





Postmaster General Winton M. Blount, who recommended the plan has scheduled meetings with members of Con-gress beginning Tuesday morning to ex-In many respects, the plan is similar to the recommendations submitted to President Johnson last June by his Commission on Postal Organization headed by retired chairman Frederick R. Kappel of the American Telephone and Teleproph Commission

One of the principal objectives of the plan is to insulate postal operations from political and legislative action in the interest of greater efficiency. Congress, however, will have to approve because the plan contains because the plan contains many sweeping changes which require legislation.

The Blount proposal, which was un-veiled for a few lawmakers Tuesday cludes these main features:

— The U.S. Postal Corporation would be a public corporation run by a general manager under policies set by nine di-rectors. Unlike the present postmaster general and his many predecessors, the general manager is not expected to be a member of the president's calcust a member of the president's cabinet.

The corporation would inherit the ascets of the post office, including buildings, trucks and other machinery. The corporation would be authorized to raise 10 billion dollars to invest in meeded

An Obscenity In Purity Crusades Except for one sentence, the concluding paragraph of President Nixon's special message to Congress on the problem of obscene mail could have served, and perhaps should have served, as his whole communication on the subject. The paragraph in question read:

"The ultimate answer lies not with the Government but the people. What is required is a citizens' crusade against the obscene. When indecent books no longer find a market, when pornographic films can no longer draw an audience, when obscene plays open to empty trouses, then the tide will turn. Government can maintain the dikes against obscenity, but only people can turn back the tide." The one sentence full of nonsense error

in that paragraph was the one which said "What is required is a citizens" crusade against the obscene."
Such "citizens' crusades" are, we ought to know by now, just as futile, and just as misguided as government efforts at control and censorship. They are usually peopled by individuals who are much more fascinated by the obscene than those they seek to protect and insulate from it. Their net result is usually to broaden public awareness of and interest in the very thing they are trying to prohibit. And very fre-

How Get Rid Of Nerve Gases? No wonder people are worried about 27,000 tons of nerve and mustard gas which, according to the Pentagon, are to be dumped in the Atlantic deeps. On'y a year ago 6,000 sheep died in Jtah because about 16lb. of the nerve agent VX (Soman according to Second World War German nomenclature) were accidentally released over civil territory

This raises an important point; enormous stocks of nerve gases exist in the USSR)-enough altogether to kill the population of the world many times and even though it is now generally accepted that as weapons these gases are not very useful they are still being manufactured in absurdly large quantities. The time has surely come to consider in detail how best to get rid of the stuff. To leave it exposed in containers on the surface, as are large quantities in the US, is to invite disaster from the random accidents of life. A crashing aircraft, a rocket engine which survives re-entry, or a meteor, could initiate a catastrophe of enormous proportions. Disposal of large amounts during the next ten or twenty years is inevitable, yet to simply use the ocean as a sink is morally untenable. If the action of sea water will hydrolyse these nerve agents into innocuous compounds within a few days or a few weeks, then an acid hydrolysis plant designed for the purpose could do this in seconds-or at most minutes. It is time to build such plants. In the past there may have been transient excuses for making deadly materials without thought of their ultimate disposal. But there is no longer
