All About Mozambique

LOURENÇO MARQUES Mozambique (AP) — At the sidewalk cafe a Portuguese citizen was assuring a visitor that this city abounding with minarets.

Most of the African population live in villages and are farmers. The main diet is manioc, a starchy root from which flour is made and peanuts. Other crops include sorghum, millet, pineapples, potatoes and sweet potatoes, sorghum and rice.

On rare occasions, a raid might strike as above the line. Chances are it is a visit by a visiting boogymen from neighboring South Africa. Rhodesia, where dream lengths are during.

Mozambique, lacking in rich natural resources has long been known as the poor overseas territory of Portugal. Now the mother country, a wealthy industrialized nation, is turning to Mozambique for raw materials and a market for its goods.

The population is about eight million, all black except for 600,000 whites and a scattering of East Indians and Orientals. Lourenço Marques, the capital, has about 300,000 people and is the most important city. Both are seaports.

Mozambique is famous in southern Africa for its seafood. Muscovy, giant prawns, crayfish and other fresh delicacies grace the tables of the smart restaurants of modern hotels and in small, intimate cafes.

At this time Arab ships were continuing a centuries-old trade along the east coast of Africa, gold from the interior made its way to the civilized world through the port of Sofala. Some throwers held that gold mined in what is now Rhodesia was the source of the biblical King Solomon's wealth.

But for the average citizen of Mozambique, white or black, the war is far off. In the main cities and towns, almost the only reminder is the sight of a few young soldiers on leave. Usually in newspapers is a brief monthly campaign giving the number of names. Most of the 40,000 troops in the Mozambique army are Portuguese doing compulsory military service. Locals are subject to the same service and blacks fight alongside whites.

Guiding Area Growth Key Issue, WRPA States in 75-Page Report

Growth of the Windham Region is inevitable, and in terms of land can be amply accommodated. But the question facing the 10-town area is how best to control and guide the growth. To do this "we must have a vision of what the community of the future should be like, this we do not have."

Some of the alternatives for the future are included for consideration in the final chapter of a 75-page Summary Report recently published by the Windham Regional Planning Agency (WRPA), which has its headquarters in Willimantic, Conn. and Columbia are in the town of Coventry, as well as Lebanon, Mendon, Willington, Ashford, Chaplin, Hampton, Windham and Scotland.

The report, entitled "The Regional Community," is the first planning report prepared by the WRPA staff, and represents a summary of data, information and analysis prepared by the staff since June 1967. The report is "meant to provide a background for the important decisions that will have to be made in the preparation of strategies for the continuing development of the WRPA."

The report includes three parts incorporating 12 chapters. The "physical base of the Region" section includes discussion of land and soils. A section on the history of the region includes chapters on the pattern of settlement, the growth of the region and development of the economy.

Finally, a part entitled "The Region—Present and Future" contains seven chapters covering regional structure, land use, economy, transportation, population, plans and prospects. The WRPA covers a total of 328 square miles in the 10-town area, with Willimantic, the chief center of the region, "located in a topographic basin which served as a point of convergence for a number of important streams."

The report notes that "the region had an early and distinguished industrial history which had a marked influence on its urban development." The University of Connecticut in Mansfield, nine miles north of Willimantic, "has many characteristics of an urban center and must be considered as such in many planning matters."

The land in the region that lends itself most to residential development, the report says, is the area around the center of the region, because of both its character and its access. As to transportation, "the highway network tends to converge on Willimantic," and there are some circulation problems. A need for better access to UConn. and provision for better north-south travel.

The report points out that Willimantic has the only public sewer system in the area, and that the towns are mostly unincorporated, with a few, with six of the 10 towns having adopted zoning regulations.

at a town level. But it would mean an unevenly distributed tax burden, whereas balance at the town level would make this more equal. "Community Character" is sufficient as the region grows, with the possibility in the future of both municipal water and sewerage. It would be possible to develop some areas in a more rural atmosphere. The choice between tax revenue and environment is another issue that must be faced. "In a number of cases a choice must be made between developing a particular resource for its value as part of the community environment or developing it so as to produce a tax revenue to the towns."

On housing, the report states, "Low cost housing is needed in Willimantic... the plight of the Spanish speaking newcomers is a direct result of the housing shortage... but would it be better to disperse this housing so that they would become a part of the local culture more quickly? Or would it be better to consciously maintain a concentration so that the process of acculturation would be slower and less painful?" Economically, the Windham Region appears to have the re-creative problem of much of the state. The proportion of low-paying jobs is too high and low-skilled persons willing to work at a low wage level must be attracted to the area. Providing better jobs and training courses for the unskilled will help the particular individuals who are presently employed in low paying jobs, but because they can be expected to be replaced by other unskilled workers with low earning ability will continue to exist.

Vernon Report Offers Plans To Curb Pollution

The Board of Representatives approved an engineering report on the town's filtration plant on Monday night and in the first step of an order issued by the State Water Resources Commission in November 1968.

The report will be turned over to the state commission for approval. The WRPA found that the existing plant, which was constructed some 10 years ago, is not operating at the degree of efficiency required to prevent pollution. The major cause of the problem is the type of industrial wastes going into the system.

As the prime industries in Vernon involve metal finishing or textiles, high concentrations of metallic wastes interfere with the treatment process. The report, prepared by A. Richard Lombardi of Anderson-Nichols & Co., is based on two separate possibilities. The first is that the plant would only serve the town of Vernon, and the other that the plant would serve the areas proposed by the Region Planning Agency.

Vernon is included in a comprehensive regional utilities study being developed by CRPA. Development of this study to date, Lombardi notes, has resulted in the conclusion that portions of the towns of Killington, Holland and Scotland may not be served by connecting them to the Vernon sewage treatment plant.

The engineers concurred with the state commission that the plant is not operating efficiently enough to abate pollution of the river. The engineers find, as related to the industrial wastes discharged into the collection system. "Unless the pollutional load applied to the stream is decreased by more efficient removals in the treatment process, the pollution of the river may be expected to increase significantly with the increase in the sewerage population," the engineers note.

Three Plans Proposed. In suggesting three alternate projects, labeled A, B and C, for correcting the treatment process, the engineers recommend alternate C.

The net capital cost of this proposal would be \$699,000. This amount includes state and federal grants. Alternate B would cost \$222,000 and B, \$789,000. Under A, improvements and additions would be constructed only as necessary to increase the plant removal efficiency until 1975 when the present plant is supposed to reach its capacity.

Alternate B provides for improvements and expanded facilities adequate until 1980 but would be constructed to service Vernon only. Presently small areas of Killam are also serviced by Vernon. Singling out the advantages and disadvantages of the three alternatives, the engineers said the major advantage of A would be that it provides a five-year "grace" period before a decision would be required as to the ultimate service of the plant.

not know yet where the cuts would be made. The United States maintains stable military contingents in such countries as Japan, Spain and Turkey, which presumably would be affected.

The return home of 5,100 civilian employees would come on top of a 4,000 cutback carried out in the past year at the direction of former President Lyndon B. Johnson.

The White House said the reductions will be accomplished so that "essential functions are not impaired and that the cuts are fairly apportioned among the agencies involved."

Stock Market

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market continued to slide lower in slow trading early this afternoon, with losses leading gains by more than 400 million and the Dow Jones Industrial average off more than 6 points.

The DJI at noon was off 6.73 at 865.62. Its closing low for the year of 860.76 was reached June 27. The indicator fell 12.86 points Tuesday, its biggest single-day loss since Feb. 17.

The dull trading, an analyst said, "indicates there's no great rush to sell." And another remarked that there's almost a complete lack of buying interest and no incentive to buy. "The market appears to be falling of its own weight."

Brokers said the market's steep decline Tuesday had made many investors "quite cautious, so you seem to have a lot of cash sitting on the sidelines and waiting to see how much lower the market might go before deciding to get back in and buy."

Concern over the fate of the income tax surcharge estimate bill continues to weigh on the market, an analyst said. Treasury Secretary David M. Kennedy said he would urge and price controls would have to be considered if the extension bill and other inflation controlling methods failed.

Also continuing to curb investor enthusiasm, they said, was the tense Midwest situation as well as an apparent lack of constructive developments.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Democrats hope to get a running start in the 1970 battle for control of Congress by doing out campaign funds much earlier than is customary to Senate and House members seeking reelection.

In the critical contest for control of the Senate, the party campaign committee headed by Sen. Daniel K. Inouye of Hawaii expects to make its fund solicitations early so that members can begin their campaigning as soon as possible.

Traditionally, the committee would wait until after the primaries before handing out money. It would then start to challenge Republican incumbents.

Fourteen of these Democrats will be running in states President Nixon carried last year, 10 in states won by former Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey and one Sen. John Stennis of Mississippi. In deals carried by George C. Wallace.

Of the liberals being aided by McGovern's fund raising committee, Sen. Albert Gore of Tennessee, Harold of Indiana, Mansfield of Montana, Gale W. McGee of Wyoming, Montoya of New Mexico, Frank P. Moss of Utah, William Proxmire of Wisconsin, Symington of Missouri, Harrison Williams of New Jersey and Stephen M. Young of Ohio will have to back McGovern's liberal agenda.

Even though Humphrey carried their states, McGovern thinks there could be rough going for Sen. Philip A. Hart of Michigan, Kennedy of Massachusetts, Edmund S. Muskie of Maine, Joseph D. Tyng of Maryland and Ralph Yarborough of Texas.

Of the eight Republican seats at stake, only two are in states Humphrey carried — Sen. Charles E. Goodell of New York and Hiram L. Fong of Hawaii.

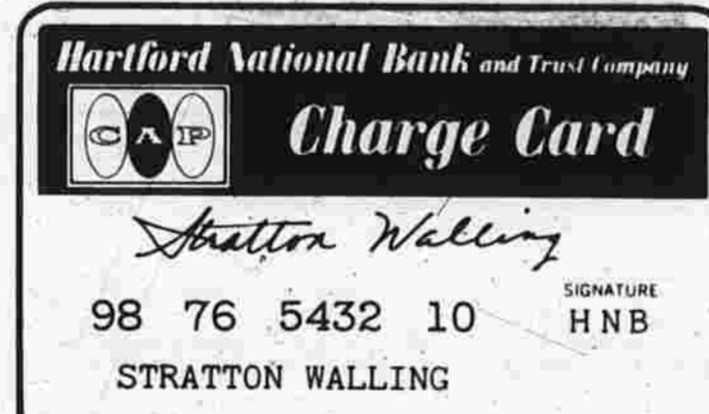

Undemocratic Events Vex Touchy Austrians

VIENNA — Because of their exposed geographical position as a spur of parliamentary democracy reaching into Communist Central Europe, the Austrians are particularly sensitive about observing their constitutional manners. Hence, their reaction at two recent incidents of undemocratic behavior — one from the left and one from the right.

The incident in the opposition Socialist party concerned the left-wing mayor of Vienna, usually a benign father figure. Contrary to his usual calm, Mayor Marek ordered the forcible expulsion from the city council chamber of a former Socialist Minister of Interior, Franz Olah, who had left the party and been elected a Vienna municipal councillor at the recent election. While being hauled out of his seat by the city guard, Olah suffered bruises.

Olah had some time earlier been sentenced to a year's imprisonment for illegal manipulations with trade union funds. But he had appealed and the Vienna City Constitution contains a clause that nobody may serve as a councillor who has been sentenced for a crime. This is not disputed but the Socialists' opponents claim that the clause is against the principles of law because it penalizes a man before his sentence has become absolute.

The right-wing Austrian government is placing the question of the legality of the clause before the constitutional high court. The Socialists point out that the clause has existed since 1860 and that the constitutions of six of Austria's nine federal states contain similar clauses.

What Mayor Marek is special-

ly blamed for is that he ordered the use of force against a councillor, instead of simply closing the council meeting and ordering the guard not to let Olah in next time. Marek is said to have lost his nerve in dealing with his one-time party colleague. For this he has been criticized even by newspapers close to the Socialists. Opponents of the Vienna Socialists have even suggested that Marek was purposely badly advised by colleagues who wanted to make him resign and replace him with the vice-mayor.

The governing People's Party meanwhile has, through an undemocratic lapse, temporarily lost a seat in parliament. After a row within the People's Party the education minister, Dr. Theodor Puffr-Prozovic, resigned from the government and also gave up his parliamentary seat. Normally the next man on the list of the People's Party would have automatically succeeded him through the Austrian system of proportional representation. Mayor Evers Tackles Job

FAYETTE, Miss. (AP) — Mayor Charles Evers guided his administration—all-Negro except the city attorney—through the final day of operation Tuesday and then set about fulfilling a campaign promise—removing junked cars from the streets.

Evers, five of his race elected mayor of a biracial Mississippi city since Reconstruction days, and the five-man Board of Aldermen were confronted with a lengthy and confused agenda at their opening session.

Selection of new department heads, consideration of a budget and repealing segregation ordinances stretched the meeting into several hours.

Then Evers joined with three aldermen in a tour of a shabby Negro section of this southwest Mississippi town of 1,000, pointing out many abandoned cars.

"These wrecks are real hazards," he said. "Can you imagine what would happen if a child fell in this mess or accidentally locked himself up in a truck with no one around? This is the only white employe to her hand during swearing in ceremony."

Evers admitted he was having difficulty enlisting whites for new jobs. While participating in the city government dropped to zero shortly after he was elected in April.

The absence of whites was noticeable at Monday's inauguration ceremonies, and even more so when city employees arrived at the special meeting Tuesday.

Miss Martha Wood, former aide, to a civil rights group and the new city attorney, was with no one around? This is the only white employe to her hand during swearing in ceremony.

"There are some whites who are better," a white woman within an empty aspirin box in their areas. We are, "but I think most are just

going to change all this, though."

Evers was forced to step lively along one narrow street after efforts by a wrecker produced a broken wrecker in one of the jammed cars.

"These houses ought to be condemned," he said. "We are seeking federal aid in building new homes for the poor, but we can't expect much until they come down and see the conditions for themselves."

"But first we've got to clean the area up."

Evers' administration, as mayor of its first official act, quickly repealed a two-year-old ordinance which endorsed the state's segregation laws—most of which have been overturned in court.

Viet Villagers Head Home, Thief Jargon For Guards

BANG LANG, Vietnam (AP) — After four years, the old man was going home.

"It was a long trip; he had only to go down the narrow road a couple of miles and cross the river to Kien Ngoc, the hamlet he and 200 neighbors abandoned to the Viet Cong in 1965."

"The government has told us we have to leave," he said. "But who will protect us? We must replant our rice and rebuild our homes, but the government hasn't given any money to help us."

Before the refugees had found themselves in between warring government and Viet Cong forces and had fled before they found themselves in the middle of another struggle.

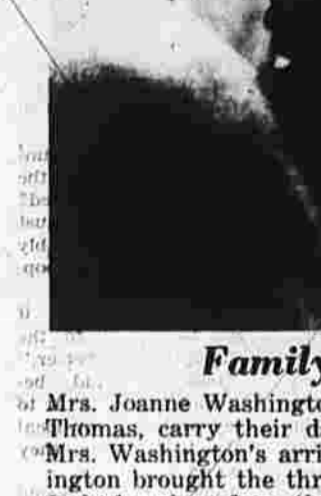

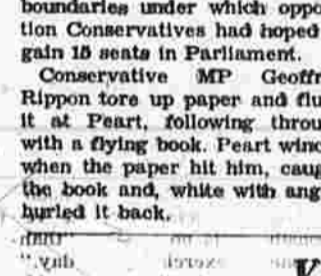

Touring Russians Dislike Many American Things

NEW YORK (AP) — They didn't say "No!" But aside from the praise they bestowed upon American hospitality and our well-planned kitchens, the Russian youth group's attitude toward most things American was largely disapproving.

The secret visit to the United States of the 27 men and 4 women, the largest group of Soviet youth to visit this country in five years, had reactivated an exchange agreement between the Council on International Educational Exchange of New York and the Bureau of International Youth Tourism (Sputnik), a Soviet organization. The two organizations began exchanging youth groups in 1968, but the Soviet agency had sent no groups here since 1964.

The Russians, most of whom were in their early 30s, came from all parts of the Soviet Union and represented a variety of professions ranging from teaching to engineering. Among them were several engineers, a student, an economist, an engine driver and a journalist.

Their 29-day tour included stopovers at an elementary school in Hartford, Conn., an urban renewal program in Albany, N.Y., an educational television station and a food plant in Pittsburgh, Old Burbidge Village—recreated colonial village—in Massachusetts, and general sight seeing in and around Philadelphia, Niagara Falls, Washington, D.C., and New York.

They met, civic leaders, were introduced to their professional counterparts, and lived with several American families. But if they were impressed by anything other than the American people themselves, they were loathe to discuss it. Surrounded by interpreters and "official representatives," they sat stone-faced, their downcast eyes betraying not a flicker of emotion. Even a question about the wide variety of consumer goods found in our supermarkets—a generally acknowledged area of American superiority—elicited only shrugs.

Their enthusiasm was reserved for the families with whom they had stayed. As Ivan Ivanovich Khodov, the agricultural engineer who served as the group's leader, enthused: "The first thing the Pittsburgh architect, with whom I stayed, said was 'Make yourself at home.' And he meant it."

Other aspects of American life provoked much more negative responses. "Why are there so many cars?" they asked. "Why are there so many houses with swimming pools?"

"You may lose your ill gotten gains... Inch by beautiful inch. It's better. It's Borden.

Stamps In the News

ALABAMA AP Newsfeatures

A red camellia in full bloom and a yellowhammer bird on a limb are featured on the 6-cent Alabama stamp to be issued on Aug. 2 as part of a gala year-long celebration in that state. The first day sale will be Huntville, the temporary seat of Alabama's government in 1810.

The camellia is Alabama's state flower and the yellowhammer is the state bird. The design was the creation of Bernice Kochan who won a contest conducted in Alabama. It is interesting to note that a few months ago Miss Kochan, a Cleveland commercial artist, was the victor in a similar contest sponsored by the Memphis Seagull-centennial for the W.C. Handy stamp. She is the second woman in postal history to have designed two U.S. stamps in one year.

Collectors desiring first day cancellations may send addressed envelopes, together with remittance to cover the cost of the stamps to be affixed, to the Postmaster, Huntville, Alabama 35864. The outside envelope should be endorsed "First Day Covers for Alabama Statehood Stamp." Cover requests must be postmarked no later than Aug. 2.

The young celebration sponsored by the Alabama Bicentennial Commission will focus attention on the history of an area over which five flags flew—Spanish, French, English, Confederate and U.S.

Hip Breaks More Often In Women

NEW YORK (AP) — Broken hips are one bone of older age, and often the victims are women.
The incidence is in fact far greater among women says Dr. Benjamin S. Fowler of Chicago, president of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons.
Bone surveys find that 80 per cent of fractures of the hip occur among people aged 60 or more.
The reason for women's greater susceptibility to fractures of the hip appears to be related basically to hormonal changes coming on after menopause, Dr. Fowler says. Women undergo such hormonal changes earlier than men, and the changes are more drastic.
Women also become more subject to heart attacks, brought on by atherosclerosis or clogging of heart arteries, after menopause. They then produce less estrogen, the female sex hormone, which apparently helps protect younger women from the artery disease.
Stress from childbirth is not considered a factor in women's higher susceptibility to hip fractures. And there doesn't seem to be any difference between the tendency of men or women to develop calcification or brittleness of bone, Dr. Fowler remarks.
Most fractures result from falls that occur because of weakness of the bone structure in the hip, so fractures occur under stress, in most cases, an elderly man merely reached down to tie his TV set, and the neck of the hipbone gave way, writes Dr. Charles V. Heck, director of the Academy.
Eating a well-balanced diet offers one way of counteracting demineralization and softening of bone, he adds. Many widows, living alone, pay less attention than before to meal planning, and do not eat enough meat, fish, milk or other protein.
Surgical repair of the fracture, balanced diet, and early ambulation to improve muscle tone and blood circulation are factors in improved treatment of hip fractures in the elderly.

What To Wear To Fight U.S.

NEW YORK (AP) — North Vietnamese women have been advised that there are certain "fashions" that are "un-American," according to a translation from the North Vietnamese magazine "The Phoenix" which appeared in the July issue of Atlas magazine, a digest of the world's news.
"A beautiful and serious dress symbolizes a clear, simple, optimistic and working mind. Tight cowboy pants and waist-line under the navel suggest the hips and thighs of boys and girls are so bad an idea with plunging necklines that suggest the front showing the belly and armpit, or the thick and pointed hair style that makes the hair look like a helmet."
"It is quite wrong to say that all dresses are good except to fight the American war," the magazine continues. "Today's dress must be practical, sensible and reasonably appealing. It should discreetly and modestly enhance the beauty of the body without being provocative."
Grants to Unproduced Writers
NEW YORK (AP) — The Dramatists Guild Fund gave four \$1,000 awards to young people chosen by their organizations, as having distinguished a literary work for the theater.
Recipients were Larry A. Reed, University of Wisconsin; Mark Lasker, Northwestern University; Harold Levy, City College of New York; and Romanus Strong, the University of California at Los Angeles.
The awards were in memory of Elmer Rice, Howard Lindsay and Oscar Hammerstein II.
In previous years, the fund, which was set up in 1962, was used to provide financial assistance during illness or to complete a writing project.

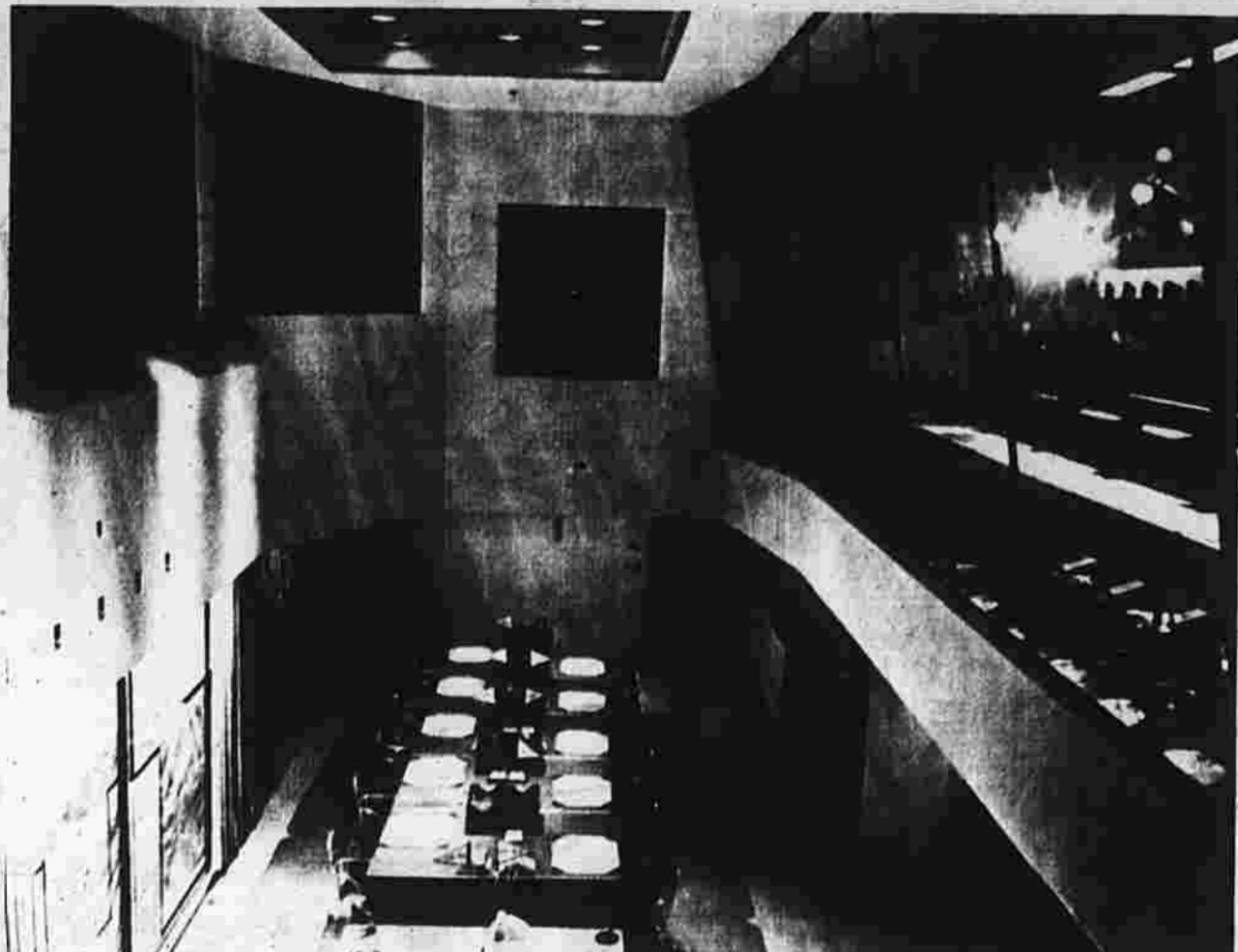
