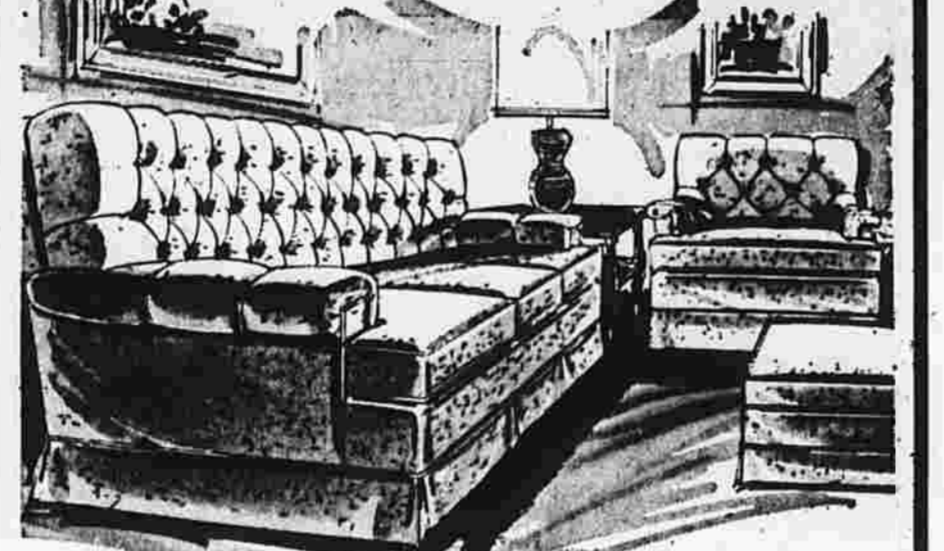

Army Asked to Explain Failure to Avoid Deafness

WASHINGTON (AP) — The 164 deaths on rifle ranges, far above the 150-decibel damage point; 120 deaths in tanks, above the pain level; and even noisier situations when artillery and tank cannon are fired.

One of the possible protections suggested as standard by Dr. Jerry L. Northern, chief audiologist at Water Reed Army Hospital, is the type of ear muffs used by civilian airport crews.

Melvin R. Laird in another letter to explain why the separate services haven't joined to prevent ear damage from the noise of weapons during training.

"It's unexplainable for one service to be doing nothing and another to be doing nothing and none of them coordinated," Rogers said.

In an interview Rogers also said the government has a double standard on prevention of deafness—requiring that contractors of the Defense Department to keep decibel level low while needlessly exposing troops in training to damaging noise.

In his letters to Laird and Rogers, Rogers cited an Associated Press report that thousands of soldiers in training suffer significant hearing losses because the Army doesn't provide proper ear protection.

"We have a stake in assuring that every man who enters combat is physically fit and not in any way hampered by such major or minor hearing difficulties which apparently have been resulting from this exposure to noise in boot camp," Rogers wrote to Laird.

"Needless to say, this government is endeavoring to do its best in being of every serviceman who enters combat zones with a hearing defect," Rogers added.

Rogers noted that the Walsh-Healey Act requires the Defense Department to refuse contracts to anyone exposing workers to noise levels above 90 decibels.

At the same time, he pointed out, servicemen are exposed to
