So speaking, the President spoke from a middle-America position to the middle-American mind. Most of us cannot bring ourselves to believe in revolution so drastic it feels it has to cut all continuity before it can make change; most of us have difficulty believing that everything America has accomplished and tried to stand for up to this time has been total waste; most of us flinch away from any verdict that, in order to begin into our life on this earth, we must be gin by tearing up our institutions and values inside out. Most of us cling instinctively, although sometimes desture control of civilization's fate by traditional methods and influences, and ease its tensions before they fuse themselves into one terrible explosion. We think that way has to be open: we really can conceive of no other way.

When he himself is at his best, President Nixon is looking for that same possibility which seems the necessity to most of us, and to which he addressed himself as he discussed that great era of the Supreme Court which has indeed brought historic change, but which has managed to do this, in every instance except the one-man-one-vote decisions, without dropping the thread of con-

Heaven knows whether our poor hopes and President Nixon's poor efforts are going to be good enough to keep necessary change funneling through establish-, ed laws and institutions. The hopes seem almost cowardly; the efforts seem mostly fumbles; the current human situation needs some mercy from somewhere. But if there were ever a tableau which might seem to have a chance of drawing down such mercy, it could have been that at the Supreme Court, with the President standing as a symbol of the continuity between a change in Chief Justices.
