gathering at Harvard toself. But that was not the end of the day at Harvard. There was another student speaker, who represented the majority, and whose remarks were roundly applauded by most of the students preser Their guests and parents, on the other hand, sat through this delivery of a comment for the majority with stony, uncomprehending, unpleased faces. What did the spokesman for the student majority have to say? Inevitably, he was talking about the

spring troubles at Harvard, and the way they were handled.

"Instead of adjudicating the legitimate nuses of the dissatisfaction," he said, our political and social leaders have searched for explanations which deny either the validity or the pervasiveness of the dissent.

"You have told us repeatedly that trust and courage were standards to emulate. You have convinced us that equality and justice were inviolable concents and we have taken you seriously. "For attempting to achieve the values which you have taught us to cherish, your response has been astounding. It has escalated from the presence of police on the compuses to their use of clubs and gas.

"I have asked many of my classmates what they warted me to say today. "Tall with them about hypocrisy,' most of them said. Tell them they have broken the best heads in the country, embittered the most creative minds, and turned of their most talented scholars.

"Tell them they have destroyed ou confidence and tost our respect. Te them that, as they use the phrase, law and order is merely a substitute for rea son and an alternative to justice." For this, the student speaker received s rising ovation.

In the year end ceremonies at Harvard, as in those at Yale, the protest and revolution which were significant were not the way-out efforts of any "extremely small minority," as those who would like to dispose of the problem without really looking at it prefer to claim. In each case, it was the position of the heavy majority which was hard ly less shocking than that of the wild and small minority, but much more truly imperative in its need for under standing and answer. There have always been such minorities on American campuses. There have never been such majorities.

To Get A Community College We don't blame the State Commission on Higher Education for sending through a resolution opposing the legislative bill forcing the commission to give a directed verdict on location of new community colleges. The Meriden-Wallingford Southington Cheshire area would have been in direct line to benefit from the measure, which would have left the commission no choice on where the next community colleges are to be located. But by so doing it would remove from the commission its powers to plan and locate community colleges in an orderly pattern of development,

and would hand that power over, in effect, to the politicians. The Meriden area needs and deserves its own real, complete community college. It is entitled to a high priority in the schedule of when such colleges are to be built. As the only major population center of anywhere near this size without any higher education fauilities- no state college, no branch of UConn, no community college- t is in

People here have been acutely aware of this need ever since the community college program was begun. A joint committee of Meriden-Wallingford citizens has spent time and enthusiasm, discussed and negotiated patiently, offered sites and urged claims, in an attempt to get a usable community college within rea sonable commuting distance.

Frankly, we don't know why we have been so consistently by-passed. We don't know why other less populous areas, with state higher education facilities closer than ours, have been chosen over and over again as community college sites ahead of us. We're disgusted and impatient, and tempted to back any measure which would force a decision in our favor.

But we agree with the commission that this is not the best way to run the educational development plan of the community colleges. We agree that, whatever the drawbacks of having the commission make the decision on community college location, \it's a better system than throwing it into the political bearpit of the legislature. Governor Dempsey should veto all the bills creating specific community colleges or none

Russia Turns the Clock Back

Pictures at An Exhibition

The Washington Post Giselle Amalric is a tall, slender Tartar beauty who would make eyes turn on Fifth Avenue, where she might be taken for Balanchine's freshest ballerina. With her jet black hair, fair skin, deep almond eyes and modest natural grace, she is herself, at 25, a more miraculous work of art than any she can ever create. Giselle is a painter, and has been painting portraits, mostly of foreigners, ever since her husband Andrei, 28, a dissident historian, was barred from serious work by the KGB. Giselle's portrait of Sherry Thompson, the former American Ambassador's daughter, is now in the Thompsons' home in Washington, a gift from his embassy colleages. Of all the human beings we met Russia, Gizelle touched us most deeply - especially my wife Joyce, who saw her far more often, and whose fate crossed theirs at a dramatic moment on the evening of May 7, 1969. Giselle took Joyce to two or three other studios of underground artists, abstract or semiab:tract. These then passed her on in Moscow underground-railway fashion
