution to the Vietnam war.

The two presidents had de-stayed to hold such a meeting as soon as feasible in order to establish personal contact and discuss jointly the conduct of the war in Vietnam and the search for a peaceful solution.

The one-day meeting suggested last Saturday by Thieu, will be the first session between the two chief executives. Thieu met in Honolulu last July with President Lyndon B. Johnson.

Although the announcement did not mention U.S. troop withdrawal and South Vietnamese elections, those topics probably will be on the agenda, a qualified source said.

The groundwork for the first meeting of the Vietnamese chief of state and the U.S. president was laid in Saigon last week when Secretary of State William P. Rogers said extensive talks were with Thieu.

The Vietnamese president said in a statement Saturday he hoped to meet with Nixon in Honolulu to arrange the session with Thieu.

One source in his communication office said that President Thieu of the Republic of Vietnam and Vice President Spiro T. Agnew will be in Honolulu for the meeting.
