Not To Fear Our Own Shadows It is a safe guess that most of us who or write the appropriate sentinents on the occasion of this nation's arthday would never—had we been alive back then-have led or even supported the Revolution which gave the original

When we write or speak of America we do so as representatives and members of an establishment; the Revoluion was a combination of inflammatory ntellectuals with irresponsible rabble against the establishment.

We, who draw deep, proud breaths as we think of our country today, are likely to be law and order people. Those who created this country for us were wild ones, acting irrationally and n defiance of existing codes and values.

Now and then some of us law and

order, establishment pens and voices get he idea that perhaps too much pressure or change is building up underneath, nside our happy national structure. In such moments, we reach into our bag of ideological resources, and come out with the noble sentiment that this is a continuing revolution, not any closed, finished story. We assure ourselves that we really believe in change almost as much at we believe in stability: we pretend to be pleased and tolerant, really, about the appearance of lively if ir-

But if we were to confess the truth to ourselves, it would probably have to be that we have no more real instinct toward change than King George had in his day, and that we might think we were gaining peace of mind the quickest and easiest and neatest way if we could hire a few redcoats to sweep radical theories about injustice under the rust.

Perhaps no one could have changed or persuaded King George and his ministers, not even by the most fervent and persuasive prediction of what might come if they did not learn how to recognize the real need for changes in the existing social and political and economic structure of their world.

We, with all our ornate pretenses at liberal understanding, with all our continual admonishment to ourselves to be aware of the fact that we live in a changing world, with all the many signs we are given of pressures already powerful enough to keep erupting in every arena and in every institution - we should have a slightly better chance than King George and his ministers of getting our eyes and minds at least partially open to the "options" of our time. Once again, as it was before, it may be that the way-out intellectuals, the irresponable rabbles, have some kind of freak link to what tomorrow is going to have to be, and that they warry the torch for the real America with as much legitimacy as we, the more stolid ones, bring to our celebration of the Revolution which gave us birth. Left-Handed Praise For Sparrow It should not go unnoticed that the Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station down at New Haven included in its recent discussion of the small white moth infestation an incidental compliment - one long overdue in our - to the most maligned of all

As for the moths in question, they are identified as "ennomos subsignarius" or by some common name, such as "elm span worm" or "snow white linden looper," according to the particular tree whose foliage their larvae happen to be attacking.

There have been previous outbreaks of the snow white landen loopers back in 1935, in 1908 and most seriously of all in the last century, between the years

ent general control of the linden looper is attributed, according to the Experiment Station, "to the work of the English sparrow, which was introduced to destroy linden looper larvae and those of cankerworms in New York State. The English sperrow," the Experiment Station continues, "Itself then became a major nuisance in cities and on farms. As horses disappeared from the cities, the English sparrow population fell sharply. A two-car garage offered little food, compared with a stable."

Too Much Records Tampering

The comparative indulgence with which some Connecticut judgers have of late viewed the crime of tampering with police or court records must concern . every citizen.

Earlier this year Wallingford's former police chief was arrested on charges which included conspiracy to remove records, conspiracy to subvert justice, and removal of records. When his case came before the court, he was allowed to plead guilty to the misdemeanor of obstructing justice, and he was sentenced to three months in fail. Sentence was suspended to the court in view of his

"good record." Similarly, in Waterbury last week Watertown police chief and an agristant prosecuting attorney also pleaded guilty obstructing justice in a case involving altering of police records. In this case, too, the judge granted a suspension of the three-month jail sentence upon plea of guilty, commenting that in view of the status of the defendants and the publicity involved they had probably a been punished enough,

Such a statement from the bench was ill-advised, to put it mildly. What had the "status" of the two defendants to do with their punishment? Would persons of lesser "status" have been given a more seyere centence, one wonders? True, they did not apparently profit personally by their act; they acted altruistically, their attorney said, to prevent a man from having a police re-

But the law cannot afford to play favorites. These men, by reason of their 'status' and their experience with the police and the courts, were under speeigl and sworn obligation to treat all persons impartially. Yet they showed favoritism to one person whom they liked, even to the point of breaking the law themselves in so doing. The question arises: if they were prepared to favor a friend, would they not have been equally inclined to punish an enemy in the same

Because the reputations and careers of thousands of individuals depend upon the ccuracy of police and court records. the public has the right to expect that these records will be kept with meticulous care. They must not be tampered with. When it is found that they have been wrongfully altered, removed, or destroyed, the persons responsible, of whatever "status", must be brought to account. If they are found guilty, they must be punished with a severity commensurate with their misdeed and their betrayal of a public trust If the Connecticut court system is to continue to function impartially, and with equal justice, for all, the records with which the courts deal and upon which they bese their decisions must not be questioned. The people of Connecticut will feel more reassured if the courts take a more serious view of cases of records dampering. -MERIDEN RE-
