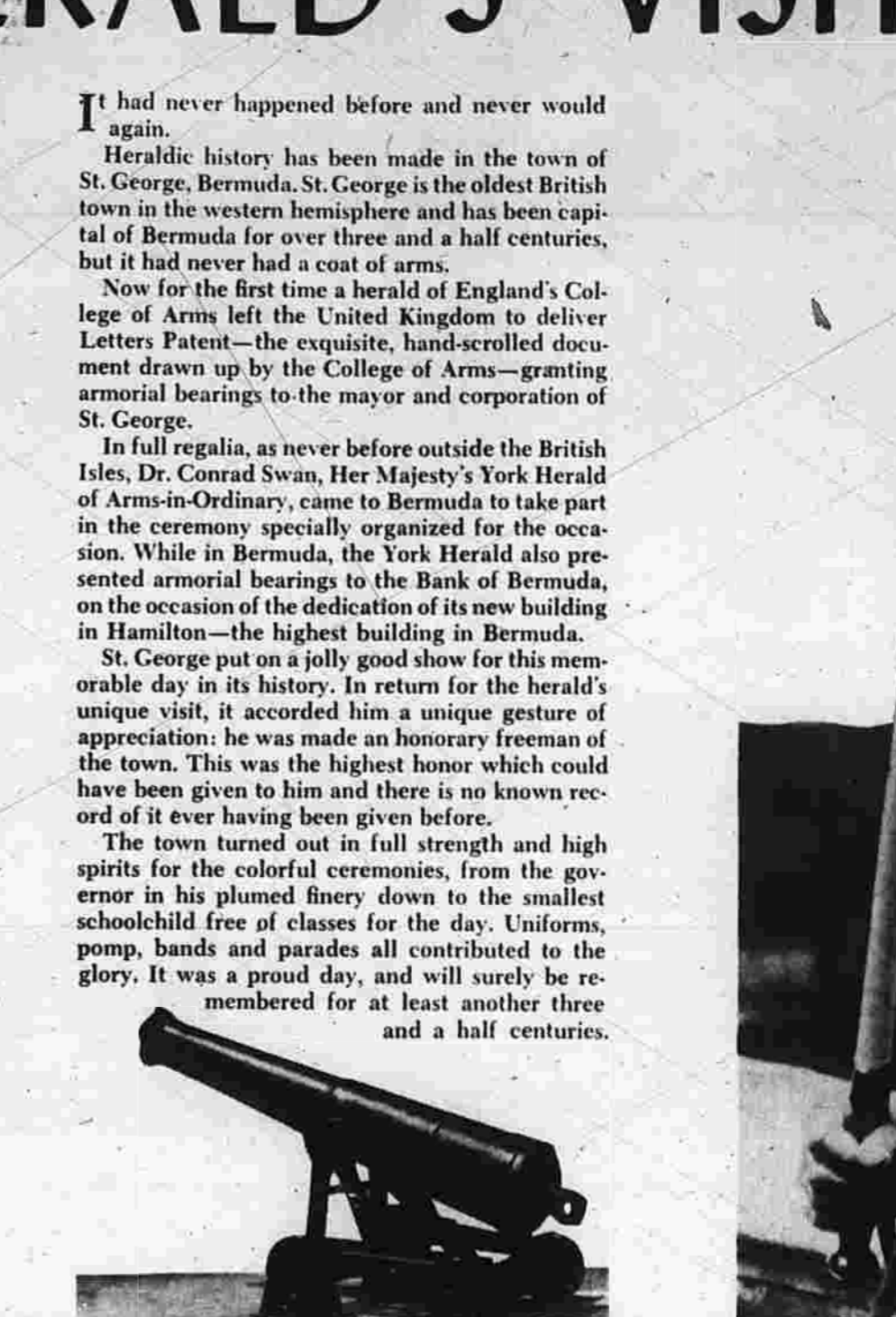

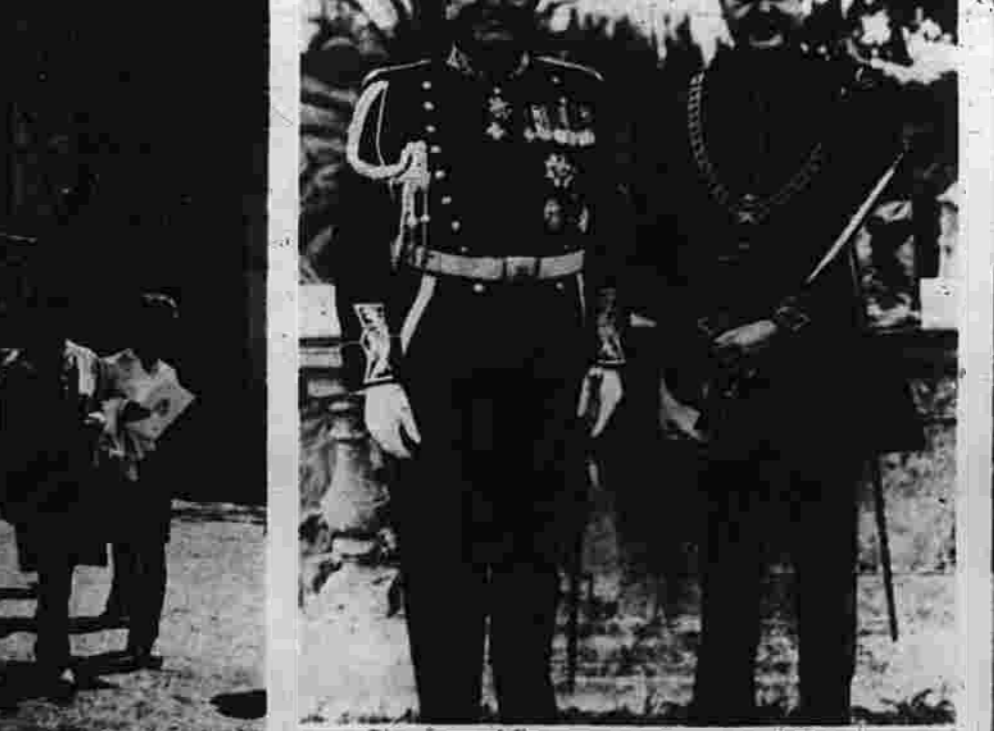

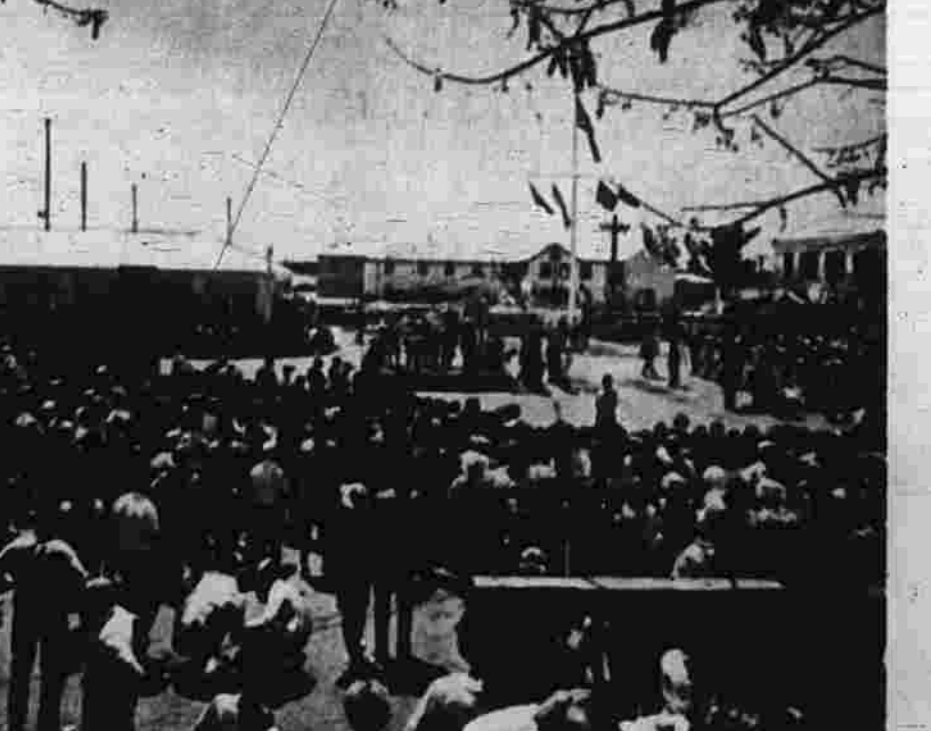

The Mission: Find Two Stars

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — At first blush, the Mission seemed indeed impossible: for a television series to carry on without two of its most important stars. But the show is going on with no apparent loss of vitality.

That is the word from Bruce Geller, the man who conceived and oversees "Mission: Impossible." The imaginative series has captured millions of viewers, several Emmies and critical acclaim, if not the loyalty of two of its original cast members, Martin Landau and Barbara Bain.

Both have cut out after three seasons, Miss Bain delivering her kiss-off in explicit terms at the Emmy awards in June. The reasons for the departures of the married pair are clouded in controversy, and her decision is being contested by lawyers for the producing company, Paramount.

"I can't say anything about it; I'm the guy who's caught in the middle," said the youthful, athletic-looking Geller in his studio office.

But he is every inventive—he also oversees "Mannix"—and is preparing three pilot films for CBS and has a three-picture contract with Cinema Center Films. Geller solved Landau's departure by enlisting Leonard Nimoy, formerly the pointed-eared Mr. Spock of "Star Trek."

"At this point we have no running lady in 'Mission,'" said Geller. "We have used guest stars like Sally Ann Howes, Lee Meriwether, and Alexandra Hay—with her clothes on (Miss Hay has done nude scenes in films). Some of them may repeat, but so far were planning no replacement for Barbara. Naturally we'd like her back. But that's in the hands of the lawyers."

"Fortunately 'Mission' is the kind of show that doesn't rely on any single star. You can't write this show for a character; the story itself is the star, and that story is tightly controlled. The dictates of the plot are

Entertainment Is in This Fall

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — A year ago, television producers, writers and stars were excited about messages and meaningful drama. During 1969-70, caution is the byword and the phrase used most often to describe the product is "pure entertainment."

The Establishment, walloped vigorously last season by TV's bright, earnest young producers and performers, is likely to be treated tenderly. The memory of the Smothers Brothers cancellation by CBS is still painfully-fresh in everybody's mind.

New faces, new situation comedies, new variety shows, cute children and winsome dogs will abound. Many shows will have a familiar look because there are only a dozen or so basic plots and not all of them work in ser-

ies. Commercial television, in a play-safe year, has a tendency to hire specialists with proven track records in old shows to turn out new ones.

Veteran viewers are likely to recall "Route 66" when they see NBC's "Then Came Bronson." The new series stars one man on a motorcycle, instead of two in a sport car, but both were shot on location and involved in a new adventure in a different community each week.

Debbie Reynolds' comedy style is not at all like that of Lucille Ball, but if the premise and execution of "The Debbie Reynolds Show" is occasionally reminiscent of "I Love Lucy," it could be the influence of producer-creator Jess Oppenheimer. He was prominent in the birth of the Ball-Arnaz series 18 years ago.

ABC's, CBS's and NBC's new medical shows will inevitably remind one of yesteryear's Kilgore and Casey. Cute children have often helped a run-of-the-mill situation comedy into the winners' circle, and in a year when the genre is back in favor, they are present in wholesale quantities. One series, ABC's "The Brady Bunch," has six.

While the approaching season does not appear to contain much experimentation with radical, daring material, some fresh forms around will be offered.

NBC's "My World—And Welcome to It" is based on cartoons, writing and personality of the late James Thurber. It will combine live actors and realistic sets with animation for a first in adult situation comedy.

ABC will partially free itself from the tyranny of the clock in its "Love, American Style." It will drop three or four complete
