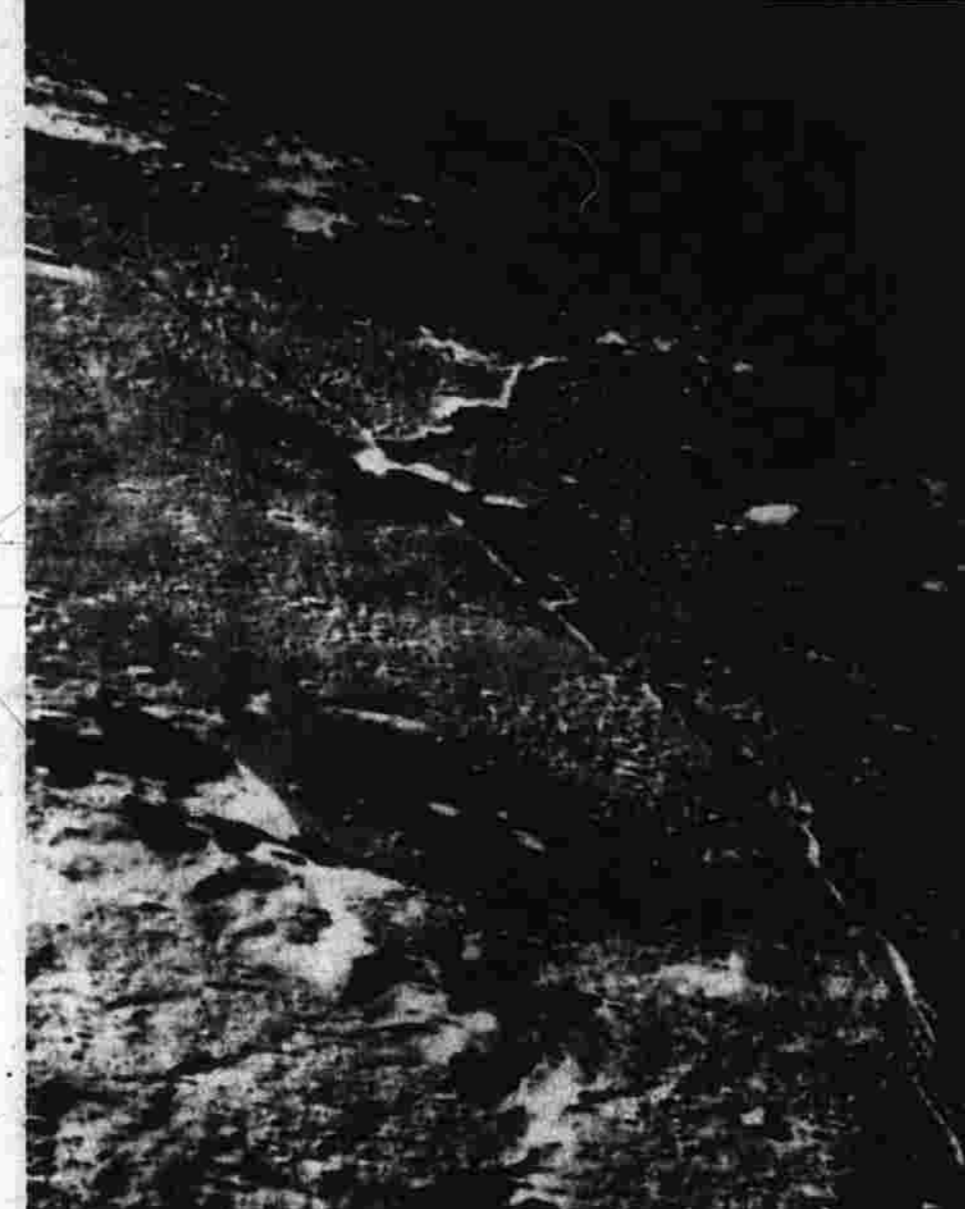

Photos Show Room to Park On the Moon

SPACE CENTER, Houston (AP)—The site planned for man's first landing attempt on the moon is pocked with small craters and boulder fields, but there is still room to park a spacecraft, Apollo 10 photographs show. The photos, taken during the moon orbit flight of Air Force Col. Thomas F. Stafford and Navy Cmdr. John W. Young and Eugene A. Sernice, and released Wednesday, show the prime landing area to be smoother than other areas. The landing point is located less than a degree north of the vertical center line on the earth-side of the moon.



A photograph of a secondary landing site shows it to be rougher than the primary site. Dr. John Dietrich, a National Aeronautics and Space Administration geologist, said the pictures studied so far present few surprises about the landing site, but give new views of the approach to the site selected for a landing attempt by Apollo 11 in July.

Other views show rugged mountains, deep craters, ridges and long steep-sided escarpments, which are called rilles. All the still photographs in moon orbit were taken by the camera and northwest toward the Sea of Vapor. The rille is about 2 miles wide and more than 180 miles long. The horizon is not visible in this photo, taken from the command module. The sunrise terminator is between the spacecraft and the horizon. At the time this picture was taken Apollo 10 was 200 miles southeast of Hyginus.

Small craters are sprinkled throughout the landing site, but there are also broad patches of smooth, even areas. A large 1 1/2 to 1/4 mile wide crater is on the north side of the site and a faint ravine, or rille, borders the east side.

The space agency also showed some of the film shows the approach to landing sites from altitudes below 80 miles. Stations and terrain dipped to within 1/4 mile of the moon, but their precise altitudes when the pictures were taken were not immediately known. The moon's surface appears little different from the low-altitude pictures compared to those shot from higher.

While the pictures were being released, the Apollo 10 astronauts were undergoing an intensive debriefing of their eight-day flight which ended Monday. Officials have said the information, observations and photos the Apollo 10 crew brought back from the moon will be vital to the Apollo 11 landing attempt.

Stafford and his crewmates will continue the debriefing for eight hours daily until June 7.

U.S. Forces Crush Viet Cong Meeting

SALGON (AP)—U.S. forces crushed an enemy strategy meeting today during a 48-hour counter-offensive that Viet Cong had proclaimed in honor of their leader's birthday.

The enemy counter-offensive began at 7 a.m. Allied forces were alerted to start a 24-hour truce period at 8 a.m. Friday (6 p.m. EST). Heavy rocket grenades. The enemy troops were entrenched in a tight line.

More than 700 infantrymen from the U.S. 27th Division, some riding tanks and armored personnel carriers, maneuvered to seal off the enemy force. Two personnel carriers were reported damaged.

Air Force fighter-bombers, helicopter gunships and artillery pummeled the dug-in Viet Cong units. When the fighting tapered off, twenty-seven AK-47 assault rifles and nine rocket launchers were captured.

One prisoner was taken and held interrogated by the Viet Cong. He said they figured only a small force—perhaps a platoon of 40 men—were going to be sent in, and the Viet Cong planned to ambush them.

South Vietnamese headquarters said it had received no reports of major Viet Cong victories.

New Respirator Boon for Infants

BLACKSBURG, Va. (AP)—Only developmental models of the respirator are available now. Commercial production is to start next year.

Several respirators are at about 25,000 babies yearly in the United States.

Tech spokesmen said physicians evaluating the performance of the highly sensitive respirator reported it has brought a significant reduction in infant mortality.

Equipment already exists for treatment of infants with respiratory distress. The superiority of the Arp respirator, doctors said, lies in its sensitive and rapid response to the needs of the infant struggling for breath.

The respirator is designed to help keep the infant well supplied with oxygen and in this way can prevent brain damage from oxygen deficiency.

Father Calls For Return of Missing Girl

NEW CANAAN, Conn. (AP)—The father of a 10-year-old girl missing since Tuesday night broadcast an appeal for her return today as police worked on the theory she may have been kidnapped.

Joseph Mount, manager of International Business Machines' five scientific centers throughout the country, said he has not had "anything positive" since his daughter, Mary, was last seen in a local park Tuesday evening.

He said he asked the Federal Bureau of Investigation to keep its agents on a standby basis rather than participate in the search at this time.

"I'm trying to ensure the safety of anyone who might offer a clue," he said. "The FBI told me it was up to me to make such a decision."

Mount broadcast a radio appeal asking anyone with any information on Mary's whereabouts to telephone him, the New Canaan police or any church. He said his phone line is not being monitored by any official agency, and that any calls received would be treated confidentially.

He said that during the night his telephone rang four times, but on each occasion the caller disconnected when he answered.

In his broadcast, Mount said: "We want to emphasize two points. One, Mary's safety is our only concern. Two, the proposed methods of communication are simply suggestions; the only way a person could possibly contact pulmonary assistance at the site would be to go into the dirt and eat it."

Army Denies Danger In Germ Cemetery

BALY LAKE CITY (AP)—The Dewart test center commander says it is true a plot of ground in Utah was sown with deadly anthrax germs in a 1964 biochemical warfare test, but denies the site is hazardous to animals or men.

A statement that the area is a continuing peril by a New York congressman was described by the commander, Brig. Gen. John G. Appel, as "a case of making a big thing out of nothing."

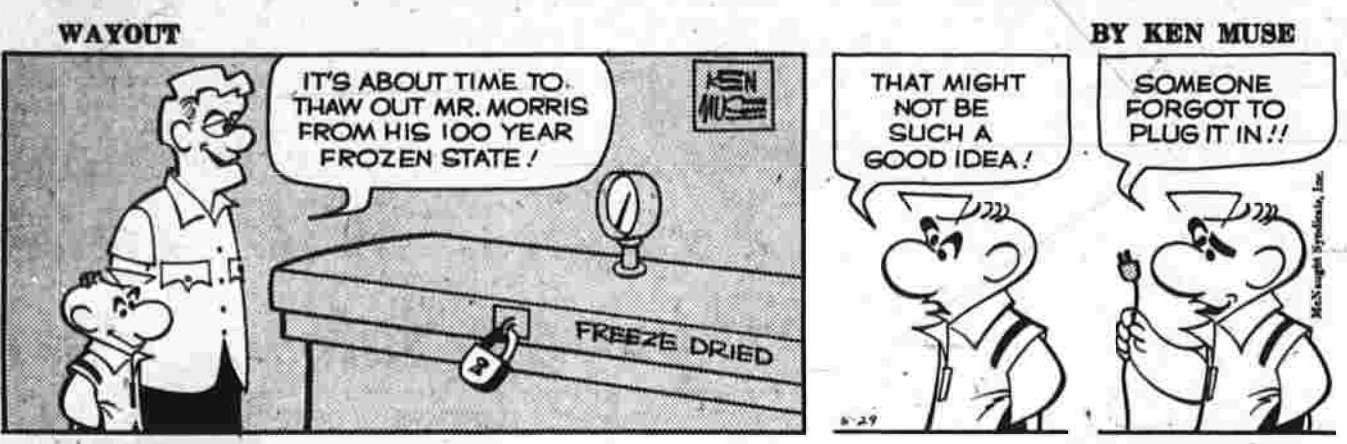

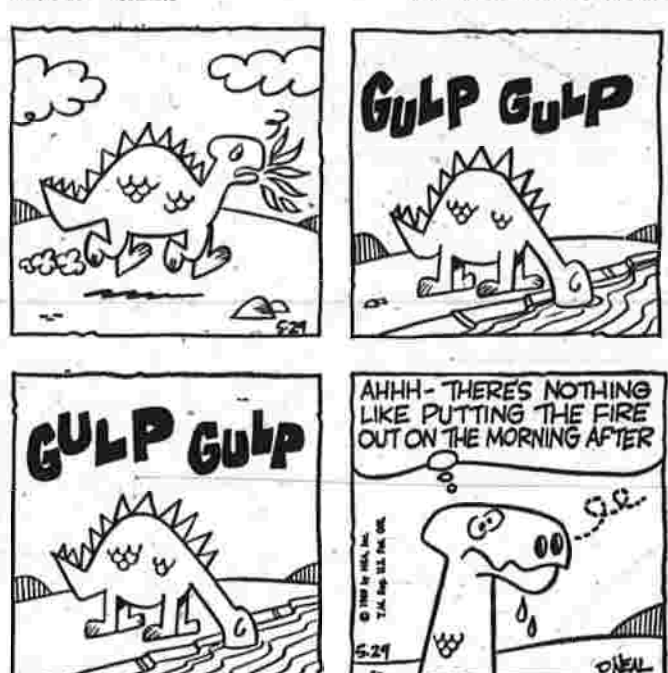
