Two dominant trends that have been developing over the last quarter of a entury - one dramatic and the other more subtle-have been highlighted in this morning's discussion. One involves the trend toward the ever rapidly increasing pace of scientific and technological advance; its dangers, and promises. The other is the trend toward new and different social value orientations; its concerns and implications. I would like to discuss both of these trends within the context of what has come to be called the process of Technology Assessment. I propose to indicate how both are importantly and intimately interrelated with one another, and how any form of Technology Assessment must be performed not in a vacuum. but in a context of social values. I'll begin by touching on these two

First, tehenological advance. I do not need to belabor this point too much. Professor Wald has already noted that there are always both real and potential abuses and uses of science And yet, it is clear that new technology can no longer exist in the uncontrolled state which marked its development. Technological development that has existed to a large extent exclusively within the realm of intellectual endeavor must be brought into the practical social

Indeed, as Russell Baker, the New York Times' only wit-in-residence, has commented rather dourly: History suggests that Twentieth Century man is unsurpassed at destroying things, but peculiarly inept what he builds on the ruins.

Technological advance has created its share of betes noires. It has also spawned a new generation of "anti-technological girts;" whore paranola is often equalled only by their nostalgia for the allegedly idyllic past, And yet, many of the arguments of these "bleeding-heart humanists," as Melvin Kranzberg calls them, are valid and cannot just be ignored or glossed over.

They include serious concern and rightfully so, that our technology and the inense social involvement-and also the interaction that they produce -create some radical changes in our relationships to our environment and to our ellow man. They say that we must thoroughly understand all the ramifications and implications of what we are doing. They remind us that we are part of ecological and social systems involving many delicate balances. They enjoin us to move cautiously, to broaden our thinking, and to temper the tendency we may have to seek quick technological "fixes" to many natural and human problems which are not so quickly or

almply solved. To this end, these critics of techrotogical advance point out our excesses and possible carelessness, and not just yearn for "the good old days." They serve a very important purpose in our

technological age. Thus, the question is not entirely What can se'ence and technology do?" but "What is it that we want?" And this brings into play the other more subtle trend. And that is second che

Thus, such questions as whether or not to construct a new jetport in the Everglades or to develop the mountainsides of Mineral King bring into focus values that in prior years either been overlooked or brushed

changes in value orientation are occurring. That's a needy task for our anthropologists and sociologists. I submit. however, that it is an outgrowth of many factors: the increasing complexities of society; the greater degree of interdependencies between various nations, groups, and individuals; the many positive and negative impacts of advanced technology itself upon society's physical environment and social fabric, and the awareness that the environment is global and intrically complicated from a sysof course, the affluence of

sustained economic growth over the past decade has also been a significant factor responsible for bringing about changes in values. Yet, a country that contains 6 percent of the world's population, but consumes nearly half of the world's resources now being processed for human use must certainly face up to the moral question: "Is this right?" One thing is clear; the present trends n value orientation toward the quality of life are unlikely to be reversed.



Upon adoption then, violations of the code could subject a lawyer to a variety of forms of discipline, including disbarment. The press-bar guidelines were in Part I (the one pertaining to lawyers) of the controversial Reardon Report. The report was approved by the ABA's policymaking House of Delegates in rebruary 1968, over the opposition of news media. It was reaffirmed by the House at the

arrest or charge. They: -Contemplate prompt release of information that a crime has been committed, facts of the crime, announcement that an nvestigation is under way and

-Advise lawyers and law enforcement officials not to identify suspects before arrest—ex-cept to aid in apprehension, warn the public or aid the inves-

-Suggest, also, that they refrain from making public the results of investigative examinations or tests—and from expressing opinions which may interfere with a fair trial. Then, what they say at the

time of arrest or charge; -Provide for the prompt re lease, by lawyers or law enforcement officials, of information about the identity of the accused, the facts of the arrest, evidence seized, the charge and the identity of the victim. iaus auso may announce investigative examinations or tests but not the re-

-It is improper for them to announce a "confession" or the accused person's refusal to make a statement or the accused person's prior criminal -It also is improper for them

to give personal opinions about the guilt of the accused or talk about the identity or credibility of prospective witnesses. Next, what they do during pretrial proceedings:

—Provide that a defendant may seek a closed pretrial hearing, but a complete record must be kept and made public after

Finally, during trials:

—They make it improper for prosecution or defense lawyers to make out-of-court statements about the trial, except to quote from court records. -Provide that use of comtempt power shall be limited to an extrajudicial statement which is "wilfully designed to affect the outcome of the trial"or which knowingly violates a court or-

The manual also summerizes what the ABA standards don't do. They included these points: First, prior to arrest or charge, they;

Do not restrict the investigative roles of news media, or their freedom to publish or broadcast information they develop through their own initia-

Do not impinge upon the freedom of news media to expose corruption or criticize courts or Do not bar access to public re-

cords. Then, at the time of arrest or charge, they: Do not inhibit normal reporting of crime news, but curb the official release of the results of tests or statements which may not be admissible at the trial. Do not prohibit an interview with the accused person, if he

requests or consents to it after bring informed of his rights to have an attorney and remain ai-Do not challenge the right of news media to publish prior criminal records of accused persons, but they do point out that such records may not be admissible at the trial and therefore
