Where The Vacuum Is So far, ironically, the cure of making

coney more expensive to borrow has not worked as at as supposed to work. Instead of discouraging those who have been seeking credit by charging them a ridiculous rate of interest, it has seemed to stampede them into trying to borow more money at an earlier date.

Two sasumptions have joined in such frustration of interest rate efforts to control credit. First, the business world itself is in a state of euphoria, in which assumes that prices and profits can always be raised enough to make up for any increase in the cost of money itself. Second, those addicted to the use of credit calculate that, although interest rates may be unconscionably high aiready, they are certain to go higher still, wherefore everybody who expects to need money should rush to borrow it

These two assumptions have now been dealt as heavy a blow as seems to lie within the potential of the interest-raising device. When, the other day, the banks increased their "prime" loan rate by a full percentage point, taking it up to 81/2 per cent, which is the highest in all history, they gave at least momentary pause and shock even to those who have fallen into the delightful habit of calculating that a business' prosperity can be measured by the amount of money it can afford to borrow and the rate of

A very elemental comment seems in order. It is that unless something begins to exert some braking control over our continuing inflation, we are going to find this whole handsome economy of ours halted by smash-up. We have had interest rate increases which seemed to have done nothing but whet the appetite of the borrowers, a tax increase which has seemed to stimulate spending instead of reducing it, and we stand, in the wage and price field, in an anarchy where government does not dare move to impose controls from above while labor and management refuse to make themselves responsible for voluntary controls. The measurement of our situation grows steadily worse by every index; how truly desperate it may be is indicated by growing reports that more and more businessmen are beginning to turn to the idea of rigid governmental controls as the only possible answer left. That would be an extraordinary confession of national failure to manage ourselves as a mixture of opportunity and restraint, of free enterprise and the discipline necessary to keep free enterprise from ruin-

There is a great gaping vacuum where the unified command post against inflation ought to be located. Out in one area of the battlefield, the 8½ per cent interest rate advance has been ordered. It remains to be seen whether it is one more inconclusive foray, or the beginning of a real battle plan.

As he himself admits, most young Eskimos carry on life as it has been handed to them y their forefathers, and the principal reason for such adherence to old time virtues and customs is that the education offered them is so poor, primitive, or non-existent that they never even imagine an opening or a reason for them to change their style of living.

All those who would, then, prefer more stable society, in which young people continue to hold the same values and do the same things in the same do is to cut down on the amount and quality of the education offered young Americans, white and black, young Frenchmen, young Japanese.

It is probably a mistake to think that the situation can be bandled by changing he content and direction of our education; the record shows that young people are likely to select their own values and draw their own conclusions from any kind of education, and are just as like y to come out of a conservative, tradidonalist lecture primed for change and revolution as they are to be incited by eftist barangues.

The thing to do is not to try to tinker with education. The safe thing to do is to cut it out, on the sound and proven theory that all education is dangerous, the foe of stability, the upsetter of values which ought never to be questioned, the changer of customs which ought to be handed down unbroken from one generation to another, the stimulator of minds into unruly and original thoughts -in short, education itself is a continual process of revolutionary war with any society foolish enough to finance and provide it.

The best way to try to make the world safe for the good old days would be to close the schools and just hand down
