Where The Pinch Is Cruel There are some 25,000,000 Americans now drawing social security payments. Half of these have no other source of

The benefit these people receive from these payments has been decreasing, in spite of increase in the actual number of dollars as recently as two years ago. What we mean is, of course, that the cost of living has risen faster than the

dollar amount of benefits. The soundest way to deal with this situation would be never to let the inflation occur in the first place. The most fanciful recommendation to make in such a situation would be to urge 'that somebody bestride the economic beach and bid the inflationary

waves to retreat. The only thing we really can do and therefore must do in such a situation is to increase the dollar amount of the benefits, in the hope that people forced to depend on them can buy as much living for themselves as in the past.

The Johnson Administration left office with a recommendation that social security benefits be increased by 10 per cent. The Nixon Administration, perhaps hoping that it could succeed in slowing inflation down, made an original decision to limit the increase in benefits to 7 per cent. Now President Nixon has announced that he will ask Congress to

go back to the 10 per cent raise. Apparently the Social Security trust fund is in good enough shape to permit fits without advancing the schedule of the next increase in Social Security taxation, which is now scheduled for 1971. It should be done, but neither the Administration nor Congress should then assume that one of the most heart-rending problems in American life has been solved. It is the problem of the continual and pitiless squeeze, in the living of our older people, between the fixed and usually small income and the ex-

pansion of all living costs. If we do not and cannot avoid inflation, we have a solemn obligation to see that these people, too, are aboard for the journey,

Canadian diplomats have been holding talks with representatives of Communist China in Stockholm, the topic being the possible establishment of liplomatic relations between the two countries. Italy is another United States ally currently considering such a step. The impression gained by the Canadians is that the Chinese are not in any feverish hurry to establish closer diplomatic ties with individual nations in the West, but that there has been some degree of shift in Communist China's attitude toward membership in the United






