The Orphaned Noble Experiment One of Japan's professional militarists caught himself saying the other day that 'attack is the best defense," and immediately asked that he not be quoted or identified with such a statement. It was something he, as a general, believed, but not something he was quite

ready, yet, to say and defend openly. The reason is that Japan is still pretending to live in some surface legal conformity with the provisions of its own constitution, which forbid it to maintain military forces of any kind other than "self defense" forces.

Under this Constitution, Japan's military forces must be called "Self-Defense Forces" and Japan's tanks must be called "special vehicles," and its Maritime Self-Defense Force can contain destroyer escorts but no cruisers or aircraft carriers, and its planes, whatever their capacity, must be called fighter planes and never bombers, or fighter-bombers. The Constitution which requires such elaborate hypocrisy was the Constitution

given to Japan by the late General Douglas MacArthur, who had one period of great clairvoyance when he warned that nobody would survive another world war to reject it. and when he designed for Japan the super safety of a pacifist Constitution which would have to become, he said, the model for the rest of the world, too. Not only was this Constitution given to Japan by the United States. It also, among the Japanese themselves — so
