There is, we suppose, no valid reason to try to hold President Nixon to higher standards, in his appointments, than those which have been followed by other politically minded Presidents.



Capital City Crime Rate Rises 9% Since Jan. 1 WASHINGTON (AP) -Crime overall during the first half of 1969, the smallest increase dur-ing a six-month period in two years, reports FBI Director gears, reports FEI Director J.

The nation's crime rate jumped 17 per cent during the corresponding period of 1968, due primarily to "an unusually large number of property crimes," Hoover said.

property crimes—larceny, auto theft and burgiary—during 1989 is partially offset by a 18 per cent increase in the more seri-ous violent crimes such as robous violent crimes such as rob-beries, rapes, assaults and mur-ders, he added.

In that category, Hoover said, robberies jumped 17 per cent over the first half of 1968, rapes were up 15 per cent, aggravated assaults increased 10 per cent and murders were up 8 per


