





Many seek aid independently, others are referred by a wide circle of sources in the community doctors, lawyers, clergymen school social workers, and the police and welfare depart

Those who are helped will see a counsellor for a few months, a year, or longer. The agency sets a fee based upon family income, but no one is refused nelp because of inability to pay.
