Recent attention to this nation's deelopment of chemical and bacteriological warfare resources, together with revelation of its actual use of some forms of gas in Vietnam, has kept reminding everybody that the United States is the only important world power which has never ratified the Geneva

Signers of the Geneva Protocol bound themselves not to be the first to use the types of weapons covered by the

The United States itself led in proposing the Geneva Protocol, as a means of guarding against more of the poison gas used in World War I. Then, unaccountably, the Senate never ratified the Protocol.

Perhaps we didn't bother to ratify bethat we thought everybody would automatically trust us not to be the first to use such terribly inhumane weapons.

selves the first to use an atomic bomba weapon whose horror is so great that in the 1924 Geneva Protocol if the statesmen of that time had seriously imagined it would ever be available. The fact that we did make ourselves

the first to use the atomic bomb, coupled with the controversy over what kind of gas we have used in Vietnam and how we have used it, has now raised the question of whether, for all our selfancied virtues, we would rather be outside such a thing as the Geneva Protocol than inside it, as a signer and rati-

It is in an effort to bring us to a clarification of our own principles and our own willingness to accept prescribed standards of military conduct that Congressman Emilio Daddario of this district is now introducing in Congress a resolution asking President Nixon to esubmit to the United States Senate

the Geneva Protocol of 1925. "Our nation's failure to ratify this protocol, which the United States originally proposed, has troubled me for long time," said Congressman Dadchemical and bacteriological agents into the environment has been a topic about which my Subcommittee on Science, Research and Development has

been greatly concerned." Congressman Daddario's call for a United States ratification of the Protocol was taken up, a few days later, by Senator Abraham Ribicoff. We do not think so, particularly when the individual involved happened to be the same "Sam the Plumber" character revealed as one of the big shots in the Jersey Mafia by those FBI tapes recently made public.

And we entertain the suspicion that any other resident of that particular New Jersey community could happen to be going 52 miles an hour without be-

ing picked up, or prosecuted. This was, we suppose, a New Jersey suburb's way of telling a notorious character he was no longer welcome there. and ought to move himself out.

But the assumption involved in this righteously indignant persecution of one notorious indivdual — the assumption that the law and its operations can be bent and adjusted one way or another, or enforced more equally against some than against others, is precisely the same kind of assumption on which the Mafia bases its own existence and operations. Law, at its best, is impersonal and unflappable.

As the ad eays, nearly everything has changed, and not in all ways for
