It will be both interesting and important—what the Nixon ouch can do to the instincts which almost inevitably govern in Saigon. If he can show us President Thieu beaming at his side and volunteering to do the things American diplomacy wishes he would be willing to do, he will have produced something of a miracle.

Toward A New School System

The new bill covering state aid to non public schools is a vast improvement over the original bill that was filed o behalf of Roman Catholic schools. As the preamble to the bill states, number of federal education programs offer financial assistance to all second-So no longer is it possible to argu

that support for education must be ex-

clusively limited to the public schools

It can be argued that the existing federal aids are for specific purposes and that the state program, which has now passed the Senate, cuts out new ground n this respect. But this is a distinction that represents a fairly fine line. The new bill would make payments di rectly to schools for teachers' sularies reimbursed at 20 per cent, and textbooks, reimbursed at \$10 a student in grades one through eight and \$15 a student in grades nine through 12. A good many protections are built into the bill in terms of accreditation and planning of future additions or changes. No religious subject is reimburseable, and textbooks cannot be religiously oriented in the direction of any one sect. Provisions are included to encourage open enrollment by insisting that a specified number of pupil admissions, based on without reference to whether or not parents are parishloners or contributors to the school, Parents must also agree to the school being reimbursed if credit for

a sibling's attendance is to be given under the reimbursement formula. An opportunity is also presented to have a quick court test of the constitutionality of the new aid procedure. Such a test will undoubtedly be made and therefore this particular issue will be

But that still leaves the question of whether or not it is desirable to publicly support a multiple school system in this country —on a general basis —at the level of elementary and secondary educed greatly by the argument that private schools save the pubic sector a great deal of money. This s quite true. But it also is quite irrel-

There are many Cathol'cs who believe that private schools should not be publicly supported, just as there are many non-Catholics who are not especially excited by this issue. Nor does anybody dispute that private schools need money. We believe that the net effect of this bill will be to increase the non-public relicols in the state, although most of them probably won't be religious schools. Because this is bound to be true, the public schools will be deprived of middle class students as a result -and these are the students that quite often lend an aura of high aspiration to a given school. This may provide an unfortunate spinoff, although the results will vary tre-

mendously from community to communn Middletown, we do not believe that the existing situation would be much changed, except that the Catholic schools would probably tend to get better, especially at the elementary level. This would be an important plus, and it should not be discounted. Mercy and Navier high schools are already providing extremely fine educations and the new fund, would allow them to more as ly continue to do that.


But as a general matter throughout the state we believe it would be a better idea for the state to provide free transportation for all Catholic students in the same way that public school children are transported. This would result extra funds being passed through to all the dioceses because tuition charges could be increased in proportion to the free service provided. Because Middletown already has bus service for all, this would not have a specific local impact. But such local imbalances could be adjusted throughout the dioceses if necescary. Bus service reimbursement would

completely avoid constitutional questions and would tend to place a limit on the aid that the state would be asked to pay in support of private education. However, it is also true that in the absence of a constitutional bar, the people may vote for any public expenditure that they may wish. But the whole matter is not an easy question. If 20 per cent of the costs should be paid, why not 100 per cent? Perhaps this is the direction that education in this country is going to take -a completely decentralized system of ducation, each responding to its own constituency, each providing what is denanded by that constituency, and perhaps each as a private school in the ence that all schools, public and private, would seek both public and private support (There is, for instance, no reason why a chair should not be endowed at iddletown High School). This would eventually mean that all schools would get the same amount of public funds per student, and it would represent a basic change in the educational system that this country has known. LAGOS —There is growing dissatistaction among many Niggrians against the downy system of marriage —an ago-old custom in many parts of the country whereby a man pays a certain amount to the family of the woman he is marrying.

This form of downy can be paid either in cash or in kind, or both. It has gone up from the token payment it was many years ago to a staggering levy, now believed to be keeping many young men from marrying. It is significant, though, that among those urging the scrapping of this custom are women —who should normally

scrapping of this custom are women —who should normally benefit from it, since the dowry is either given to them for their use or shared by members of their family.

A group of African Women, meeting last year in Acora, Ghana, to discuss the rights of women, condemned the system because it gives the impression that the wife is being bought. Even so many of them, and the men also, will not mind the continuation of the system, if only to preserve the tradition—provided the amount paid is not excriticant.

The bride price is an essen-I aspect of traditional Afrian marriages; it has the same symbolism as the ring in West-ern Marriages. In the past, the dowry was meant to be a token compensation to the parents for their trouble in bringing up their daughter. Because of this, young girls scrupulously guard-ed their virginity in order not to lower their marriageable val-

In Nigeria the system varies depending on the particular area of the country among the Fulanis of the Muslim north. It is usual to pay downless with catthe, and the wealth of the bridegroom is determined by the
number of his herd.
