And honesty might say that, although the spokesmen for West Germany and the United States have had a fine and profitable propaganda time of it denouncing the brutal reality and the inhuman symbolism of the Bersomething had been done to halt what was getting to be an embarrassing and potentially explosive surge of East Germans toward the more attractive conditions of West Germany.

The West Germans really didn't want the East Germans moving in on their prosperity and their employment lists, and the United States didn't want Rus sia hurt and humiliated to such an extent it might undertake something much more violent than the building of a wall. We had previously had an opportunity to try to give encouragement and fuel to an East German revolt against the Russians, and had chosen not to do so because we didn't want to start fighting World War III right away, from World War II's front lines.

Present indications and evaluations are that there is no longer quite the con-East and West Germany that there was eight years ago. The historic West German boom has passed its peak, and is beginning to show strain. East Germany, on the other hand, has recently begun cooming. On the economic side, at least, then, the need for an artificial barrier

But in other respects, the recent trend has not necessarily been toward greater equalization between East and West. A phase of liberalization inside Russia has, after making many substantial gains, begun to fade and to be succeeded by ome touches of reaction. What should be is this: a German who ives in East Germany should be free to go anywhere and live anywhere he pleases; and a Russian who decides he wants to live in Britain should not feel required to disappear and then ask asyum. The pamphlet in question, with its savage attacks on Ivory Coast ernment officials, apparently led to the Ivory Coast decision to break diplointeresting cloak and dagger

sibility is that the pamphlet in question was not written, printed or circulated by the Russians at all, but by our CIA, which was clever enough to make it seem to be a Russian publication. Perhaps, on reflection, we are giving the CIA too much credit for originality. Way back in 1964, in another new African country, Tanzania, the Russians pulled a s'y one of their own. They planted on the Tanzanian government a series of forgeries which made it appear that the CIA was helping to organize a plot to overthrow that government, and Tanzania almost, but not

quite, broke off diplomatic relations with

Kennedy's appeal was predictsh'e, And ro was his announcement yesterday that he would indeed remain as Senator from Massachusetts and seek re-election next year. Both the appeal and h's speedy "response" suggest a carefully worked-out plan to re-establish him rolltical position in the eyes of the voters of his state. His position as a candidate for the Presidency is quite he has now wisely deferred until 1976 by his promise to rerve the full Senatorial term if he is re-elected. When he ostensibly asked the electorate for "advice," Senator Kennedy was really asking for an outpouring of support on the basis of a partially irrelevant and totally unsatisfactory exparte account of the tragic events of the night and early morning of July 18-19. We make this observation only with the greatest regret and reluctance. We have deepest sympathy for the victims and, quite apart from the perronal and human considerations, have nothing but admiration for the political position taken by this riging young leader of the liberal forces of the United States Senate. But it is just because Senator Ken-

nedy is essertially a public rather than a private person, a man who is not Senator of the United States but widely considered to be a potentialeven probable—candidate for the Presidency of the United States, that it is remary carefully and objectively to examine his conduct in times of extreme
