



U.S.S.R. And U.S.A. Please Note Russia, and the United States, the two great powers which have put such great stakes into the partition of Germany, had better take a casual look at the latest statistics concerning trade between the two halves of the nation

The amount of trade between East and West Germany for the first six months of this year went up 26 per cent over the figure for the same period

During first half of 1969 West Germany delivered \$228,000,000 worth of goods to East Germany, and bought back \$188,000,000 worth.

East and West Germany are doing this much business with each other without really trying, either. But it is likely to increase at a swifter pace from now on as East Germany, which is now experiencing some of the resurgence West Germany had almost immediately after the War, progresses into the production of a wider list of finished products.

The Russian-American big power policy which preferred to split Germany and allot half to each big power instead of daring to get out and let a united Germany decide its own polities and affiliaions in the world seems just as deeply ocked into its old dead end self as ever.

But, around the ends of the Berlin wall, and over the artificial boundaries of big power zones of influence, the two Germanies are managing to do more and more trade with one another.

This is not only inevitable, but it is

based on an unnatural division of the German nation cannot be sound. The Germans themselves will not

stand for it forever. The danger to peace is that Russia and the United States will try to im-

pose their partition of mutual fear too

In their diplomacy, which has never been totally ignorant of the direction in which they really should be heading, the United States and Russia have generally placed their own withdrawal from the two Germanies, leaving the way clear for reunification, at the very end of their schedule of things that ought to

None of this bothers me very much although I'm not a pothead myzelf (I don't like the cmell, and can't be bothered acquiring all the mystical lore that goes with smoking the stuff). I think men are responsible for their own sins; all over th's town on any given night there are thousands of people getting bom'sed out on whiskey and beer, and

most of them seem to be friends of m'ne; if that's the way they want to go, it's their decision. The trouble is that while my friends and I are getting slowly juiced at the Liens Head, there are kids being lock-

ed up for doing the same thing with other tools. The courts are jammed; the lawyers are working overtime; the prirons are bursting. And all of this over something that is rolled in paper, Any system of life in Europe which is lit and smoked. It's bizarre.

Corsider, if you will, how we would feel if our agtronauts reported back from Mars that some of the inhabitants were jailing other inhabitants because they were ingesting some of the vegetation of Mars. We would think they were a peculiar lot of savages at best, and probably send them a gross of rotestant missionaries at worst. And yet this is exactly what we are

doing right now in our own semi-civilized rociety. The few studies that have been made show that marijuana is not "hysically addicting, causes considerab'y less brain damage than heavy rinking, and does not cause hangovers. ts users seem to be considerably less v'o'ent than drinkers (imagine the scene if there had been 400,000 beer drinkers t Woodstock, instead of the same number of heads). And though it would be rather difficult to say that marijuana is good for you, it is equally difficult to say that it is bad. It is bad, however, for other rea sons, all dealing with its illegality. In the last year, we've seen the arrest of

Wether they are found guilty or not, that record stays with them.
