In the moment of success, this operation was called, by the commander on the scene, "a great victory by a gutty bunch of guys."

It was also pointed out, by the military command on the scene, that the "kill ratio" had been exceptionally favorable-10 of the enemy for every singie American whereas the average kill ratio in Vietnam has been closer to 8

"Hamburger Hill" then stands, by such vents, as a dramatic sample of the war, as it is being fought by our commanders nd our men over in Vietnam.

But "Hamburger Hill" also has an other role. Even while our men in uniform in Vietnam were storming up its sides, perhaps wondering why, a United States Senator in Washington, on the floor of the Senate, was making a speech

The speech was by Senator Edward Kennedy, whose family gave three brothers to the service of their country, and whose basic patriotism and loyalty to the imerican system is not under question. It was a speech, this speech in the United States Senate, opposing the fighting of this battle American boys were winning. even while the speech was being d-

"President Nixon has told us," said Senator Kennedy, "that we seek no military victory, that we seek only peace. How then can we justify sending our boys against a hill a dozen times or more, until soldiers themselves question the madness of the action? The assault on Hamburger Hill is only symptomatic of a mentality and a policy that requires

Senator Kennedy called the battle itself "senseless and irresponsible" and said "American lives are too valuable to be sacrificed for military pride." He was answered, on the floor of the Senate, by the Republican whip, Senator Hugh Scott of Pennsylvania, who answered from the context of American history up to now, and who answered by disputing the right or the propriety of his colleague in trying to take the right to fight any single battle away from our

That will not be the end of public debate over the battle of Hamburger Hill. The Hill will be watched, to see whether, having conquered it, our commanders think it is worth having our men stay there. And if we don't bother to keep the prize we won, that will shift argument back to the business of the kill ratio and find some people asking whether it is worth while giving 43 American lives to get 420 North Vietnamese lives, or whether, for that matter, we should consider it merely a game of statistics if we could get the 420 North stnamese lives for nothing.

All this illustrates the kind of world, the kind of country, this has become, when political leaders dare question the value of a battle even while it is still being fought, when the population grows so soft and civilized it begins preferring live relatives to dead heroes, when even the men in uniform are allowed to question the orders they are receiving. It begins to look more and more like a world which might, some day, find it-self actually incapable of weging war. What if, some day, both sides should refuse to set up the next Hamburger Hill

might seem like the end of the world as we have known it. For others, it might seem the beginning of the world as it ought to be.

As for an immediate verdict on this particular Hamburger Hill, it seems foirotvious that both we and the North letnamese set up this bloody game of duck on a rock in an effort, each of us, to improve our "position of strength" for the negotiations at Paris, From this point of view, we see no measurable re sult, from this, or from all the other expenditure of life both sides have so far insisted upon as an accompanimer to the dance of words at Paris.

Marcuse On Free Speech

Professor Herbert Marcuse gave public chie, the other day, to what may so the secret of his popularity as a philosopher for the "New Left." What he said and he said it directly

to a meeting of the American Civil Liberties Union which believes in free speech for everybody-was that he himself did not approve of free speech for exploitation, or brutality.

This can sound reasonable and civilized and humane until one realizes that the New Left's philosopher would apparently leave it up to his own judgment to decide just what constitutes advocacy of what kind of war, what kind of target creates brutality when it happens to be receiving a blow, what would the judgment of moism in reverse, or what constitutes exploitation of one human being by another.

What Professor Marcuse really said, then, was that he disagreed with the right of free speech for people who might

This kind of statement has the charm and the virtue of an honesty which is elatively rare among crusaders for any of our political or philosophical extremes. They do not very often come right out and say that their own paricular revolution would, if it ever won its way to power, deny to others the same freedom it so boisterously claims for itself while it is on its way up. Professor Marcuse has enjoyed a great deal of sympathy, in recent months, because reactionary California elements save been trying to drive him out of his teaching post at San Diego, because rightist muts have threatened his life, all because they disagree with things he has written or said. Now he himself ordenses that, had he the power, he imself would be a stopper of tongues, a banner of books, all of them, of course, being the bad and wicked ones, or at least the ones he himself classified as

bad and wicked. The system by which this democracy has lived so far depends upon our con-timuing to give Professor Marcuse his freedom of speech, and upon our seeing to it that he doesn't get his freedom of



HARTFORD (AP) — A bill that would restrict the state's power to sterlise state prison inmates and state mental hospital patients was passed Wednesday by the House and sent to the governor.

The law now allows sterilisation of persons found likely to produce offspring with an inherited tendency to crime, mental illness or mental deficiency and who were not likely to be cured.
