

More Hell On Earth

When President Nixon originally made his compromise decision on the ABM we thought that he had probably come as So rarely is it used these days one close to the actual will of the nation itself as was possible. People everywhere have been, and continue to be, as troubled and confused on the issue of antimissile missiles as are, say the more learned and informed members of the United States Senate. The people, not sure that either side of the controversy is right, probably preferred some kind of compromise. The President, afraid to take risks whose magnitude no man could be sure of, sought such a compromise. And now, by the narrowest of possible margins, the opposing convictions, punishment in Connecticut. instincts, and characters of the mem-That only killers who have gone in bers of the United States Senate have

endorsed the President's compromise. The essence of the ABM controversy is this: that the two apprehensions—the one the apprehension of the kind of renewed arms race this may lead to-the other the apprehension of what risks might be run in a harsh world if we did not set this up for ourselves-are about equally balanced.

This is a tragic situation and a perhaps hopeless dilemma for a democracy, but it is, obviously enough, what almost automatically derives from the present context of history and world behavior

This is precisely the way great peoples bind themselves almost blindly into great tragedy.

But the cure for it is not to wish that one side or the other could have won a more definite victory, or to wish that the country could have escaped being momentarily under the control of the somewhat whimsical logic of a lady Senator who managed to resolve the great problem for herself individually by voting both ways on the same issue.

The cure for all this feeling of fated hopelesquess is for men to try to grab hold of their own destinies instead of letting brute and uncaring circumstance ride human flesh and spirit toward the creation of more hell on earth.

With all due respect to the individual conscience tortures of 100 United States Senators yesterday, the actual pattern of their voting was more that of robots already programmed to operate inside a hopeless context.

They were, in essence, choosing between two negatives.

In such a choice, there can be no real victory for anybody.

The Junk Planet

The latest statistic on the steady increase in what we Americans throw away now takes us up to three years ago, to the year 1966.

In that year, each one of us 200,000, 000 Americans threw away 121 pounds more of discarded packaging material than we had done eight years before that, in 1958.

And by 1976, at our present rate, each of us will be discarding 136 more pounds

There was a time, of course, about 90 years ago, when the amount of packiging thrown away by the average American probably totaled less than five counds per capita per year. Then nothng was thrown away until it had broken.

One of the single items in this increas in our junk piles is the "no-deposit, no return" bottle. Before this came along, the usual bottle lasted for about 20 fillings. That means that glass companies now have to make 20 bottles for each bottle they made before. In 1958, there were 1,400,000,000 non-returnable bottles used for soft drinks and beer. In 1966 the figure had gone up to 7,000,000,000. And in 1976, unless we change, the number will be 22,100,000,000.

Just our empty bottles will engulf us, and we will have all the rest of our modern trash-the papers we are forbidden to burn, the plastics we can't burn, the automobiles we can't afford to process -left over to form a magnificent desolation to welcome some future visitor to

We seem to keep on doing this, and escalating this-the production of future junk-blindly while we concentrate our worry on the search for space and methods for the disposal of unlimited quantities of indestructible materials.

But the really significant research will be at the front end of the process, and it will be looking for packaging materials and methods which will leave some room on earth for people.

The question today is whether the state is morally correct in taking the life of a murderer. Surely, it is an efmeans of removing any future threat from this source permanently from society. But a lot of people believe the state ought to take other means to remove the threat of a killer from

In the courts, of course, each case of first degree murder is tried on its own evidence, and we are not talking about findings of guilt or acquittal, but of state policy with regard to capital punish-

The quarrel over whether capital punishment is a deterrent has been rendered almost academic by the infrequency with which it is applied. But there is nothing particularly wicked about making whatever penalty the state imposes severe enough to serve as a deterrent. Neither is there anything essentially alien to the determination of a proper sanction to say that it is important that society has every right to protect itself from the killer who may prey upon still other innocent lives if he is at large. And if society has an obligation to the rehabilitation of the criminal, has it not also a duty to devise

some measure of compensation to the

families of his victims? It is certainly possible, if we abolish capital punishment, to provide adequately for all these factors. Most of the opposition to abolishing the death penalty stems from a lack of conviction on the part of much of the public that the law will adequately cover these considers-Those who would carry the abolition of capital punishment might devote their energies to devising convincing alternate aunctions which would embrace all these elements. - ANSONIA EVE-
