FAA Aide **Asks Change** In Controls

ATLANTA, Gs. (AP) - The nation's air traffic control system is "strained to the utmost" and needs complete revision. Federal Aviation Administrator John H. Shaffer said Tuesday

In an address to the Air Lines Pilots Association's air tafety forum, Shaffer said use of computers on the ground and on board aircraft is the answer. He said the computers would put "navigational control of airplanes back in the cockpit" and cut down on the work of control-

"The pilot will navigate the aircraft and the controller will perform the task he can do most efficiently namely, monitor the system," Shaffer said. He acknowledged "it will take a while" to get the new, sophisticated equipment into a signifcant number of aircraft. He said the first step in mak-

ing more efficient use of air space is rearranging air routes on the basis of aircraft capability - separating aircraft by air-William Flener, the FAA's director of air traffic safety, told the pilots he agreed that the air traffic control system is "a sick system" which is undermanned, without a backup and uses out-

BRUSSELS (AP) - West European governments are all for cow and Washington trying to halt the arms race, but they fear the United States may trade away their security. Diplomats report member nations of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization are seeking reassurances from Philip Farey, deputy assistant secretary of state and No. 2 U.S. negotiator in the proposed strategic arms limitation talks.

The diplomats say NATO members fear the United States might trade away weapons that protect Western Europe in return for Soviet concessions on missiles the two superpowers have aimed at one another. They point out that Polaris submarines and strategic bombers are more useful for defending Europe than intercontinental missiles in American si-

Besides worrying about what Washington might give up for a reduction in Soviet missiles trained on the United States, West Europeans also are concerned about possible U.S. viet missiles trained on Western
