Prices Ignore The Economists Somewhere in some academic grove we hope, some think tank of economists is figuring out and setting down a new

They will be laws which tell us things as they are, not as they might be in

set of laws for our economics.

They would be laws which would bring us up to date, not leave us stranded in the long ago first half of this century. And they would be laws which might conceivably be of some help in guiding our efforts to do something about controlling our own economy.

At the moment, our economists are still bemused and confused by the persistence of an inconsistency which first appeared during the so-called Eisenhower recessions-periods in which, once upon President Eisenhower's own urging. the economy and production and the market place slowed down. These not too cataclysmic recessions

yielded, happliy enough, to a gradual resumption of boom. But during the period when they were being taken seriously, with some alarm, people out of the job market, the better they demonstrated one baffling charac- it is for our economy as a whole.

There was no decline in prices. The economic signals of the moment pointed to over-production from the factories, excess inventories in commerce, a slow down in the public purchasing instinct, and an increase in unemployment. But not all these signals together operated to produce that decline in prices such threatening conditions are normally supposed to indicate, in a logical econ-

Prices kept going up, even in the midst of recession. However we did get out of these recessions, it was not through any of that deflation which might have been considered realistic and healthy. Our condition today is not directly

comparable. We are not yet in a recession, merely in a period when we are trying to pour a little cool water on our inflation before it does take itself on to the point where it might take a recession spelled depression to cure it. But there is this comparison: measures

being taken in the effort to cool down and restrain the economy are having no effect on the continuing climb of prices. We can see that we are in some present trouble. We can see that some sales have begun to slip, which may mean that we are over-inventoried and over-produced, and, therefore, over-employed. We can concede that we may need to go through some period of readjustment and scaling

But there is no evidence that the serious news is having any cautionary effect on the course of prices, and no real expectation that, if we do have to go through a period of scaling down, the scaling down will ever reach into the realm of prices.

The actual behavior of prices in our modern economic fluctuations might suggest that one of the new laws the economists should write, for their own guidance and our enlightenment, is this; that in time of diminishing employment, purchasing power profits, and sales, prices shall go up. After they have written the new law,

will they explain it, please?

"This Country Is Degree Crazy" To be sure the professor who stood up before the conference of school superintendents at Teachers College in New York the other day was a professor of business, not a professor of education. Nonetheless, what Professor Eli Ginsberg had to say must have had the ring of truth for many members of his audience of professional educators, even though they might not choose to agree with him publicly.

that we have oversold education as a cure-all, the "solution to all problems," "There are," he said, "a lot of myths about the importance of higher education. One is that you can earn more money with more education. Long-distance

He could have gone on with examples of that kind, selected from any of the current news about the number of dollars per hour fixed in new union scales for various crafts.

As for education itself, he said, some of the best-educated people have got nemselves that way without much formal higher education. He would have more schools, for those

who really want them and can use them. But Professor Ginsberg wouldn't consider endiess years of higher education for everyone any kind of way to build a good, sound society. "This country," he said, "is degree crazy." Rather, he looked with some approval

on the system other countries have for moving young people out of school and into their crafts at an earlier age. The age of 14, which West Germany sets, he considered a little early, but he approved the British system of putting noncollege students into the economy at the age of 15, and the Russian system of doing the same thing at the age of 16. In order to head in this direction, we in this country would have to change the

laws which set the legal age for leaving

at an earlier and earlier age with every

school. That is a shocking thought for most of us, for most of us are indeed, as Professor Ginsberg says, in love with the lea of schooling as an end in itself. But, on the other hand, our modern sociological, physiological and mental development statistics all say that young people are now reaching maturer levels

> passing year. We now rate the physical and mental evelopment of the present school generation as at least two or three years ahead of the standards of 30 or so years ago. That means, for some students of our educational time table, that we have in high school people old enough, physically and mentally, to be either in college or in the economy. There is a kind of war in progress between the rate of development of our youth, which suggests they ought to be processed through the educational system earlier, and the theory that the longer we keep young

attitude toward education-pernaps the single thing, next to money itself, that mough validity to Professor Ginsberg's nain point to keep it alive, and perhaps give it increasing leverage in our future national thinking and decisioning about educational policies.

#### The Four Paradoxes

If we attempt to be realistic, to be objective and larsighted, about internaional affairs today, what do we see see four particularly dramatic and isturbing paradoxee. The first paradox is that, while na-

ional armament is of course designed to promote national accurity, and never history have nations been so well armed, yet never have they been so ns:cure. Never would the actual use the full range of ready arms be so certainly fatal to so much of mankind and to civilized society. And in a certain ense precisely those nations which are he best armed are the most insecure ecause they would be the first targets if a nuclear war should tragically occur. This is no one's fault it is a consequence of techno'ogical advance in venponry — but it does impose on the leaders of those best-armed states an normous responsibility to find means of meaning from this hideous and stupid

The second paradox is that, while echnology each year knits the world more closely together, while we can see around it in seconds and fly around it in hours, its people continue to be more and more fragmented into separate naional sovereignties, more than 130 of them at latest count. And each of thes ations insists on unrestricted independ ence to do exactly what it likes, preciseg at a time when the interdependence each and all is becoming more and nore peremptory.

The third paradox is that just when cience seems at long last to have solved the problem of production, when the gross national product of the developed nations is growing by leaps and bound when poverty is no longer inescapable he gap between rich and poor nations rtill widening rather than re-rowing The fourth paradox is related to the third. It is that our very triumphs if ungoverned can bring us to disaster but the triumphs of medicine may inrease our population to the point of asphyxiation and breakdown, that the triumphs of engineering and chemistry. may fatally pollute our air, water and soil, that the triumphs of communication and surveillance may be misused to disorient or dominate the masses
