Was This Stop Necessary? One hopes that both the government of Rumania and that of the United States know what they are doing, with their mutual arrangement for a visit by the President of the United States to Bucharest on Aug. 2.

In the controlled news of Rumania, the news of the President's scheduled visit received one line on the radio, three lines in the newspapers. But the same news hit like a bomb among the people on the streets.

In Washington, there has been considerable effort on the part of the Nixon administration to cool down and minimize the importance of the visit to Bucharest. But whatever official guidance toward proper emphasis is offered, the public imagination cannot be restrained. It sees that the President is going to be the first American President to go behind the Iron Curtain. It sees that he has selected, for the place of this visit, the one country in Eastern Europe which seems to be maintaining an attitude of some independence from

The public imagination, then cannot refrain from asking what unforeseen consequences might be in store, should, made the signal, by some Rumanian revolutionists, for an attempt to extend Rumania's independence from Moscow to that point at which, in both Hungary felt itself compelled to intervene, no matter how impleasant the consequences or how damaging to Moscow's image. Does the President intent to taunt Moscow with this visit to the rebellious

When the public imagination expresses such a fear, it finds itself tendered various suggestions to the effect that Moscow may roully be a knowing and cooperative partner in the arrangement of the President's itinerary. Perhaps, it is mid, Moscow is helping set Bucharest up as the location for the first scene in a season of summitry between Washington and Moscow.

Well, as we said, one hopes that Washington and Bucharest both know what they are doing, and that Moscow does too, and that all three capitals, the two Communist dictatorships and the one emocracy, have all the cards they intend to play already on the table be-If any good comes of this trip, we

will all be pleased, and relieved.

Katanga And Biafra

When the newly liberated Congo had ta economic and political unity threatened by the attempted secession of Katanga Province, the United Nations itself went into the situation and actually displayed and used armed force on the side of the central government in a civil war which the central government finally won, in a relatively bloodless victory. Moise Tshombe, the Katangese leader who died in an Algerian prison the other day, actually became, for a time, a leader in the central government which had, with outside United Nations help, contested his rebellion for

At the time of the trouble in the Congo. Nigeria seemed, by contrast, one of the most fortunate and mature of the new freedoms in Africa. But, all the while, tribal relationships in Nigeria were becoming intolerable, and we are now confronted with the fact of Biafra's rebeltion and effort to set itself up as a esparate state.

Instead of sending the United Nations to help the central government of Nigeria reestablish control over its rebellious province, the outside world has divided on the issue of Biafra, with a preponderence of sentiment going to the rebels, but with diplomatic respect being accorded the idea that this is merely a civil war, ir which the outside world has no legal right to participate.

Sympathy for Biafra, then, has had, translate itself into humanitarian eforts to see that the Biafrans do not lose y starvation the battle they have not yet lost in the field. It is perhaps thanks to such support in the form of food and nedicine, plus the moral backing it sym-

bolizes, that the Biafran people have been able to continue a struggle that might have been lost long ago.

Now the Nigerian government has announced an end to its tolerance of the International Committee of the Red Cross as an agency for the distribution of such food and medicine, and proclatmed its intention of managing the relief program itself. It may be able to enforce its decree; if so, one imagines that it will be able to see that Biafra, from now on, gets fewer proteins and vitamins to nourish either its stomach or its spirit.

The question arises, as the Tshombe death revives the issue of Katanga, and the Nigerian decision sharpens the issue of Biafra-what makes the rebellion of one province a crime and that of another something noble? How does the outside world arrive at its decision to help stamp out one civil war, but to lend encouragement to another? Or is it a total mistake to expect consistency to play any role in the world's politics for Africa? ... We think we would venture the judg ment opinion that, soiled as Tshombe's motives and fingers may have been and noble as may be the souls of these present day Biafrans, any dispassionately argued case for Katanga and Biafra would have to come out conceding both equal title and right to their own independence.

The Basis Of Bases The Okinawa issue, a burning one in Japan, underscores the broader problem of U.S. oversears bases - and of ne-

cessity the extent to which this country should maintain defense commitments Actually, it has been assumed all tlong that Okinawa would be returned to Japan; the questions concern timing and terms. President Nixon and Secre tary of State Rogers have just been consulting with the Japanese foreign minister, and next fall Mr. Nixon will

be having talks with the Japanese premier. A settlement could come before the year is out, and the formal reversion within a couple of years. The terms currently being rumored include the return of Okinawa and the rest of the Ryukyu chain to Japanese sovereignty coupled with the remova of nuclear weapons but with the U.S. retaining bases. If so, it seems a reasonable deal. Bases on Okinawa are undoubtedly among the most important the U.S. has abroad, but there is no overriding reason why Washington must control the island itself. An acceptable settlement would do much to improve American-Japanese relations. Granting the importance of Oki

nawa bases, it does not follow that the U.S. should indefinitely continue the whole vast network of overseas installations it presently operates. The size' of the total undertaking is a bit staggering: Over 400 major and nearly 3,-000 minor bases in 30 courtries, run by a million servicemen with 500,000 dependents and 250,000 foreign employes, costing \$4 billion to \$5 billion a year. In view of the drain on the nation's balance of payments, in view of the overetension of American military power in general, it seems to us plain reduction of this great military sprawl. President Nixon said yesterday that America is not going to be a "drop-out" from the world, but if the base set-up is overblown, then its reorganization and reduction could contribute to

Proponents of keeping essentially the existing structure argue that to pull back is not necessarily to economize. As a recent survey in the New York Times puts it, "To relinquish distant bases and concentrate forces nearer - or even within - the continental United States might cost more than keeping them where they are, on bases long since paid for." More fundamentally, advocates of the status quo contend that the American military posture vis-a-vis the Communist foes requires a network pretty much as is. We are unpersuaded. For one thing, we would envision not merely a transfer from distant to closer installations but a cutting back on the number and size of the bares. Such was the trend until then President Johnson stepped up the Vietnam involvement in 1965. If the trend could be resumed, it would have


