NLRB Rules P&W Wrong In Firings

WASHINGTON (AP) -Pratt & Whitney Aircraft was in violation of the National Labor Relations act when it discharged two employes at its Connecticut plants and suspended another for five days, an examiner for the National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) reports. Examiner Ivar H. Peterson recommended to the NLRB that the three employes, discharged or suspended because of alleged union activities on company time, be reinstated with full re stitution of lost earnings, plus six per cent interest.

Pratt & Whitney, a Division of United Aircraft Corp., had suspended Dariel Wing from his job at the company's Middle town plant last Sept. 14, discharged Thoeodore Ardensk from his job at the East Hartford plant last Aug. 24, and dis charged Thomas Wiseman from his job at the Manchester plan Jan. 14 of this year. The NLRB examiner's recom mendation said, "Wing, Arden ski and Wiseman were not guilty as accused of soliciting union

membership during working hours." The examiner added: "I infer and find; from the re cord considered as a whole, that the discipline inflicted upon them was based upon the respondent's (Pratt and Whitney) hostility to their active support of the union." The union the International Association of Machinists, AFL-CIO, also had claimed that the company had violated the Labor Relations Act by confiscating union cards which a fourth employe was turning over to Wing during working time.

Miranda Decision Doomed?

The celebrated and perhaps much maigned Miranda decision, in which the Supreme Court of which Earl Warren was Chief Justice held that police quesioning of suspects was invalid unless eccompanied by all the proper warnings, came into being by a Supreme Court vote of 5 to 4.

Now that Earl Warren has been succeeded by Chief Justice Warren Burger the Miranda decision is likely to be tempered or even wiped out altogether. This reversal in the course of high

But now-when and if the Americans themselves suddenly seem capable of permitting themselves a little common sense, a little historical perspective, a little geopolitical realism in their own attitude—all our client states in the Pacific suddenly find themselves privileged to use their own common sense too. If America itself is crawling out of its long post-Yalu nightmare in the Pacific, perhaps our client states no longer have to keep pretending the nightmare is so real it frightens them too.

But it is hard for a great power ever to tell for sure how genuine a reaction it is getting from those smaller nations who find themselves in the same ocean.
